No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Ten per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1917.
Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

H IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Mines Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2698), doth hereby rescind the Regulations approved on the 26th day of January, 1916, re Granting Certificates to Mining Engine-drivers, and in lieu thereof make the following Regulations, that is to say:

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS,

#### Preliminary Requirements.

1. Each applicant for a certificate of competency must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Mining Department, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less tam fourteen (14) clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, or postal notes to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

#### Certificates of Competency.

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of three classes, namely:—first, second, and third.

A first class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 5 (b).

A second class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, except a winding engine, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 4 (b).

A third class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine, the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 3 (b).

- 3. An applicant for a third class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—
  - (a) of his respectability of character;
  - (b) that he has, for not less than twelve months, been assisting to drive engines used for mining purposes for not less than twelve (12) hours per week.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- age of fifty years;

  (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

- 4. An applicant for a second class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—
  - (a) of his respectability of character;
  - (b) that he has been the holder of a third class certificate under these Regulations, or a second class certificate under the Factories and Shopy Act 1915 for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and that he has had at least six (6) months' experience during that period in driving a third class mining engine or engines, such driving experience to have been for not less than twelve (12) hours per week; or that he has assisted to drive a steam-engine the cylinder of which is more than twelve (12) inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder steam-engine the cylinders of which have a combined area equal to that of a single cylinder of more than twelve (12) inches in diameter for a period of twelve (12) months, and for at least twelve hours per week: The examination to be equivalent to that undergone by a candidate for a first class factory certificate.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen (19) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is de fective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.
- 5. An applicant for a first class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—
  - (a) of his respectability of character;
  - (b) that he has been the holder of a second class certificate under these Regulations, a first class certificate of competency or service issued under the Factories and Shops Act 1915, an ordinary mining engine-driver's certificate issued in New South Wales, or a second class mining engine-driver's certificate issued in New South Wales, or a second class mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in assisting to drive both loose eccentric and link-motion winding engines, such experience to be for not less than twelve (12) hours per week.

Where only one class of the above engines or any other class of winding gear has been driven, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of twenty-one (21) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. (This latter age does not apply to persons who had experience in driving winding engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

Examinations. - .

6. Examinations will be conducted by the Board strsuch 6. Examinations will be conducted by the Board active in time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the Government Gazette, and the newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of examination.

- 7. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam and other engines, boilers, furnaces, winding and pumping gear, or any other machinery used for mining purposes.
- B. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three munits shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.
- 9. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the Mines Act 1915 shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine or any engine under the Factories and Shops Act 1915.
- 10. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the Factorisk and Shops Act 1915 shall be entitled to drive any enginesat a mine except a winding engine.
- 11. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the Mines Acti 1015 shall be entitled to drive any engine under the Factories and Shops Act 1915.
- 12. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the Factories and Shops Act 1915 shall be entitled to drive any engine; used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter.
- 13. The holder of a third class certificate under the Mines Act 1915 shall be entitled to drive any second class engine under the Factories and Shops Act 1915.

#### Copies of Certificates.

- 14. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the Mines Act 1915, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the Schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.
- 15. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last
- 16. Every holder of a second or third class certificate under these Regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a higher class, and, in the event of the latter certificate being granted, the former shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.
- 17. Any person holding a mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, or in New Zealand, and who takes up his residence in Victoria, may be granted a registration slip of equal grade to his certificate, upon payment of the fee prescribed by the following Schedule, and without undergoing any examination. This registration slip shall entitle the holder to drive the same class or classes of engine that he had been qualified to take charge of under his certificate in the issuing State, or in New Zealand, and these particulars will be shown on the face of the registration slip. He will also be subject to the provisions of section 434 of the Mines Act 1915, and section 35 of the Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915.
- 18. Every candidate for a certificate of competency shall, upon presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct invery particular; such declaration, together with testimonials produced, to be retained by the Board.

