NOTICE TO MARINERS.—VICTORIA.

[No. 21 of 1917.]

ALTERATION TO HARBOR LIGHTS.—WARRNAMBOOL.

REFERRING to General Notice to Mariners, dated 1st August, 1917, page 52, mariners and others are hereby notified that on and after 1st December, 1917, the Harbor Lights at Warrnambool will be changed in character and visibility, as follows:—

Upper Light.—The Upper Light will be altered to a white flashing light with a flash of half-a-second duration every five seconds, visible from seaward between the bearings of N. 45 deg. W. and E. at a distance of 14 miles in clear weather.

Lower Light.—The Lower Light will be altered to a fixed red and white light, visible from seaward red between the bearings of N. 39 deg. E. and N. 1 deg. E., white between the bearings of N. 1 deg. E. and N. 38 deg. W., and red between the bearings of N. 38 deg. W. and N. 44 deg. W. at a distance of 5 miles in clear weather.

ALTERATION TO SOUTH CHANNEL PILE LIGHT.—PORT PHILLIP.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners, No. 7 of 1916, dated 20th March, 1916, mariners and others are hereby notified that on and after 1st December, 1917, the light at the South Channel Pile will be changed to an occulting light, with the following character:—

Light 4 seconds, followed by an eclipse of one-third of a second.

The bearings between which the light is visible will be (from seaward the light shows):—

White between the bearings of S. 22 deg. E. and N. 42 deg. E.

Red between the bearings of N. 42 deg. E. and N. 81½ deg. W.

White between the bearings of N. 81½ deg. W. and S. 84 deg. W.

Red between the bearings of S. 84 deg. W. and S. 76 deg. W.

Obscured between the bearings of S. 76 deg. W. and S. 22 deg. E.

The principal result of the above alteration in the sectors of the light is that the present white sector over No. 15 Buoy will be changed to red.

Vessels leaving for sea and bound through the South Channel after passing the flashing light on No. 15 Gas Buoy should steer on a S.S.W. course to get into the white sector shown from the Pile Light and keep within the same until nearing the occulting green light on No. 12 Gas Buoy.

SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS.

BY-LAW No. 10.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadmeadows made under Part 3 of the *Health Act* 1915 and numbered 10 for the purpose of amending By-law No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1915, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Broadmeadows, in the name of, and on behalf of, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said shire make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. That By-law No. 2 be amended so as to provide that such By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Broadmeadows as at present existing brought about by the union of the late Shire of Merriang.

The resolution passing By-law No. 10 was agreed to at a meeting of the Council held on 26th July, 1917, and confirmed on 30th August, 1917.

TENDERS will be received on or before Friday, 16th November, 1917, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined Special Conditions.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act 1915* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Conditions.

1. 3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. 10. A By-law of the Shire of Alexandra made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered eleven, for repealing certain sections of By-law number 6, and for regulating the market-place and the buildings and pens thereon.

2. Clauses 3 and 5 of By-law No. 6 of the Shire of Alexandra shall be and are hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the following clauses shall be substituted:—

The rents to be paid by any person or persons or auctioneering firms using the sale-yards for the purpose of selling cattle by auction shall be as follows:—

For any person or auctioneer holding a special sale, £2 10s. per day.

On market days each person or auctioneer shall pay £1 5s. per day.

3. That in the event of two or more persons or auctioneering firms offering cattle for sale by auction on any market days such persons or auctioneering firms shall draw lots for the order of precedence in selling. Sales shall commence punctually at half-past One o'clock p.m. on market days and the sales of cattle shall be conducted in the order following:—

- 1st (first) pigs.
- 2nd (second) sheep.
- 3rd (third) cattle.
- 4th (fourth) horses.

4. The person or auctioneer or firm of auctioneers having priority of sale shall commence selling not later than half-past One p.m. Such person, auctioneer, or auctioneering firm having priority shall be allowed five minutes at the beginning of his sale for the purpose of reading the conditions of the sale and except as hereinbefore provided the time allowed for such person, auctioneer or firm of auctioneers shall be as follows:—

Pigs.—Three minutes for each sale no matter what number of pigs are offered.

Sheep.—100 sheep or over in one pen four minutes for every lot offered. Under 100 sheep in one pen three minutes.

