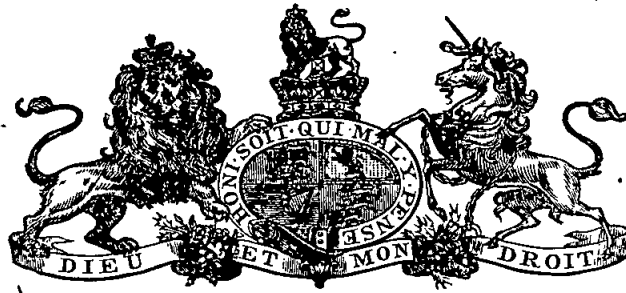

PUBLIC SERVICE EXAMINATIONS.

NOTICE is hereby given that Examinations of Male Candidates for appointment to the Clerical and General Divisions of the Public Service of the State of Victoria will be held at such of the undermentioned places, or elsewhere, as may be found necessary, commencing at Nine (9) o'clock a.m. on Saturday, the 31st March, 1917 :—

Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Friday, 9th March, 1917.

Forms of application and copies of the Regulations may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest their residence—and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Wednesday, 21st March, 1917, a crossed postal note payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) in the case of candidates for the Clerical Examination, and Five shillings (5s.) in the case of candidates for the General Division Examinations, being the fees for such examinations.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

For the position of Penal Warder applicants must be between the ages of 25 and 35 years, and must furnish a certificate of fitness from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne, not later than Friday, the 9th March, 1917. No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he shall be less than 5 feet 8 inches in height, or measure round his chest less than 36 inches, or weigh less than 11 stone.

For the position of Junior Messenger applicants must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty years. After attainment of the age of twenty-one years and completion of three years' service an officer may be granted a salary of £108 a year.

NOTE.—The limitation as to maximum age will not apply to any returned sailor or soldier who may desire to become an applicant. In these cases certificate of discharge must be furnished.

The flood protection works for such district, and for an adjacent area proposed to be constituted the Upper Koo-wee-rup Flood Protection District, wholly or partly constructed before the 24th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, consist of main and subsidiary drains and appurtenant works.

The cost of such works was approximately £238,000, of which £168,000 was for the district defined above.

The scheme of flood protection works now proposed for the district defined above, and for the adjacent area proposed to be constituted the Upper Koo-wee-rup Flood Protection District consists of enlargements, of embankments and catch drains along the main drain, enlarging old and excavating new subsidiary drains, defining and straightening portions of the Lang Lang River and the Yallock Creek, with appurtenant works.

The estimated cost of such proposed works is £55,000, of which £49,000 is for the district defined above. Of the total estimated cost of the works the Government has arranged to contribute a sum not exceeding £15,400, and on this basis the net capital cost of the works now proposed which will be chargeable to the district defined above will be reduced from £49,000 to £35,280.

BY-LAW NO. 36, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1917.

THE Inglewood Borough Council doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by section 168 of the Water Act 1915, make the following Rate, from the first day of January, 1917, to the thirty-first day of December, 1917, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Inglewood, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

- On every house or tenement of the annual value of £5 and under the annual sum of Ten shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £5 and not exceeding £10, the annual sum of Fifteen shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, and not exceeding £20, the annual sum of Twenty shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £30, the annual sum of Thirty shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £30, and not exceeding £40, the annual sum of Forty shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £40, and not exceeding £50, the annual sum of Fifty shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £50, and not exceeding £60, the annual sum of Sixty shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £60, and not exceeding £70, the annual sum of Seventy shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £70, and not exceeding £80, the annual sum of Eighty shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £80, and not exceeding £90, the annual sum of Ninety shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £90, and not exceeding £100, the annual sum of Five pounds.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100, and not exceeding £120, the annual sum of Six pounds.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £120, and not exceeding £140, the annual sum of Seven pounds.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £140, and not exceeding £160, the annual sum of Eight pounds.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £160, and not exceeding £180, the annual sum of Nine pounds.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £180, and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of Ten pounds.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200, and not exceeding £225, the annual sum of Eleven pounds.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of £225, and not exceeding £250, the annual sum of Eleven pounds ten shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £250, and not exceeding £275, the annual sum of Twelve pounds.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £275, and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of Twelve pounds ten shillings.