(c) Regulating the size of dwelling rooms and dwelling-houses.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin, for and in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin orders as follows:—

No person shall erect, build construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling-house only except in conformity with the following—

1. The site of curtilage of such dwelling-house shall have a superficial area of at least 5,000 feet and have a

frontage of not less than 50 lineal feet to a street or road and except in the cases of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site.

2. The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built or constructed upon any site or curtilage included in any subdivision of land made with the approval of the Council prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and not provided for in clause 1, shall except in the cases of corner sites cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site or curtilage fronting a street or road.

3. The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built or constructed upon any corner site or curtilage fronting to two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

4. The minimum depth of land upon which any dwell-

The minimum depth of land upon which any dwelling-house may be erected shall be 100 feet.

5. No dwelling room shall have a less area than 100

square feet.

square feet.
6. No dwelling house shall be erected in the West
Riding or South Riding or the township of Mordialloc
unless same shall consist of at least three rooms, each
room having an area of 100 square feet and unless the
architecture thereof be acceptable.
7. This By-law shall apply to all buildings erected or
to be erected after the date of the making of this By-

law.

8. Any matter or thing arising under this By-law may be from time to time determined applied dispensed with or regulated by the Council by resolution or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular

A By-law of the Shire of Rutherglen made under sections 197 and 594 of the Local Government Act 1915 and numbered 1, 1917, for Prohibiting or Regulating the use on any road of Traction Engines or other Vehicles having on its wheels bars, spikes, grips or other projections and for regulating the hours and conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any street or road.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915 the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rutherglen order as

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips or other projections.

This prohibition however, shall not apply to-

This prohibition however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving-wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width, nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between

such cross bars not exceeding three inches provided in such last mentioned case—

(1) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit, in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
(2) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.
(3) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
(4) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight including the weight of such vehicle.
(5) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the

(5) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not ex-ceed three hundred-weight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

WOODEN PLANKS TO BE CARRIED ON ENGINE. ETC.

2. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same at least four wooden planks 12 inches in width, 4 inches in thickness, and at least 12 feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks. planks.

HOURS FOR TRAVELLING.

3. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine at night (herein defined as between sunset and sunrise) unless by written permission of the Council defining the conditions to be observed, the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time on two days' written notice given by the Shire Secretary to that effect and forwarded to the owner's or driver's address by registered letter.

# RATE OF TRAVEL, ETC.

RATE OF TRAVEL, ETC.

4. The driver of every traction engine when travelling his engime on any public road shall not drive such engine at a greater speed than four miles per hour and shall (if proceeding at more than two and a half miles per hour) reduce his speed to that limit while passing any vehicle and shall when requested verbally or by upraised arms as a signal by any person driving a horse or horses in any conveyance stop until such conveyance has passed such engine.

5. The driver of any traction engine shall not stop such engine on any road (unless through unforeseen circumstances or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, and such like but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road or the middle of the surveved road if unmade.

6. By-law No. 2, 1905, is hereby repealed.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

# Rules LES OF THE DAYLESFORD DISTR HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM

1. That the object of the institution shall be to afford nedical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of creed, country, or colour, and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with a casualty and shall be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive other than temporary assistance.

That the object of the Benevolent Asylum shall be to relieve the aged, infirm, disabled, and destitute, and to minister to their necessities, according to the ability of the institute.

That a portion of the building be set apart for the purposes of the Hospital, and the remainder for the purposes of the Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the committee.

- 2. That in the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such per-son shall be held accountable for all expenses incurred on his or her behalf.
- 3. That the committee of the institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer, and not less than seven, nor more than ten committeemen.
- 4. That the above officers be elected by the governors annual subscribers, as provided by the Act cexx., and Rules 7, 8, 9.

#### PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS.

That each annual contributor of £1 1s. and upwards 5. nat each annual contributor of £1 is, and upwards shall have the privilege of recommending one in-patient and four out-patients (or should he prefer it, six out-patients instead), for each £1 is, subscribed, for a period of 12 months from the date of such contribution.

