Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE CARRIAGE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes; (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions; (c) Tram cars, or any part or parts thereof, such as ironwork or bodies, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tyres, rims, hubs, or spokes, has made the following Determination, viz. :—

That on the 10th day of March, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

DEFINITION OF JUVENILE WORKERS.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed at assisting smith or vyceman.

	Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
TIME OF BEGINNING	7.30 a.m.	5.15 p.m. on each of the five days in the week.
AND ENDING WORK	7.30 a.m.	12 noon on the day on which the half-holiday is usually observed.

OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or for any work done within such hours in excess of 48 hours in any week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Days (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