Cattle.—Pens of ten or over that number four minutes. Pens of under ten three minutes. Any additional lots in the same pens three minutes additional for each lot.

Horses.—Five minutes shall be allowed for the sale of each horse.

5. A market inspector who shall also be the time-keeper shall be appointed by the Council of the Shire

of Alexandra whose salary shall be paid by the said Council but each person, auctioneer or firm of auctioneers shall pay her or their proportion of the cost and salary of the inspector for each day. The duties of the said inspector shall be:—

(A) The inspector or his assistant shall on each day of sale ring a bell at One o'clock p.m. and the auction sales of cattle shall commence at half-past One o'clock p.m. in the order and subject to the conditions herein provided. All disputes affecting the time order or otherwise of conducting the sales in the market by the auctioneers shall be referred to the said inspector whose decision shall be final and conclusive.

(B) To see that the By-laws relating to the market and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* relating to markets are duly observed.

(C) To demand and collect all market fees.

(D) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the persons bringing cattle to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market yards before Five o'clock p.m. on the day of sale except with the consent of such inspector.

6. No person shall obstruct the said inspector in the performance of his duty or release or remove any cattle from one part of the said market to any other part of the said market without the consent of the said inspector nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates fences buildings or appurtenances of the said market.

7. Any person or auctioneer not present and not proceeding with his sale when his time arrives to commence selling shall besides being guilty of a breach of this By-law forfeit his right to sell and shall be placed at the foot of the list of auctioneers entitled to sell and shall forfeit and pay to the said Council a sum of Forty shillings. Any person or auctioneer upon being informed by the time-keeper that his proportionate time of selling has expired shall immediately cease to sell and the next auctioneer on the list shall occupy the position vacated. No person or auctioneer shall offer or cause to be offered any cattle a second time at the same market until all other sales are disposed of and completed. Any auctioneer or agent wilfully not proceeding with his sale as and at the time and times provided herein shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

8. Any auctioneer or person selling in any sale-yard within the municipality of the shire of Alexandra other than the Alexandra Corporation Sale-yards shall pay to the Council of the Shire of Alexandra a fee of Five shillings per annum.

SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

A Regulation of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, numbered One, made under section 48 of Part X. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the shire by virtue of a By-law of the above shire numbered Eleven for the better government of the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully make the following Regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district:—

1. For the licence for every hackney or stage carriage and the renewal thereof there shall be charged and be received by the Council for carriages having a seating capacity up to 6 persons Five shillings per annum, from 7 to 10 persons Ten shillings per annum, from 11 to 15 persons, Fifteen shillings per annum; over 15 persons, Twenty shillings per annum.

2. No person shall keep use employ or let for hire for the carriage of passengers any hackney or stage carriage or act as the driver or conductor thereof unless he shall have a licence granted and in force under the provisions of this Regulation so to do and no licence shall be granted to a hackney or stage carriage owner or driver

unless he shall satisfy the Council that he is a fit person to be intrusted with the same, and is of good fame and character and above the age of eighteen years.

3. There shall be paid the sum of One shilling to the Council for the owner's or driver's licence.

4. The following letters words and figures in white paint or other durable material on a dark ground shall be painted or placed in plain block letters and figures of not less than one and a half inches in height and of proportionate breadth on the front of each side of the carriage immediately below the driver's seat or by a plate affixed in such position or in such other manner or places as the Council or the shire secretary may direct and the same shall be kept conspicuous legible and undefaced during all the time such hackney or stage carriage shall ply or be used for hire and shall apply to and be painted or affixed upon no other carriage other than the one for which the licence to which it corresponds shall have been granted:—

FERN TREE GULLY SHIRE NO. TO CARRY PERSONS.

5. No licensed carriage shall ply for hire or carry passengers unless at the time such plying or such carriage in the case of a horse-drawn vehicle be drawn in the case of a carriage licensed to carry 5 or any less number of persons by one horse, if licensed to carry more than 6 and not more than 10 persons two horses.

