#### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MITIAMO PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1915*, the Trustees of the Mitiamo Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

# STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 751.—GENERAL RATE.—WERRIBEE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. A General Rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the rateable value of all lands within the Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any Urban Division thereof, is hereby made under the provisions of the *Water Acts*, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all such lands for the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling thereon, and for watering cattle or other stock.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1917, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1918, and shall be payable on the ninth day of November, 1917, at the office of the said Commission, at Werribee.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate, the value of the lands set out in the valuation made, in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1915*, by Frank Bassett, valuer, returned on the 27th day of October, 1917, and adopted by the said Commission on the 29th day of

October, 1917, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act 1915*, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds or under, municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth the before-mentioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and three-pence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1918. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1918.

By-law by the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

**T**HE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which all occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water for the said Trust for the year 1918:—

- (a) For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound seven shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.
- (c) For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds, and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
- (d) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Twenty-five pounds and upwards, an annual rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
- (e) For every vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District beforementioned, separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
- (f) A minimum rate of One pound five shillings sterling, and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for gardening and stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
- (g) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum, provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust district, a rate of Fifteen shillings per annum will be charged.
- (h) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes, the quantity used in excess, shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (i) For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for brick and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract, then upon the value, or on the amount charged or paid for brick work or plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intentions to do so.
- (j) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.
- (k) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe shall be Three pence per 100 gallons.

2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1918, and 1st day of July, 1918.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

## BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1918:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land, houses, and tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1918, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1918, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal valuation thereof.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons, by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of £1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- (k) The service-pipe for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

- (1) For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) inch diameter.

For the domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of £40 or over, a three-quarter of an inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

- (2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

- (l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.
- (m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.
- (2) The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

(3) The said rates and all charges for water supplied, otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1918, and on the 1st day of July, 1918.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the occupier or owner shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Four shillings per thousand gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

That a super tax of Two shillings and sixpence on every assessment shall be charged, and shall be collected at the same time as the before-mentioned charges.

That the above-named rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1918, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1918.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

For all water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District the charge shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust. Such minimum charge shall be computed at the charge of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of the properties so supplied, and for all water used in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound.

5. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1918, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1918.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

## KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918, No. 13.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 13.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate—

(1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid. Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement exceeds the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any

amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid:

(3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings each be charged.

(4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.

(5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1918, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1918.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

## CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 19.

**T**HE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authority conferred upon it by the Water Acts, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1918 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Three shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound fifteen shillings.

(b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Five shillings.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

(d) Occupied or unoccupied land where water is supplied from a stand-pipe shall be charged Sixpence for every 100 gallons.

(e) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(f) On buildings in course of erection when water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of such work or by special agreement, wooden houses shall be charged half rate, payment to be made before supply is given.

(g) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such a rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.

(h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1918.



(k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

The foregoing By-law No. 19 was made and adopted on the 10th day of October, 1917, and the seal of the Trust was hereto affixed in our presence—

#### SHIRE OF TALBOT.

#### TALBOT WATER SUPPLY RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1918.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1918 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the shire of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District, also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such District.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1918 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under the sum of One pound (£1).
2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value a rate of One shilling in the pound.
3. For every hotel a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the value of such property.

4. Government departments railways and other properties supplied by meter a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.

5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Council the following charges shall be made:—

Post Office Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 30,000 gallons per annum.

State School Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons or less.

7. For every water-trough connected with hotels Ten shillings (10s.) per annum, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory mill tenement where steam machinery is attached and working the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of each property or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 210,000 gallons per acre and 105,000 gallons per half acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 210,000 gallons per acre where supplied from open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For the water supplied to mining companies dredges &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1918, and the 1st day of July, 1918, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**W**HEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Boolarra-Foster road in the shire of Morwell (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fourteen on page ninety-two) should be made by the said Board. And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

"A." A road generally  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains wide: Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 63c, parish of Mirboo, county of Buln Buln, at a point distant by lines bearing north 74 deg. 37 min. west 346 links and south 77 deg. 37 min. west 348 links from its north-eastern angle; thence southerly and south-easterly through this allotment to the southern boundary of the said allotment at a point distant 302 links from its south-eastern angle; thence south-westerly and generally south-easterly through allotment 63b to a point on the southern boundary of this allotment distant 569 links from its south-eastern angle.

"B." A road generally  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains wide: Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 129a, parish of Mirboo, county of Buln Buln, distant 546 links from its north-eastern angle; thence south-westerly and south-easterly through the said allotment to a point on its eastern boundary distant by lines bearing south 2 deg. 42 min. east 94 links, south 15 deg. 7 min. east 295 links, and south 2 deg. 37 min. west 350 links from its north-eastern angle.

One thousand nine hundred and fourteen on page ninety-two) should be made by the said Board. And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared map, plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

"A." Commencing at the most westerly angle of allotment 129c, parish of Mirboo; thence north 17 deg. 5 min. east 17 links; thence south 30 deg. 34 min. east 641 links; thence south 13 deg. 18 min. east 87 links; thence south 7 deg. 29 min. east 124 links; thence south 9 deg. 22 min. west 262 links; thence south 2 deg. 10 min. east 209 links; thence south 26 deg. 1 min. east 269 links; thence north 88 deg. 30 min. west 303 links; thence north 32 deg. 49 min. west 78 links; thence north 6 deg. 20 min. east 853 links; thence north 20 deg. 36 min. west 567 links to the point of commencement.

"B." The land will be granted under selection purchase lease, and at the end of six years, if the residence, cultivation, improvement, and all other conditions have been complied with, the lease will be indorsed under the seal of the Board of Land and Works to the effect that such conditions have been complied with, and at any time within the remaining period of 14 or 34 years (as the case may be) a Crown Grant will be issued on payment of the full amount of the purchase money.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand.

The lease will contain (*inter alia*) conditions to the effect as follows:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the lease, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.

The total area of Mallee land which may be selected is 640 acres if in the first class, or 1,000 acres if in the second class, or 1,280 acres if in the third class. Any further area (limited as by the next succeeding paragraph) can be obtained only by purchase from other persons.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,600 acres, if the land be in any other class.

## Conditions.

1. 4.
