## IN THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS.

In the matter of the Factories and Shops Acts

In the matter of an appeal by a group of employers who employ not less than 25 per centum of the total number of the workers in the trade affected, against the Determination of the Quarry Board, dated the 10th May, 1916.

The above-mentioned Appeal coming on for Hearing before this Court on the 19th, 20th, and 21st days of February, 1917, and this day: Upon reading the notice of appeal and upon hearing what was alleged on behalf of the appellants and on behalf of various employees, This Court dother and Determine:

1. That on the 14th day of March, 1917, the Determination of the Quarry Board dated the 10th day of May, 1916, and previous Determinations shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination as to the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of quarrying, not including agriculture, or employed in carting or driving, or assisting in carting or driving, in connexion with or incidental to the trade or business of quarrying (not including agriculture).

- 3. Overtime.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours, and thereafter time and a half.
- 4. Special Rates for Sundays and Public Holidays.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), or Good Friday: but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Pitchers or cubes restricted to any length which exceeds the average of the lengths specified in any particular item shown above shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hundred in addition to the respective prices specified opposite the said item.

Pitchers or cubes tied to any definite length which does not exceed the average of the lengths specified in any particular item shown above shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. per hundred in addition to the respective prices specified opposite the said item.

Pitchers or cubes tied to any definite length which exceeds the average of the lengths specified in any particular item shown above shall be paid for at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hundred in addition to the respective prices specified opposite the said item.

All stone for pitchers or cubes shall be plugged and placed on the banker ready for persons engaged knocking out and dressing.