That every benetactor of £20 or upwards in any one year shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to the same privileges as an annual contributor of £2 2s.

- same privileges as an annual contributor of £2 2s.

  6. Benefactors, and every executor (first named) under any will paying to the institution a bequest of £20 or upwards, shall be entitled to be enrolled on the list of life governors. The word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by church or other collections, or contributed by entertainments, mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and for every £100 contributed by fêtes or sports committees. The nomination of benefactors as life governors to be made by the minister or governing body of churches, the collector or collectors, the committee of the said fêtes, sports or entertainments, or by the giver or givers there collector or collectors, the committee of the said fêtes, sports or entertainments, or by the giver or givers thereof, the directors of mining or other companies, societies, or associations. The word "contribution" shall
  mean a personal gift. Life governors shall have the
  same privileges in respect of recommending patients as
  annual subscribers of £2 2s. and be eligible for election
  as members of committee or any honorary office. Every
  benefactor of £10 10s. in any one year, shall be a life
  subscriber, and be entitled to the same privileges as the
  annual contributor of £1 1s. annual contributor of £1 1s.
- 7. That every annual subscriber of £1 ls. or upwards, life, honorary and annual governors, and life subscribers shall be entitled to one vote each at all meetings of governors and subscribers.
- 8. That the annual subscription must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid.
- 9. No person shall hold or be eligible for any honorary office (except that of honorary medical officer), nor have a vote, nor exercise any privilege connected with the institution, unless his or her subscription shall have been paid on or before the 30th June in each year.
- paid on or before the 30th June in each year.

  10. At the annual meeting of contributors in July, all honorary officers, such as president, vice-presidents, treasurer, medical officers, surgeon dentists, solicitors, auditors, and referees, shall be chosen, and all matters pertaining to the institution shall be open to discussion; and resolutions may be passed approving or disapproving of all or any of the things done during the year just terminated, recommending any future procedure which may appear desirable, and deciding absolutely on any business broughs before it which may, consistently with the Act of Incorporation and the By-laws, be transacted at it.
- at it.

  11. It shall be competent for the general committee by vote, or any twenty or more contributors by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a general meeting of contributors at any time, or times, between the annual meetings; the occasion of calling every meeting shall be specified in the requisition, and no other business shall be transacted thereat, and every such meeting shall, with an intelligible reference to its object, be called by the secretary, by advertisement in one or more of the public newspapers of the State (local if possible) at least one week before the day of meeting.

12. At all general meetings of contributors, ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the time named the meeting shall stand adjourned till the following week, at the same day and hour, and so on from week to week until a

norum be formed.

13. All votes at the annual and other meetings of conquorum be formed.

13. All votes at the annual and other meetings of contributors shall be taken by a show of hands, unless four or more contributors (except in the case of contested elections or appointments) present at the meeting shall request the chairman to take a vote by ballot, which request may be made either before or after the show of hands has been taken, such ballot to decide the vote. All candidates for election to the offices of president, vice-presidents, treasurer, member of general committee, medical officers, surgeon dentists, auditors and referees, shall be nominated in writing by two contributors; such nomination, together with the nominee's written consent to act if elected, shall be lodged at the office of the secretary not less than seven clear days before the date of the annual meeting of contributors. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the foregoing condition, and fill up any vacancy which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot. Voting by post shall be allowed, in accordance with the provisions of the Voting by Post Act 1900, and with Regulations made from time to time by the general committee.

14. If the validity of any election at the annual meeting of the general committee for filling

made from time to time by the general committee.