6. The driver of every licensed carriage shall be in constant attendance upon the same when plying or standing in public streets or otherwise or engaged for hire and no driver shall when standing or plying for hire be at any such distance from his carriage so as to prevent his having full control over the same nor loiter nor remain upon any footway or roadway at any such stand but shall when not actually employed in or about his carriage or in looking after his vehicle remain upon the driving seat or box of such carriage or within twenty feet of such vehicle.

7. At railway stations no driver shall depart from his vehicle further than 20 feet within ten minutes prior to and after the arrival of each train.

8. No hackney carriage shall be licensed to carry at any one time a greater number of passengers than the same will contain at one time upon fit and proper seats provided therein for that purpose allowing for each passenger an average on each and every seat convenient for sitting upon of not less than 16 inches and such seats will be 12 inches apart, unless such seats face each other when they shall be 20 inches apart provided that no child sitting in the lap under five years of age shall be deemed to be a passenger within the meaning of these Regulations.

9. A table of fares and distances will be supplied by the Council printed on cardboard. Such list suitably framed and glazed and kept clean and legible must be displayed in a prominent position within the vehicle and the driver shall also himself keep a table of fares and shall produce the same at once to any passenger or other person applying to him for an inspection thereof.

10. The fares to be charged by stage carriages shall be as follows:—From Upper Fern Tree Gully to Dunstan's, 1s. 6d. From Upper Fern Tree Gully to Ferny Creek, 2s. From Upper Fern Tree Gully to Sassafras, 2s. 6d. From Upper Fern Tree Gully to Sherbrooke, 3s. From Upper Fern Tree Gully to Olinda, 3s. From Olinda to Upper Fern Tree Gully, 2s. 6d. From Sassafras to Upper Fern Tree Gully, 2s. 6d. From Sherbrooke to Upper Fern Tree Gully, 2s. 6d. From Ferny Creek to Upper Fern Tree Gully, 1s. 6d. From Dunstan's to Upper Fern Tree Gully, 1s. Between Upper Fern Tree Gully and Upwey, either way, 6d. Between Upper Fern Tree Gully and Belgrave, either way, 1s. Between Upper Fern Tree Gully and South Sassafras, either way, 1s. 6d. Between Upper Fern Tree Gully and Monbulk, either way, 2s. 6d. Between Belgrave and South Sassafras, either way, 9d. Between Belgrave and Monbulk, either way, 1s. 9d. Between South Sassafras and Monbulk, 1s. Between Belgrave and The Patch, 1s. 6d. Between Bayswater and Sassafras, either way, 3s. Between Bayswater and Olinda, either way, 4s. 6d. Between Emerald and Avonsleigh, either way, 1s. Between Emerald and Macclesfield, either way, 2s.

The use of tickets for single or return journeys, or the granting of concessions for return fares, is hereby prohibited.

11. The places of standing for stage carriages shall be as follows:—

Upper Fern Tree Gully Railway Station yard. On the Main Olinda-road, at Dunstan's corner, opposite approach road to Ferny Creek Post Office; at Breen's corner, near junction with Sherbrooke-road; at Crescent-road junction; at Sassafras Mechanics' Institute; at Olinda Post Office. On the main Fern Tree Gully to Belgrave-road, at Upwey Railway Station; in Belgrave township, between railway station entrance and the Temperance Hall. On Belgrave-Monbulk road, at Gilmour's corner at junction with Sherbrooke-road; at South Sassafras Post Office; at junction of Boundary-road, near Nethania Springs; at Monbulk Post Office.

At Bayswater Railway Station yard. At Emerald Railway Station yard. At Avonsleigh corner. At Macclesfield Post Office.

12. Hackney and stage carriages shall take their stations on the standing in the order of their arrival and when any such carriage is driven off any such stand the driver of the carriage immediately behind shall cause his carriage to move forward to the place vacated by the carriage so driven on and the drivers of the other carriages behind shall cause them to move forward each up to the place vacated by that immediately before it and every driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

13. A licensed stage carriage shall leave the place of standing immediately such carriage is filled with passengers to its licensed capacity and no driver, owner, or any person on behalf of the driver or owner shall book seats or by any means engage or propose to carry any person remaining at or adjacent to such standing as a passenger on a later journey therefrom by the same or another stage carriage unless there are no seats available in any other licensed stage carriage plying for hire simultaneously at such place of standing.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
