BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1918. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1918, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on the first January, first April, first July, and first October of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. That is to say:—

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

5. On every steam engine (not including any steam engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

6. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Five shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch in diameter.

8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering shall be made; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do.

Cases where Water is not Laid On.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings.

10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Five shillings.

11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to market and other gardens and nurseries over one-quarter of an acre in area shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be (20,000) Twenty thousand gallons. The service-pipe for the supply of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

13. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust, who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same. The fee for such permit shall be £1 10s. for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) or part of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre to be irrigated. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains more than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an acre of any land unless a meter be attached to the service-pipe supplying such land. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deem the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

15. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each (100) One hundred gallons.

17. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

19. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1918, the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement," as used herein, shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

(5) For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

(6) Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

(7) The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and the first of July, 1918.

(8) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

A By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust; that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Eighteen pounds (£18).

2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Eighteen pounds (£18).

3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged at a rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1918, and at a rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on the streets in which the pipes of the water supply are laid, and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipes and being within a quarter (¼) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such lands or tenements are over a quarter of a mile (¼) and within half (½) a mile thereof, a quarter of the before-mentioned rates.

Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1918, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1918, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1918, and shall be due and payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1918.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

1. For every house and tenement of up to Twelve (12) pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Twelve (12) pounds and over, annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision or wastes or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made; but on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).

9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horsepower shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extensions, the Trust shall have power to make special arrangement with them regarding the payment for water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, and the first day of July, 1918, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance or as may be agreed upon.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF EDENHOPE.

WE, William Francis Cranage, Thomas Knapp, Edward Felix Forster, Donald MacLean Caldwell, William Kirkby Robinson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Town of Edenhope, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress language or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for the agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, nor take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand building erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand building erection or enclosure and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand building erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. The charge for hire of the said ground for such functions as picnics, sports, carnivals, fêtes, and events of similar nature shall be Ten per centum of the total gate receipts; but in the case of the engaging body having membership tickets giving the right to admission to

the ground on the day when a function is being held, such body shall, in addition to the levy of Ten per centum of the total gate receipts, pay to the Committee of Management Ten per centum of their total membership receipts.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 75, for repealing By-law No. 62 of the said city, and for preserving public decency.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 62 of the said city made for repealing By-law No. 38 and for preserving public decency, is hereby repealed.

2. The provisions of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Hawthorn.

3. No person shall bathe in the River Yarra or Gardiner's Creek within the boundaries of the municipal district of Hawthorn unless such person be properly attired from neck to knee in such bathing costume as shall preserve public decency. Any employee of the council or any police constable or any person authorized by the council in writing under the seal of the council, may require any person contravening this provision to at once resume his ordinary clothes.

4. (a) No person shall offend against public decency before, whilst, or after bathing, drying, dressing, or undressing.

(b) No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

(c) Every person about to bathe shall proceed from the dressing place direct to the water by the nearest practicable line, and on leaving the water shall return to the dressing place in the same manner.

(d) Except as aforesaid, or when rendering aid in case of accident, no person in bathing costume shall walk, run, exercise, stand, loiter, lie down, or sit down upon any part of the banks or strand of the River Yarra or Gardiner's Creek, or in any place whatever which is exposed to the public view.

5. (a) A dressing enclosure or shed shall be used for dressing and undressing only, and no person shall play any game or loiter therein.

(b) No person shall bring or deposit any filth, papers, rags, glass, debris of any sort, or rubbish in any such enclosure or shed.

(c) No person shall damage, disfigure, or write in or upon any such enclosure or shed.

6. In or upon any part of the water banks or strand of the River Yarra or Gardiner's Creek or any dressing enclosure or shed, no person shall:—

(a) Behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public.

(b) Blaspheme or use any profane or obscene language or behave in an indecent manner.

7. (a) The council may in writing under its seal authorize any person to carry out the provisions of this By-law and to prosecute on behalf of the council, any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of this By-law.

(b) Any person committing any breach of this By-law who refuses to state his name and place of abode to any officer or employee of the council or any person authorized in writing under the seal of the council, or who in the opinion of such employee or any person authorized by the council in writing under its seal, states a false name or place of abode shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law.