The Water Supply District shall include all occupied lands and tenements within the pink line marked on the plan now exhibited in the Council Chambers with the borough seal stamped thereon and having the signature of the Mayor—Thomas Tatchell, Esq.

Owners of steam engines or other property not being domiciles requiring water for same may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council; and all persons whose tenements and property are outside the Water Supply District may be supplied by making special arrangements with the Council. Charges for hotels and other tenements having stables to be 10s. per stall per annum.

Water troughs and stand-pipes on the footpaths, streets, or outside private property will not be permitted.

The owner of any tenement or property permitting or allowing any person to carry away water excepting for the use of the tenement or property belonging thereto will be liable to have the water cut off.

The above rate is payable half-yearly in advance. The foregoing By-law was made and agreed to on the 26th day of January, 1917, and confirmed on the 9th day of February, 1917.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

THE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1917 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Melvor; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound five shillings.

2. A rate of Six shillings and threepence shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid, but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half-a-mile distant from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first January and first July, 1917.

8. Such persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed by me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) _____ A.B.

(Date.) _____

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous:

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as a surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

BOROUGH OF SANDRINGHAM CONSTITUTED, AND SHIRE OF MOORABBIN RE-DEFINED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of February, 1917.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2656) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make orders amongst other things to constitute any part of Victoria not exceeding in area nine square miles and having no point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and containing a population of inhabitant householders not less than five hundred, a borough: And it is further enacted that every order constituting any new borough shall assign a name to such borough, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and in case it is to be subdivided name and describe the subdivisions; and it is further enacted that every order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district may abolish all the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or re-subdivide the same; and that every order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Moorabbin, praying that a certain area described in such petition, being part of the South and West Ridings, be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Borough of Sandringham: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a borough to be named the Borough of Sandringham, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Moorabbin and of the South and West Ridings of the said shire as reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth further order that the said new Borough of Sandringham be subdivided into three Wards, to be named the Hampton Ward, the Sandringham Ward, and the Black Rock Ward, the boundaries of which shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth further order that the Council of the said borough shall consist of nine members.

BOUNDARIES.

Sandringham Borough.

Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay in a line with the centre of New-street; thence northerly by a line and New-street to South-road; thence east along South-road to Bluff-road; thence south by Bluff-road to Bay-road; thence east by Bay-road to Reserve-road; thence south by Reserve-road to Balcombe-road; thence easterly by Balcombe-road to Cromer-road; thence south by Cromer-road and a line to a point in line with the centre of Cromer-road on the shore of Port Phillip Bay; thence south-westerly, westerly, and north-westerly by that shore to the commencing point in line with the centre of New-street.

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 130.

A BY-LAW for the Regulation and Management of the Abattoirs of the City of Melbourne and for fixing the dues and fees to be charged thereat.

Preamble.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1915*, No. 2623, and of the *Meat Supervision Act 1915*, No. 2694, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne, hereinafter called the Council, makes the following By-law:—

1. The By-laws set out in the schedule hereunder written to the extent to which the same are thereby expressed to be repealed are hereby repealed. Provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any act or omission in contravention of any such By-laws prior to the commencement of this By-law.

AS TO SUPERINTENDENCE.

2. *Superintendence.*—The land of the Council held for abattoir purposes and all buildings and structures thereon and appurtenances thereto (which land, buildings, structures, and appurtenances are meant by and included in the word "establishment" where occurring in this By-law) shall be under the charge, care, management, and direction of a Chief Inspector, with one or more assistants as the Council have appointed or shall appoint for that purpose.

3. *Inspectors' Duties.*—Along with such other duties as the Council shall assign from time to time to the Inspectors, it shall be especially their duties to carry out and enforce the regulations of the Council for the management of the establishment as to cleanliness and otherwise. To examine all animals slaughtered at the establishment, and take action as prescribed by law with regard to any which they may find to be unfit for human food. To see that all animals awaiting slaughter be duly supplied with food and water, and that no ill-treatment or unnecessary cruelty be inflicted upon any such animal. To take care that good order and propriety in conduct and speech be observed throughout the establishment. To collect all fees and dues and keep the register of names of slaughtermen and all other persons permitted to work at the establishment.

4. *Assistant Inspector.*—During absence of the Chief Inspector his duties shall devolve upon and be performed by the assistants or other persons in the service of the Council then in charge of the establishment, and such assistants or persons shall for the time being have all the power, authority, and duty of the Chief Inspector.