14. If the validity of any election at the annual meeting or at any meeting of the general committee for filling up any vacancy during the year shall be disputed, the question in dispute shall be referred to five referees, to be chosen at the annual meeting of whom three shall form a quorum, whose decision shall be final. The office of any of the referees may be declared by the general committee vacant on his neglecting to attend four meetings in succession, to which he shall be summoned by three days' previous notice, or in any of the ways, except absence, in which the office of any ordinary member of committee may become vacant under the 12th section of the Act of Incorporation.

# Admission and Discharge of Patients.

15. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket. The medical fitness of the applicant shall be determined by the surgeon. Provided that there are vacant beds, and the funds of the institution admit of the reception of such patients, the applicant will be admitted.

16. All patients shall be required to pay the actual

applicant will be admitted.

16. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expense of their maintenance as far as circumstances may enable them. All property found on deceased patients shall be appropriated to the defraying of the expense of their maintenance and burial, and the residue (if any) be handed to their legal representatives. Any application for admission to the Benevolent Asylum must be accompanied by a recommendation in the usual form signed by three (8) subscribers. Two of the medical staff shall report whether the case is curable or not, and it shall then rest with the committee (who shall be specially called together for the purpose) to devise whether the application be entertained or not.

17. That accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the resident surgeon, shall be received at any time; but the admission of patients in ordinary cases on the recommendation of a governor or subscriber shall be restricted to Twelve noon each day. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no insane person, no person affected with syphilis or any infectious or contagious disease (other than typhoid fever, diphtheria, diphtheretic croup), scarlet fever, scarletina, measles and whooping cough or suffering from chronic paralysis, or any person who, in the opinion of the resident surgeon or committee, is unsuitable to be admitted shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances, and the cause of any patient so refused admittance shall be stated to the next meeting of the committee of management by the resident surgeon. The admission of Benevolent Asylum cases be regulated by Rule 15.

18. In the absence of satisfactory reasons to the contrary being offered to the general committee, no person shall be allowed to remain in the Hospital who, in the opinion of the medical staff, may receive equal benefit as an out-patient. Every person obtaining the benefits of the institution under a plea expressed or implied of destitution, who shall in the estimation of the general committee upon a representation being made to them of the fact, be able to pay for such benefits, shall be liable for the same, after the rate of £2 per week; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Hospital, and able in the estimation of the general committee to pay after the same rate. The general committee shall have power to reduce or increase this amount as they may deem advisable in special cases.

19. The hours of attendance for out-patients shall be

from 12 o'clock noon to 1 p.m. daily.

20. Previous to the departure of patients who may leave the Hospital at their own desire they shall be requested to sign a declaration to that effect.

21. All recommendations must be in accordance with the form authorized.

# COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

22. The committee of management shall consist of the

22. The committee of management shall consist of the president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and not less than seven or more than ten other elected members.

23. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution; shall frame By-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules; and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution. They shall meet on the second Saturday in every month at 2.30 p.m., or on such other days and time as they may appoint. They shall have the power to admit and discharge patients, and to make regulations respecting them. The chairman of committees to have a deliberate vote and also a casting vote.

24. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution at the annual meeting of subscribers and governors in July

annual meeting of subscribers and governors in July

each year.

25. No member of the committee of management nor officer of the Hospital shall become security for any confider of the Hospital shall become security for any contracting with the institution. tractor, directly or indirectly contracting with the insti-

26. Any member of the committee of management failing to attend four consecutive meetings, without leave from the committee, shall cease to be a member, and another shall be appointed in his stead, as provided for by the Act.

another shall be appointed in his stead, as provided for by the Act.

