NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A PROCLAMATION RE THE CLOSE SEASON FOR OYSTERS AND RESTRICTIONS ON MARKETING AND STORING OF OYSTERS.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation of the thirty-first day of August, 1915, relating to the close season for oysters, and to order and provide as follows:—

1. That the months of January, February, November, and December shall be substituted for the period fixed by section 17 (2) of the *Fisheries Act 1915* as the period during which it shall be unlawful to take, attempt to take, or assist in taking, or sell or offer or expose for sale, or knowingly have in possession any oysters or oyster brood taken in Victorian waters.
2. That no person licensed to take oysters shall in any one week sell, offer for sale, consign or market more than—

- (a) seven three-bushel bags of oysters, or
- (b) twenty-one bushels of oysters.

3. That the storing of oysters in bags, either in or out of the water, for more than three days after the day on which such oysters have been taken, shall be prohibited.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply or of this By-law or any By-law of the Trust.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

4. No person shall lay down a pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes of Twenty pounds (£20) or under; and

(b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Nine o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or before the hour of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public water service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. Every person upon whose premises a water-trough stands shall keep such trough provided with a ball tap, and shall keep such water-trough and ball tap at all times in a state of thorough repair. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation, wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, or at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under clause seven (7) hereof. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under the Water Acts, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply.

14. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to

inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this By-law; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

15. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

16. The By-law made by the Trust on the fourteenth day of December, 1915, relating to water supply is hereby repealed.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1917.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1917 of the property so supplied.

6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year, 1917. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

1. That the area included within the boundaries defined in the Schedule hereto shall be, and the same is, hereby constituted a Flood Protection District under the jurisdiction and control of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, and as on and from the first day of July, 1917, such area shall be deemed to be so constituted.
2. That the boundaries of such district shall be those set out and described in the aforesaid Schedule.
3. That the name of such district shall be Lower Koo-wee-rup Flood Protection District.
4. That the scheme of flood protection works for the service of such district and of an adjacent area proposed to be constituted the Upper Koo-wee-rup Flood Protection District comprises—

- (a) flood protection works wholly or partly constructed before the 24th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, consisting of main and subsidiary drains and appurtenant works;
- (b) flood protection works to be constructed, consisting of enlargements of embankments and catch drains along the main drain, enlarging old and excavating new subsidiary drains, defining and straightening portions of the Lang Lang River and the Yallock Creek, with appurtenant works.
5. (a) That the cost of the flood protection works wholly or partly constructed before the 24th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and forming part of the scheme of flood protection works for the service of such district and of the adjacent area proposed to be constituted the Upper Koo-wee-rup Flood Protection District, was approximately £238,000, of which £168,000 was for the service of the district defined in the Schedule hereto.
- (b) That the estimated cost of the flood protection works to be constructed (described in paragraph 4 above) is £55,000, of which £49,000 is for the service of the district defined in the said Schedule. Of the total estimated cost of the works the Government has arranged to contribute a sum not exceeding £15,400, and on this basis the net capital cost of the works now proposed, which will be chargeable to the district defined in the said Schedule, will be reduced from £49,000 to £35,280.

BY-LAW No. 1/1917.

A By-law of the Shire of East Loddon made under sections 197 and 594 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 1/1917, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any road of traction engines or other vehicles having on its wheels bars, spikes, grips or other projections, and for regulating the hours and conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any street or road.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of East Loddon order as follows:—

Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

- (a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or
- (b) any traction engine, the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled, and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width, nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding three inches provided in such last-mentioned case—
 - (1) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.
 - (2) That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any road-way, bridge or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.
 - (3) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council, or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.
 - (4) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight including the weight of such vehicle.
 - (5) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundred-weight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, &c.

2. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks 12 inches in width, 4 inches in thickness and at least 12 feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

Hours for Travelling.

3. No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine at night (herein defined as between sunset and sunrise) unless by written permission of the Council defining the conditions

to be observed, the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time on two days' written notice given by the shire secretary to that effect and forwarded to the owner's or driver's address by registered letter.

Rate of Travel, &c.

4. The driver of every traction engine when travelling his engine on any public road shall not drive such engine at a greater speed than four miles per hour, and shall (if proceeding at more than two and a-half miles per hour) reduce his speed to that limit while passing any vehicle, and shall, when requested verbally or by up-raised arms as a signal by any person driving a horse or horses in any conveyance, stop until such conveyance has passed such engine.

5. The driver of any traction engine shall not stop such engine on any road (unless through unforeseen circumstances or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, and such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

6. Previous By-law is hereby repealed.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