AS TO USE AND MANAGEMENT.

5. *Use and Management.*—The establishment shall be open for slaughtering every day, not being Sunday, Good Friday, Christmas Day, or such public holidays as may be determined by the Council, from 7 o'clock a.m. until 6 o'clock p.m., except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from 7 o'clock a.m. until 11 o'clock a.m.; and the establishment shall be open at no other time except upon special occasions, and then upon such special conditions as may be prescribed in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.

6. *Use on Payment of Dues.*—Every person who shall pay the dues and fees as hereinafter fixed shall be entitled to the use for a reasonable time of such portion of the establishment as shall be available and be assigned to him.

7. *Stock to be Reported.*—Every person who shall bring any stock to the establishment shall inform the Chief Inspector of the description and number thereof, and the Chief Inspector shall enter such information in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall direct and indicate the portion of the establishment in which such stock shall be placed, and such person shall place such stock in no other part of the establishment than that so directed and indicated, and shall himself be responsible for the safety and proper sustenance thereof. He must also give notice to the Chief Inspector of his intention to commence slaughtering stock before he shall commence to slaughter same, and in no case shall any stock, once brought to the establishment, be removed therefrom without the consent of the Chief Inspector.

8. *Compartments to be Kept Clean, &c.*—Every person who shall have assigned to him for his special use any compartment of the establishment shall at all times, while he shall use such compartment, keep the same, with the yards and appurtenances thereof, clean and free from offence, whether by accumulation of blood, filth, or otherwise, and shall, as and whenever required by an Inspector, cleanse, scrape, limewash, or otherwise purify in such manner as shall be necessary, and, as the Inspector shall direct, the walls, doors, floors, or

other portion of such compartment and the appurtenances thereof which he shall be so accustomed and entitled to use, and he shall in all respects comply with the regulations for the management of the establishment.

9. *Killing-pens to be Cleansed.*—In every compartment of the establishment, upon one or more head of large cattle which shall have been enclosed in the killing-pen being killed, and before any other beast is driven into such pen, the slaughterman must sweep, or cause to be swept, cleanly all the blood from such cattle into the blood-pit constructed to receive the same, and must put, or cause to be put, any refuse which shall have resulted from such slaughtering into the separate bin or receptacle provided for it.

10. *Offal must be Hung Up.*—No offal which can be hung up shall be allowed to remain upon the floor of any pithing-pen or hanging-room; but all such offal, when produced, must be hung up upon the hooks provided for that purpose in the hanging-room or other portion of the compartment.

11. *Refuse not to be Removed by Users of the Establishment.*—No refuse or offal other than such as shall be capable of being, without sanitary objection, used as or converted into human food shall be removed from the establishment by any slaughterman or person permitted to use any portion of the establishment.

12. *Sheep, &c., to be Killed with a Knife.*—No small cattle—that is to say, no sheep, lamb, or goat—shall be slaughtered in the establishment except with a knife.

AS TO DUES AND FEES.

13. *Dues for Slaughtering.*—The slaughtering dues which shall be demanded, received, and taken at the establishment by the Chief Inspector, or other officer or person appointed for that purpose by the Council, shall be as follows:—

14. *Examination and Branding Fees.*—The fees for examining and branding carcasses under the direction of the Chief Inspector at the establishment, which shall be demanded, received, and taken by the Chief Inspector or other officer or person appointed for the purpose by the Council, shall be as follows:—

making the total charges as follows:—Cattle, 2s. 6d.; calves, 1s. 1d.; pigs, 1s. 1½d.; and sheep, 2½d.

15. *Hours for Opening and Closing of Chilling Chambers.*—The chilling chambers at the establishment shall be opened and closed daily at such times as the Chief Inspector shall direct, and at no other times, and all persons doing business at the establishment in connexion with the chilling chambers shall conform to the directions of the Chief Inspector or the Inspector on duty at the time.

AS TO THE RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES OF THE COUNCIL.

16. *Council not Responsible for Death of or Injury to Stock Except Through Negligence.*—The Council will take all reasonable care of stock brought into the establishment for slaughter, but will not be responsible for any injury to or for the death or escape of any stock not arising from the negligence or default of any of its officers or servants.