27. A visiting committee, consisting of five members, three of whom shall form a quorum, shall be elected for 12 months by, from and subject to the committee. It shall be their duty to visit tree institution at least once a month, to examine the buildings, inspect the wards, make inquiries as to the quality and quantity of the rations, enforce the rules, and attend to all other things connected with the management of the institution requiring attention, and shall bring up a report for the consideration of the committee. They shall have power to make such purchases for the institution (to the extent of Five pounds) as may be urgently required. The office of any member of the visiting committee shall become vacant by his neglecting to attend to his duties for two months in succession. The election of this sub-committee shall take place at the first meeting of the committee after the annual meeting. Vacancies shall be filled by the committee,

28. A finance committee, consisting of two members and the president and treasurer, shall be elected annually, by, from and subject to the committee. They shall examine all accounts prior to the monthly meetings of the committee, and certify to those found correct; two members shall form a quorum. In the event of the finance committee not having passed the accounts prior to the meeting the committee shall have the power to appoint two of their number to examine the accounts, and upon their report the said accounts shall be dealt with by the committee.

29. The committee of management shall have the power to appoint any sub-committee from time to time as they may desire, and the president shall be ex-officio member of all committees.

# MEETINGS, ETC., OF SUB-COMMITTEES.

30. Any vacancies in the visiting committee to be filled by the general committee at the meeting following such vacancy.

vacancy.

31. IThe visiting committee and finance committee shall meet monthly on such days and hours as they may from time to time appoint, and shall keep minutes and records of their proceedings.

32. The visiting committee shall keep a book in which shall be entered all complaints, directions or suggestions regarding the working or management of the institution made by the members of the committee, and such book shall be open for the inspection of the resident surgeon and matron, and shall be laid before the general committee at each monthly meeting thereof.

# RESIDENT SURGEON

33. The resident surgeon shall be a legally qualified practitioner, and shall live in the residence connected with the Hospital. He shall visit all patients in the institution twice daily, morning and evening, and in cases of emergency or special cases as often as may be necessary. He shall have the right of private practice, but shall arrange with one of the honorary surgeons to attend any cases of emergency which may arise during his absence.

34. He shall have charge of and be accountable for the medicines and surgical instruments in the Hospital, and shall make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which shall regularly be entered the receipt, cost, issue, or breakage of each article, and he shall on the last day of each month prepare and submit to the committee of management a list of medicines and surgical instruments required during the ensuing month.

cines and surgical instruments required during the ensuing month.

35. He shall take charge of all patients and of their treatment, but in cases of difficulty or danger shall requires the attendance of any or all of the honorary

35. He shall take charge of all patients and of their treatment, but in cases of difficulty or danger shall request the attendance of any or all of the honorary medical officers.

36. He shall make a special report to the general committee every month of the number of persons who have been received, dismissed, and have died since last report, together with the number of all under treatment, and a statement of those who have been two months in the Hospital, and also of those considered incurable whatever may have been the length of their connexion as patients with the institution.

37. He shall have the general superintendence of the entire establishment, and shall preserve order and sobriety in it, and in case of any insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any matron, nurse or ordinary servant, he shall, with the concurrence of the visiting committee, suspend or discharge him or her, and if necessary hire provisionally a substitute for such servant so suspended or discharged, and he shall give to the visiting committee all information and assistance they may require for the fulfilment of their trust.

38. He shall enter regularly in proper books to be kept for the purpose the names of the patients as they are admitted and discharged, and note the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment; loss or breakage of surgical instruments or other things in his charge; and he shall have such books ready at all times for the inspection of the visiting committee, and shall attend the monthly meeting of the visiting committee if required, and shall lay before them all recommendations for patients received since their last meeting. He shall visit each patient every morning and evening, or oftener if necessary, and inquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to: and shall on his visits to the wards examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature and ventilation, and he shall cause to be affixed to the bed of each patient a card stating his or her name, age, and disea

40. He shall not grant leave of absence to any of the subordinates of the institution for a period exceeding three days without the consent of the visiting com-

# HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS

41. The honorary medical officers must be legally quali-

41. The honorary medical officers must be legally qualified medical practitioners.

42. They shall be elected by the governors and subscribers at each annual meeting, but shall be subject to removal by the committee of management for malpractice, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

43. Any vacancy in the number of honorary officers may be filled by the general committee until the next annual meeting.

44. The honorary medical officers shall attend the Hospital when required by the resident surgeon.

45. The honorary medical officers and the resident the institution at all times.

- the institution at all times.

