

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A PROCLAMATION RE THE CLOSE SEASON FOR OYSTERS AND RESTRICTIONS ON MARKETING AND STORING OF OYSTERS.

2. That no person licensed to take oysters shall in any one week sell, offer for sale, consign or market more than—

- (a) seven three-bushel bags of oysters, or
- (b) twenty-one bushels of oysters.

3. That the storing of oysters in bags, either in or out of the water, for more than three days after the day on which such oysters have been taken, shall be prohibited.

BOROUGH OF SALE.

BY-LAW NO. 21.

A By-law of the Borough of Sale, made under the *Health Act 1915*, and numbered 21, for regulating the removal and disposal of house and yard rubbish, and to compel occupiers and owners of premises within the Borough of Sale to provide proper receptacles for the garbage arising from their premises.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915*, and of any power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the borough of Sale, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law be and are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the borough of Sale.

4. The Council may exempt any premises within the municipal boundaries of the borough of Sale from the operation of this By-law on the recommendation of the Health Officer and the Health Inspector.

5. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall provide or cause to be provided and kept, thereon, a covered receptacle or receptacles made of non-absorbent material, and shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in such covered non-absorbent watertight receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary, the capacity of each of such receptacles not to exceed three cubic feet.

6. Every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacle or receptacles in his yard so as to be easily accessible to the borough scavengers, and shall not place them in any street or lane without the consent, in writing, of the Health Inspector, and shall be responsible for the keeping of the receptacle, or receptacles, in a sound and inoffensive condition.

7. That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles shall be removed, and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor.

8. No such occupier or person shall deposit, place, or sweep any dust, rubbish, yard or house sweepings, or filth of any kind, upon any land, street, lane, drain, water-channel, or place other than the depots provided by the Council, or the receptacles provided by the householder for the deposit of such dust, rubbish, yard or house sweepings, or filth.

9. For every offence against any provisions of this By-law the offender shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or less than Five shillings.

His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by the majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the shire of Maffra, notice of which was published in the *Government Gazette* of 22nd February, 1917, doth hereby order and direct that a certain area therein described, being part of the Eastern Riding of the said shire, shall be severed therefrom and annexed to the East Riding of the shire of Avon, the amended boundaries of the said shire of Maffra with its Eastern Riding as reduced, and also those of the said shire of Avon with the East Riding as enlarged, are set out and described in the Schedule hereto.