17. *Council not Responsible for Loss of Carcass Meat, Fats, Offal.*—The Council will take all reasonable care of carcasses, carcass meat, and offal while in its possession, but the Council will not be responsible for any loss thereof, or any damage thereto, not arising from the neglect or default of any of its officers or servants.

18. *Council not Responsible for Bone Taint or for Loss of Hides and Skins.*—The Council will take no risk or responsibility with respect to hides and skins of animals slaughtered at the establishment; and the Council will under no circumstances whatever be responsible for bone-taint, or for any other condition which may occur in carcass meat in the chilling chambers not arising from the neglect or default of any of its officers or servants.

19. *Council to have Lien for Fees.*—The Council shall have a lien on all stock, carcasses, skins, hides, or fat for the time being in the establishment of any person indebted to the Council, and if any person shall make default for seven days in payment of any fees due by him the Council may, without making any demand or giving any notice, sell by public auction or private contract all or any of such stock, carcasses, skins, hides, or

fat, and receive the net proceeds thereof, and, after deducting all fees due, the Council shall pay the balance or surplus thereof to such person or to whom he may direct.

AS TO INSPECTION AND DISEASE.

20. *Stock to be Inspected before and after Slaughter.*—Stock brought to the establishment shall, in all cases, be submitted for inspection both before and after slaughter.

21. *Carcass to be Examined and Passed before Removal.*—No person shall remove from the establishment any carcass, or portion of a carcass, slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the Inspector, and passed by him as fit for human food, and branded by him with the regulation brand.

22. *Diseased Carcass to be Removed.*—If an Inspector shall find that any carcass, or portion of a carcass, is diseased, such carcass, or portion thereof, as the case may be, shall be removed to the place set apart for the treatment of diseased carcasses.

23. *Inspector Empowered to Cut into Carcass Suspected to be Diseased.*—Every Inspector shall have power, should he suspect the existence of any disease likely to render any carcass unfit for human food, to cut into or divide the same, or any part thereof, or remove any part of such carcass, for the purpose of inspection.

24. *Viscera, &c., not to be Tampered with, or Removed prior to Inspection.*—Any person tampering with any carcass or viscera so as to attempt to disguise its condition, or stripping or removing the pleura or cutting the lung or liver from the carcass, or removing the head from the vicinity of the carcass from which it has been severed before examination by the inspector, shall be guilty of an offence.

25. *Instruments and Vessels to be Sterilized.*—All instruments and vessels used in slaughtering any diseased stock or dressing a diseased carcass shall previous to being used for any other purpose be sterilized or otherwise treated as an inspector may direct.

AS TO SLAUGHTERMEN.

26. *Slaughtermen.*—No person shall be permitted to commence or continue to work for any other person at the establishment as a slaughterman unless his name shall be entered in the Register of Slaughtermen kept by the Chief Inspector, and he shall have signed an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every of the rules of the establishment under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the Register of Slaughtermen.

27. *Slaughtermen to wear Clean Clothes.*—Every slaughterman and every person assisting slaughtermen in the chilling of animals or dressing of carcasses shall provide himself with proper and sufficient working clothes for the purpose to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector or any assistant inspector, and every person acting as a slaughterman or assistant shall keep such clothes clean to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector or assistant inspector.

28. *Diseased Animal to be Reported.*—Immediately any animal slaughtered is discovered to be diseased the slaughterman in charge of the pen shall immediately stop the work of dressing such animal for food, and report the fact to the inspector on duty at the abattoirs, and shall not proceed further with such dressing until authorized by the inspector.

29. *No Carcass to be "Stripped."*—No carcass shall be "stripped," whether for boding or otherwise, until the sanction therefor of the inspector on duty has been obtained.

30. *Back-setting not Permitted.*—No carcass (other than the carcasses of lambs) whether intended for human consumption or not, shall within the city of Melbourne be dressed or caused or allowed to be dressed in the manner or by the method known as back-setting; nor shall any caul fat be attached to any such carcass or otherwise used in the dressing thereof.

31. *Head of Lamb not to be Removed.*—The head shall not be cut off or detached from the carcass of any lamb until such lamb or such carcass has been inspected by the Meat Inspector at the abattoirs where such carcass is being dressed, and passed by him as lamb.

32. *Evidence of Lamb.*—For the purpose of this By-law the presence of any permanent teeth in any carcass shall be sufficient evidence that such carcass is not the carcass of a lamb.