  46. The honorary medical officers and the resident surgeon shall perform the surgical operations in such order as may be agreed upon by themselves; postmortem examinations shall be conducted by the resident surgeon, who shall keep the keys of the morgue and give notice to the honorary medical officers when an operation is to be performed; but in all cases of emergency he shall act to the best of his judgment. A consultation of the medical staff shall take place in all cases of capital surgical operations, but if any honorary medical officer shall not attend within a reasonable time after being duly summoned, or if, in the opinion of the resident surgeon, the safety of the patient may be endangered by delay, the latter may forthwith perform the duty.
- 47. The honorary medical officers shall make a report of each of their visits to the institution in a book to be provided for the purpose.
- 48. No one shall be present at the time of any opera-tion or post-mortem examination except such person as may be connected with the institution, or members of the medical profession.

# TREASURER.

49. All moneys received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and appropriated by him to the purposes of the institution under the direction of the committee.

50. Previously to making any payment the treasurer shall require a warrant of the committee of management authorizing such payment, which shall be signed by the president or one of the vice-presidents, and two other members of the committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

51. The secretary shall attend all special, general, and committee meetings; he shall take minutes of the proceedings, and transcribe them carefull; into books kept for that purpose; and he shall carry out the directions of such meetings in the particulars incident to his department. ment.

ment.

52. He shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to the institution, and given by the patients, and in all cases give receipts for such moneys on consecutively numbered printed receipt forms, to be supplied to him by the committee, and shall fill up the butt of each block to correspond with the receipt issued, and pay over all moneys received to the treasurer at least once in each week, and render him an account of the amounts collected or received since last payment, and he shall also submit his books and accounts to the finance committee at each meeting. meeting.

53. He shall keep an inventory of the property of the institution, and of the things in use (other than surgical instruments) and report from time to time any requirements or deficiencies; the resident surgeon and matron shall furnish any information necessary.

54. He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical duties connected with the office of treasurer.

55. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a proper safe at the Hospital. If he common seal shall not be fixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the general committee, at a meeting of which four members shall be present.

# THE MATRON.

56. The matron shall live in the house, and, subject to the general control of the resident surgeon, shall be mistress of the household. She shall not be absent from the Hospital without the consent of the resident surgeon, and she shall acquaint him of her departure and return.

57. She shall have control of the servants under the direction of the recident surgeon, and shall conduct the

direction of the resident surgeon, and shall conduct the household affairs in accordance with such regulations or directions as shall be issued or given by the committee

household affairs in accordance with such regulations or directions as shall be issued or given by the committee of management or visiting committee; and in the event of any sudden vacancy between the monthly meetings she shall temporarily provide for the performance of the duties thus unprovided for.

58. She shall, under the direction of the resident surgeon, take care that the nurses cause the patients to be placed in convenient beds within the wards assigned for their reception. She shall, in course of the day of admission, see that they are properly accommodated.

59. She shall see that the clothes of all patients as they are admitted are cleansed and put carefully away, and shall enter in a book a list of all such clothes as they are received, and obtain the receipt of each patient for the same when leaving. She shall not, except in her presence, permit any of the patients' clothes to be removed from the store.

60. She shall daily see that the beds, linen and clothes of the patients are clean and in good order, and shall cause such as may require it to be replaced by others, and shall not allow any unnecessary accumulation of soiled clothing.

61. On the discharge or death of a patient she shall see that the whole of the bedding be replaced with clean articles; and in the case of the death of a patient she shall be responsible for the orderly disposal of the body till the death be reported to the resident surgeon and the body be removed.

62. She shall visit all the wards dealy before 9 a.m.,

till the death be reported to the resident surgeon and the body be removed.

