Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE TIMBER-FELLERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the occupation of felling or preparing timber for saw-mills or conveying it to the mills has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 30th day of April, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(4)</sup> Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), and Christmas Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