33. *Diseased Organs not to be mixed with Healthy Organs.*—It shall be the duty of slaughtermen to see that the organs of diseased carcasses are not mixed up with the organs of healthy carcasses.

34. No slaughterman or other person shall—

(a) *No Smoking.*—Smoke while dressing carcasses or handling meat.

- (b) *No Writing, &c., allowed on Walls, and no Signs, &c., to be Disfigured.*—Write on, soil, or disfigure any of the walls, fittings, or fixtures of the establishment, or remove, deface, or disfigure any sign, signboard, or written or printed matter or notice on or in the establishment.
- (c) *Electric Light Switches, &c., not to be interfered with.*—Except with the permission of the Chief Inspector, interfere in any way with the electric light switches, ventilation arrangements, or the steam or water pipes, or other appliances in the establishment.
- (d) *Slaughtermen to change Killing Clothes, &c.*—No slaughterman shall leave the establishment without first changing the killing or working clothes worn by him.

35. *Meals in Messroom.*—Every slaughterman and every other person having meals at the establishment shall use the messroom provided for the purpose, and shall not use any other portion of the establishment for the purpose.

36. *Compartments to be Cleaned after use.*—After completion of slaughtering, and before leaving the compartment, the slaughtermen shall carefully cleanse, or cause to be cleansed, the portion of the establishment which they shall have been at work in, and shall leave the same in a state of cleanliness and order to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector.

AS TO DRESS AND CONDUCT.

37. *Repair of Damage.*—Every person using the establishment who shall do any breakage, injury, damage, or destruction thereto, or to any of the appliances used in connexion therewith, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector, and if he shall have so acted wantonly or maliciously he shall upon conviction thereof forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

38. *Animals not to be ill-treated.*—No person shall ill-treat any animal or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animal at the establishment.

39. *Food and Water for Cattle.*—Every person who shall bring cattle to the establishment and keep the same there for more than one day shall provide the same with sufficient food and water.

40. *Dogs Excluded.*—No dogs other than cattle or sheep dogs shall be brought upon or allowed to remain in the establishment, and such cattle and sheep dogs when not in use shall be securely tied up. All other dogs found in the establishment, whether in charge of any person or not, will be destroyed.

41. *Trespassers not to Intrude.*—No person, unless registered as a slaughterman or having lawful business to transact at the establishment, shall intrude into it or remain therein after ten o'clock in the forenoon; and if any such person do not leave immediately upon being requested to do so by an inspector or other officer, he shall be guilty of an offence, and may be forcibly removed.

42. *Penalty for Misconduct.*—Any person who shall be drunk, or shall be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive language or of obscenity or indecency, or who shall conduct himself riotously or create disturbance, or who shall obstruct in the execution of his duty any inspector or other officer or person appointed by the Council to conduct or aid in the good management of the establishment, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any inspector, officer, or person made in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence, and may be forcibly removed from the establishment, and shall be liable to a penalty.

43. Any person who shall deposit any blood, offal, filth, or refuse-matter upon any portion of the establishment or on any land or road abutting thereon, save in the pits, bins, or receptacles provided and appointed for reception of same, shall be guilty of an offence.

44. *Persons engaged in Loading or Handling Meat to wear Clean Clothing.*—(a) Every person engaged in loading or handling meat at the establishment shall wear clean clothing of suitable material or clean overalls, and a clean cap covering the head, to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector or any assistant inspector.

(b) The Chief Inspector or any assistant inspector may refuse to allow any person not wearing clean clothing or clean overalls and a clean cap to load or handle any meat.

45. *Persons Suffering from Infectious Disease not to Work at Establishment or Load or Handle Meat There.*—No person suffering from tuberculosis or any infectious or contagious disease, or from any eruption affecting the skin of the hands, arms, face, or any portion of the body, shall work in or load or handle meat at the establishment, and any inspector shall refuse to allow any meat slaughtered at the establishment to be

loaded or handled by any person suspected to be suffering from tuberculosis or any infectious or contagious disease or from any eruption affecting the skin of the hands, arms, face, or any portion of the body.

46. *Boys under 14 not to be Employed.*—No boy apparently under the age of fourteen years shall be employed at the establishment in any capacity whatever.

AS TO PENALTIES.

47. If any person shall infringe or fail to carry out any of the provisions hereof or any of the rules or regulations of the Council for the management of the establishment as shall for the time being be lawfully in force he shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