82. She shall visit all the wards deily before 9 n.m., and after 8 p.m., and at uncertain times besides, and she shall also on each day visit the other apartments, and see that good order and cleanliness are everywhere maintained, that the rules are strictly observed, and that the nurses and servants do their duty, and also assist them in the discharge of such duties. She shall attend to the distribution of all diets so that there may be no reasonable cause of complaint, and may claim the services of any convalescent or benevolent patient able to assist. Any convalescent or benevolent patient refusing to assist will be instantly dismissed.

63. She shall visit the laundry daily, and give the necessary instructions concerning the washing, drying, and getting up of the linen, blankets, &c., and see that the same are in every respect fit for use before being again issued. She shall give the necessary directions

for making and mending the linen and clothing, and take care that all articles are properly numbered and marked with the name of the institution, and shall notify to the resident surgeon any deficiency in the stock of such

with the name of the institution, and shall notity to the resident surgeon any deficiency in the stock of such articles.

64. She shall have charge of the clothing, bedding, linen, haberdashery, cutlery, glass, delf, kitchen utensils, and other articles of household management, and shall keep an accurate account of same in a book, and make a quarterly return thereof early in the months of March, June, September, and December, to the resident surgeon, to be laid before the visiting committee, showing the condition of the stock on hand, and the probable requirements for the next quarter.

65. She shall see that all the food for the patients, officers, and servants is properly cooked and served, and generally shall perform all other duties as matron.

66. She shall strictly attend the directions of the medical officers, and use her utmost endeavours to prevent the introduction of liquor and improper provisions for the patients. She shall trent them with kindness, and never suffer any unkindness or neglect to go unreproved or unreported.

67. She may employ the nurses and servants (when not engaged with the patients) in doing other work for the benefit of the Institution, but not for her own personal benefit except in case of sickness.

68. She shall not give leave of absence, beyond two hours, to any servant, except by permission of the resident surgeon, and specifying the length of absence for which leave is granted in the attendance book.

69. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion she shall give immediate notice of such request to such minister of religion.

70. She shall at once report in writing to the resident surgeon any misconduct, neglect of duty or irregularity which may come to her knowledge; and shall enter into the book, to be kept for the information of the committee only, any complaint made by any patient or employee.

71. At each monthly meeting of the general committee she shall furnish a report of the extra requirements for the tourness the names of natient

# NURSES AND SERVANTS.

77. The nurses and servants shall be constantly in their wards, and regular in their attendance upon patients.
78. They shall obey the matron, and shall behave with tenderness to all patients, with civility and respect to strangers; they shall withdraw from the wards when the committees enter them, unless particularly requested to remain; and they shall take no presents or gratuity, in money or otherwise, from the patients, their friends, or strangers who may visit the institution, on any pretence whatever.

79. This shall not apply to medicines, medical comforts, surgical instruments or appliances, which shall be subject to the approval of the resident surgeon.

80. No nurse, or servant, shall leave the institution without permission of the matron, in accordance with the committee's regulations.

81. The matron, nurses, and servants shall be particular to observe personal cleanliness; they shall have their respective wards sweet, scrubbed, and thoroughly cleansed, and all dirt and rubbish removed.

82. They shall serve up breakfast to the patients at half-past eight o'clock in the morning.

83. They shall have the several chamber utensils scalded every morning before eight o'clock, and scoured as often as may be necessary, and kept out of the wards during the day, unless specially required.

84. They shall pay great attention to the bedding of the patients and have the mattresses thoroughly aired and dried when necessary and the sheets and blankets and counterpanes renewed as often as may be required.

85. They shall not allow clothes to be hung, nor dirt to be thrown out of the windows.

86. They shall administer to patients, at the times directed, the medicines and diet prescribed, and they shall not suffer them to take any which are not prescribed, and they shall be enreful to explain to the patients the instructions of the honorary medical officer and register expressions. and resident surgeon.

87. They shall not permit patients to receive from visi-

and resident surgeon.

