Health Act 1915. BOROUGH OF ECHUCA.

BY-LAW NO 19.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1915, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Echuca, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor. Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gravette.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the borough of Echuca.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the borough of Echuca.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the borough of Echuca shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time denosited in such receptacle or receptacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kent constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient decolorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the council.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

8. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach he liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

On an average, ten words make a line, but for the description of a brand consisting of more than one letter, &c., placed perpendicularly, thus, B, each additional B

letter under the first line is charged as a line.

. Every signature must likewise be counted as a line.

The final words of a paragraph, though only a portion of a line, must be counted as one line.

Signatures (in particular) and proper means must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.
