DETERMINATION OF THE CLOTHING BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Special Board appointed to determine the Lowest Price or Rate which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly proparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, the following articles of Men's and Boys' Clothing or Wearing Apparel, namely, Coats (including Overcoats and Cloaks of every description), Vests, Trousers, Jackets, and Knickerbockers, except indiarubber waterproof garments, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 13th April, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked, and replaced by this Determination.

(2) Casual Labour.—Casual employees, i.e., employees engaged at pressing or order cutting for 24 hours or less in any week shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.

Time of Beginning and Ending Work. f 7.30 a.m. 6 p.m. on five days of ti

(4) Overtime.—Any employee who, within the hours of beginning and ending work, works in any week for any time in excess of 48 hours, shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

Any employee who is engaged outside the hours specified in this Determination as the times of beginning and ending work upon such day shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half.

(5) Special Rate for Sundays and Public Holidays.—All work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, shall be paid for at the rate of double time. If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the abovenamed holidays, the special rate should only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