87. They shall not permit patients to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, tobacco, or llquor of any kind; nor allow any portion of medicine or diet, nor anything to be removed from the wards by the patients or visitors, without an order trom the resident surgeon.

88. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the resident surgeon all empty vials, gallipots, bandages, &c., and they shall attend at the dispensary at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

80. They shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients, more especially in urgent or uncommon cases, and report to the resident surgeon.

90. They shall not admit any stranger into any ward without permission of the resident surgeon (except on visiting days).

91. The matron, nurses, and servants shall be obedient to the regulations of the institution, and they shall report immediately to the resident surgeon any impropriety of conduct or infringement of them by any patient, visitor, or other person; and if such complaint be not properly attended to, they shall report the same to the visiting committee at its next meeting.

92. Patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the honorary medical officers, resident surgeon, matron,

and nurses.

93. They shall take their medicines at the time directed, and they shall take no other medicines than those prescribed; and they shall not conceal nor put away any portion of the medicine or diet administered to them.

away any portion of the medicine or diet administered to them.

94. No one shall leave his or her ward and go into another ward or apartment, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquors, or tobacco, or anything without the express leave of the resident surgeon.

95. They shall not gamble or smoke in the wards, nor spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the wards, nor any furniture, bedding, or clothing therein, or sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language.

96. No patient shall give any reward or gratuity to any of the matrons, nurses, or other servants.

97. Any patient having any charge or complaint to make as to his or her treatment while in the hospital, shall communicate the same to the visiting committee or secretary for the purpose of investigation; but, if such complaints are not made before leaving the institution, or within three days after, they shall not be entertained.

98. Patients judged by the resident surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution, or otherwise in any way for the benefit of the institution, or otherwise in any way for the benefit of the institution, or otherwise in any way for the seident surgeon and patients' committee, be so employed.

99. Patients shall not sit up after eight o'clock in winter, or nine o'clock in summer; and all patients considered by the resident surgeon able to do so, shall rise at seven o'clock in the summer, and before eight o'clock in the winter.

# VISITORS.

100. Visitors shall be admitted into the institution on Sunday, Wednesday, and Saturday in each week, be-tween the hours of 2 and 4.30 o'clook in the afternoon; but no visitor to be allowed to remain more than two

101. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by the resident surgeon or a written order from a member of the committee addressed to the resident surgeon.

102. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the resident surgeon or matron; and visitors must retire when Pequested.

103. They will not be permitted to give to, or leave with, any patient, medicine, food, fruit, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing without the express sanction of the resident surgeon.

104. No visitor shall give to any servant of the institution any money or gratuity of any kind.

105. Visitors are requested not to interfere with the nurses, or servants, and not to disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

106. Any visitor violating any of the regulations of the institution, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire, and will not be re-admitted without special leave from the resident surgeon or visiting committee.

107. Ministers of religion, or persons certified by them in writing to be qualified, and no other, shall have acess to sick persons of their respective denominations at all reasonable times for the purpose of religious instruction. Every clergyman or religious instructor shall confine his

visits to the sick patients who belong to his religious communion, unless his services are specially requested by any of the patients, and shall impart religious instruction at the bedside of the patient in such a way as to be as little overhand as possible by the surrounding patients. It is not allowable to read in a loud voice or conduct public religious service in the sick wards of the Hospital, except by special permission of the general committee, but the waiting room of the Hospital shall be available for public worship among the convalescents of each religious persuasion, as far as the same may be practicable, subject to the approval of the general committee. subject to the approval of the general committee.



That double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted. PIECE-WORK. The lowest piece work prices to be paid to any person for doing work of the description referred to in the following Schedule shall be-Hand repairing ordinary bags (employee to provide twine) ... Hand repairing mill, coal, lime, or hide bags (employee to provide twine) .. 8½d. per dozen.

The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at repairing by machine (employer to provide twine), provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.
