Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE BRASSWORKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a brassfounder or brassfinisher, or in the process, trade, or business of a brassfounder or brassfinisher of any electrical apparatus or machinery or parts thereof, has made the following Determination, namely:—

- 1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 18th day of January, 1917. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

The Brassworkers Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187 of Act 2650 requires that the indentures must be in that form.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piecework price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

Health Act 1915. SHIRE OF GLENELG. BY-LAW No. 13.

THE Council of the Shire of Glenelg in the name and on behalf of the President and Councillors and Batepayers of the said shire by virtue of the powers conferred by section 314 of the Health Act 1915 No. 2665 and of all other powers enabling the Council in this behalf doth hereby make the following By-law No. 13 of the said Council:—

13 of the said Council:—

1. This By-law No. 13 shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public licalth and immediately after its publication in the tovernment Gazette.

2. This By-law shall have operation in the township of Casterton in the shire of Glenelg and shall extend and apply to every occupier of a tenement therein.

3. Each householder in such township shall at his own cost from time to time provide and keep in an inoffensive condition a covered non-absorbent receptacle into which he shall without delay place the rubbish from time to time accumulating in the house and yard occupied by him and into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient decodorant shall be introduced by him when necessary.

4. At least once a week or so much more frequently as the said Council may from time to time hereafter direct the contents of such receptacle shall be removed by a servant of the Council to such place or places as the Council shall provide and either rendered inoffensive or be incinerated in destructors desiccators or incinerators provided by the Council.

5. Ao such householder shall place any such receptacle in any street or lane but the same shall be taken from the yards and replaced by the Council's servants.

6. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of refuse from his premises except in accordance with this By-law.

7. Under the powers conferred by section 35 of the

ance with this By-law.

7. Under the powers conferred by section 35 of the said Act the Council doth hereby impose a penalty of £5 for every breach of this By-law and a penalty of £2 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued provided that the Court of Petty Sessions before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 4.

TN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1915, the Commissioners of the Maffra Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

A ct 1915, the Commissioners of the Mafra Water-works Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust:—

2. For every house or tenement of an annual value of £14 or over at the rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound (1s. 9d.) of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of a less annual value than £14, a minimum charge of £1 bs.

4. For every vacant allotment of land of an annual value of £5, or under, a charge of 5s. For each additional allotment of land rated together with the first allotment, 1s.; where the annual value of an allotment is over £5, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the annual value thereof.

5. For every water trough supplied with water, £1. On vacant lands the rate payment shall be considered as part payment of this charge of £1.

6. For water supplied by measure 2s. for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate, except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements. Where the occupier quits without paying for excess water the owner will be held liable for same.

7. For using a hose for stable watering during the year, 10s. This payment will entitle the user to an additional 5,000 gallons of water.

8. For water supplied to new buildings being erected £1 per cent. on the contract price of all brick, stone, cement or other work where water is used. Minimum charge for each house Ten shillings.

9. Water supplied to manufactories, railways, livery stables, gardens or paddocks, or for other than domestic purposes, may be charged at a special rate, or by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust.

10. The Trust may by notice, in writing, require any owner or occupier using water through a hose or for other than domestic purposes, to provide a meter within two weeks from the date of suc

Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be re-connected with the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of 8 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

12. For water supplied through any stand-pipe or hydrant, for each 200 gallons One shilling.

13. For all lands or tenements in the said district situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes for the supply of water, have been laid down, and in which tenements are not supplied with such water from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe or hydrant for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile and less than half-a-mile from such stand-pipe or hydrant, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

14. For every plumber's licence £1 per year ending 81st December.

15. The foreging rates and charges are payable in two moieties in advance on the 1st day of February, 1917, and 1st August, 1917. Interest at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum will be charged on all amounts six months overdue. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum in advance on the 1st February, 1917. Such person as the Commissioners may appoint shall be authorized to collect the said rates and charges.

COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

By-law No. 13.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1915, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1917 for water supplied within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District:—

for water supplied within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1917.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as domiciles, shall be Thirty shillings (30s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street, Queen-street, from Station-street to High-street; Punt-rond, from Station-street to High-street; Punt-rond, from Station-street to High-street, from Queen-street to Pine-street, a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

5. On all unoccupied allotments not served with a water main, situated within half-a-mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be charged.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1917.

7. Where, in the opinion of the Trust, it is necessary that a meter be affixed to the water pipe supplying any allotment, house, or tenement, the same may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust, and the cost of same shall be repaid by the owner of such house, allotment, or tenement; but the Trust may permit such repayment to be made at the rate of Thirty-two shillings (32s.) yearly, payable by quarterly instalments. instalments.

8. The Trust may require an approved meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement in any case where it may deem necessary.

9. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

premises supplied.

10. For water supplied by measure, a charge of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

11. For water supplied to bowling greens or other public or semi-public grounds the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.
