NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A PROCLAMATION RE THE CLOSE SEASON FOR OYSTERS AND RESTRICTIONS ON MARKETING AND STORING OF OYSTERS.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation of the thirty-first day of August, 1915, relating to the close season for oysters, and to order and provide as follows:—

1. That the months of January, February, November, and December shall be substituted for the period fixed by section 17 (2) of the *Fisheries Act 1915* as the period during which it shall be unlawful to take, attempt to take, or assist in taking, or sell or offer or expose for sale, or knowingly have in possession any oysters or oyster brood taken in Victorian waters.

2. That no person licensed to take oysters shall in any one week sell, offer for sale, consign or market more than—

- (a) seven three-bushel bags of oysters, or
- (b) twenty-one bushels of oysters.

3. That the storing of oysters in bags, either in or out of the water, for more than three days after the day on which such oysters have been taken, shall be prohibited.

BY-LAW No. 673.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—QUAMBATOOK URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE AVOCA WATER TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of Thirty-nine pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of Thirty-nine pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1917, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1917, and shall be payable on the eleventh day of May, 1917, at the office of the Commission's collector at Charlton.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such

lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are, hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC GARDENS AND FOR PUBLIC PARK RESPECTIVELY IN THE CITY OF COLLINGWOOD KNOWN AS THE "DARLING GARDENS" AND THE "MAYOR'S PARK."

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act 1915* it is enacted that in the case of any land which under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown Lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently for any public purpose whatsoever or for any of the purposes specified in section ten of the said Act or the corresponding section of any repealed Act and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board and trustees it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land with the approval of the Governor in Council to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of the first-mentioned section. And whereas under and by virtue of a Crown grant dated the 9th March, 1874, the land in the town now city of Collingwood known as the "Mayor's Park" became vested in the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor Councillors and Burgesses of the town of Collingwood now the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Collingwood. And whereas under and by virtue of a Crown grant dated the 6th November, 1878, the land known as the "Darling Gardens" in the city of Collingwood became vested in the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Collingwood. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Collingwood do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said "Mayor's Park" and the said "Darling Gardens" (hereinafter called the "Reserves") :—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, fish, buildings, statuary, fountains, or any other property in the Reserves, or roll or throw stones or any missile therein, or beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance in the Reserves, or light any fire therein, or leave any bottles, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter in the Reserves.

2. No person shall climb or jump over seats or fences in or around the Reserves, or lie on the seats or grass, stick bills on the buildings, fences, gates, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the buildings, trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences in or around the Reserves, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person except those in the employ of, or authorized by the Trustees, shall bring into the Reserves any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein enclosed for plantations or other purposes.

4. All dogs and goats, and all poultry found within the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed and the owner thereof shall be liable to make compensation for any damage done.

5. No person shall preach or make any public harangue, whereby a crowd is collected, in the Reserves.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the Reserves any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by a Bailiff of Crown Lands or member of the Police Force, and shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

7. No person shall play cricket or football or engage in any athletic sports in the Reserves, without the permission in writing of the Trustees first obtained.

8. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Trustees shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in the Reserves.

9. No person shall play on any instrument or perform in any band of music or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserves without the permission in writing of the Trustees first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or in any structure or erection in the Reserves.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 82.

A By-law of the City of Geelong, made under sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915* for regulating and restraining the storage of petroleum or any products of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids, inflammable cinematograph films and carbide, and the erection and construction of buildings connected therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Geelong order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 24 of the Town (now City) of Geelong shall be and is hereby repealed.
2. Every person who shall erect, construct, alter or use any building for the storage of more than two hundred and fifty gallons of petroleum, or any products of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids, shall comply with the following requirements:—
 - (1) The site of all such buildings shall be first approved of by the Council for that purpose, or by some officer authorized in that behalf by the Council.
 - (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick or stone set in cement mortar or of cement concrete or reinforced concrete not more than sixteen feet in height.
 - (3) The lower floor of such building shall be at least four feet below the grade of the adjoining street, and shall be made of earth, concrete, or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible materials.
 - (4) The interior capacity of any such buildings shall exceed by at least twenty-five per centum the total capacity of the tanks or other receptacles placed therein.
 - (5) All rooms used for the storage of petroleum or any products of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other similar volatile or inflammable fluids, or for the storage of inflammable cinematograph films or carbide shall have walls, floors, and ceilings constructed of fire-resisting materials, and be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Council. Doors, unless opening directly to the outer air, shall be tin clad or iron cased.
3. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than two hundred and fifty gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—
 - (1) The site of all storage tanks, other than underground tanks not exceeding five hundred and

thirty-five gallons capacity, shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose, or by some officer authorized in that behalf by the Council.

- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding five hundred and thirty-five gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than two feet below the surface of the ground, or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over tank to the level of the ground or floor, as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the Surveyor. Filling pipes may be placed where the Surveyor approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground, shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction, such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than two feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank, but such opening shall contain a liquid-tight door, either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall, and complete plans and specifications for the construction of such tanks shall be submitted to and approved by the Council or by some officer authorized in that behalf by the Council before permission for their uses shall be granted.

4. All such buildings when erected, constructed, altered, or used shall conform to the provisions of the Council's Building By-laws and Regulations in so far as they apply.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality of the City of Geelong.

Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

2. That no person selling, offering, or exposing for sale fruit, fish, vegetables, or other article of trade or commerce shall linger or loiter or, save as provided by By-law No. 29 or By-law No. 78, or any amendment thereof, occupy any fixed stand or position in any street within the city of Richmond, and that every such person, whilst using any such street, shall keep moving along any such street on the side thereof situate on his left hand at a reasonable walking pace, and shall travel at the rate of not less than one mile per hour, and shall not travel upon the same part of such street more than once in the same hour.

No person shall, between the said hours, drive, ride, propel, be in charge of, or leave standing in, upon, or along any road, street, lane, highway, or public place within the said city any vehicle or motor car of whatsoever kind without having attached to such vehicle or motor car a good and serviceable lamp showing a fixed red light visible as aforesaid, and keeping such lamp continuously lighted.

3. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
