Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE CHAFF-CUTTERS BOARD.

· Note.—This Determination on the 16th June, 1917, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest price or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

 (a) employed in the process, trade, or business of chaff-outting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder;
 (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the trade or business of chaff-outting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder; has made the following Determination, namely :-

(1) That on the 16th day of June, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

⁽⁵⁾ Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

⁽⁶⁾ CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work) shall be paid at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour.
