SHIRE OF PRESTON. BY-LAW NO. 19,

Double Pan Closet System.

A By-law of the Shire of Preston made under the provisions of the Health Act 1915, and numbered 19, providing for a double pan service and regulating the cleansing of earth closets, privies, cesspools, and places for the deposit of night-soil and of closet pans under the double pan system.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915, the Council of the Shire of Preston, in and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, hereby order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the control of the said that the said they are still the By-laws are still for in this By-laws.

All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
 This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
 This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the municipality of the Shire of Preston.

4. That the ordinary system of pans for night-soil be abolished, and that instead thereof every closet be furnished with a double pan service.

5. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under such seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double pan service, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept

and shall cause the close to privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforestid.

7. The occupier aforesaid or other persons having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing the night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which the descripted in the ranging supple closet. night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which
may be deposited in the pan in such closet
or privy to be immediately on the deposit
thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing
material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. The council shall at least once a week cause the
pan to be closed with a lid and removed with
its contents from the premises during the day
or night and the other pan to be left in its
place.

place

9. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam or by some equally efficient means approved by the council.

10. The council shall have the power in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court-of petty sessions.

11. If any person or the council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings of to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. or continued.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 12th day of March, 1917.

ALTERATIONS IN AND ADDITIONS TO REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Geelong Harbor Trust Acts the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners make the alterations and additions hereunder specified in and to the Regulations of the Trust which were inter alia originally approved by the Governor in Council on the 15th day of June, 1909, and subsequently altered and the alterations approved as above on the 16th day of December, 1912.

Regulation No. 2.—In the second line of the definition of "the Act" for "1905" there is hereby substituted "1915."

In the definition of "tons" "tonnage" the relative positions of the words are hereby reversed and shall read "tonnage" "tons."

For the word "registered" in the same definition the

word "gross" is hereby substituted and for the word "standard" the word "measurement" is also hereby. substituted.

Regulation No. 28—Excepted Area (B).—The Commissioners hereby revoke part of Regulation 28 being excepted area (b) and in lieu of such excepted portion hereby except the following area from the operation of the said Regulation 28, viz.:—(b) To the west of a line drawn from the most northern public bathing-house on the western foreshore to the extreme eastern point of Corio Onav.

orio Quay.
The Commissioners make the following new Regulation and number it 62A :-

and number it 62A:—

Regulation No. 62A.—No vessel the cargo of which is wholly or substantially oil or similarly liquid and inflammable goods shall be berthed at a wharf until the master owner or agent thereof shall have taken out and delivered to the Commissioners a policy of insurance against damage by fire to the property of the Commissioners whether caused by the ignition of such cargo or the ignition and consequent damage of such property due or contributed to by leakage from any portion of such cargo in course of being shipped or unshipped.

The policy shall be that of a company and for a period and an amount approved by the Commissioners.

Regulation' No. 75.—After the word "master" the words "owner or agent" are hereby added and for the word "his" in the same Regulation the word "such" is hereby substituted.

Regulation No. 96.—For the word "quayage" whenever occurring the word "tonnage" is hereby substituted.

Regulation No. 286.—For the word "quayage" heading this and other Regulations under the same heading the words "tonnage rates" are hereby substituted.

Regulation No. 286—The First Schedule.—The quayage rates specified and particularized in the First Schedule to the Regulations being the Schedule referred to in Regulation 286 are hereby revoked and in lieu thereof and under the designation of tonnage rates there shall be paid to the Commissioners by the master owner or agent of a vessel berthed at or moored either directly or indirectly to a wharf such of the rates specified in Parts A and B of the First Schedule hereunder as may be applicable to the same vessel and the said First Schedule shall be the First Schedule referred to in the said Regulation No. 286 and everything contained in the said Regulation No. 286 and everything contained in the said First Schedule hercunder shall be deemed to be part of the said Regulation 286.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE. TONNAGE RATES.

Part A.—Excluding Vesscls included under Part B.
A rate of one-eighth of a penny per ton gross tonnage for every six hours or fraction of six hours.
Vessels plying solely between ports of the Commonwealth—One-half of the above stated rate.

Regulation No. 289.—For the words "net register" the word "gross" is hereby substituted and the like alteration is made in the marginal note to same Regulation.

Regulations 290, 291, and 292 are hereby revoked and the said Commissioners make the following Regulations in lieu thereof or in addition thereto, viz.:--

Rates for Special Berths and Sheds Apparatus and other Conveniences.

290.—(a) The Commissioners may from time to time and for such time as may appear desirable set apart and appropriate any wharf or wharfs or portion or portions thereof for the use of any steam or other vessels or class of vessels or for the use of any such engaged in particular trades and may impose conditions subject to which such wharf or wharfs or portion or portions thereof may be occupied. thereof may be occupied.

Each berth at a wharf or portion thereof so appropriated shall be called a special berth.

No such appropriation shall preclude the berthing by the Commissioners of any vessel at a special berth.

Unless otherwise agreed upon the charge for the use of a special berth shall be at the rate of 3s. per 100 feet in length of the berth for every six hours or fraction of six hours during which the berth may be used by a vessel of the class or character or engaged in a particular trade for which the wharf or portion thereof shall have been appropriated.

The minimum amount charged to be not less than the charge for one day.

(b) The Commissioners may also from time to time and for such time as may appear desirable make reasonable charges for the use of any sheds apparatus or other conveniences which may be provided upon any wharf in connexion with special or other berths.

(c) The charges imposed under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid to the Commissioners by the master owner or agent of the vessel berthed and shall be in addition to any other charge rate or penalty which may be payable or incurred in respect of the same vessel.

Power to Accept Commuted Annual or other Sums in Lieu of Rates.

291.—The Commissioners for the purpose of facilitating trade or for the convenience of themselves or of any person liable to pay the same may by agreement in writing accept in lieu of the rates which may be imposed under Regulations 286 and 290 for the use of any wharf or place or mooring or sheds apparatus or other conveniences thereon or thereat a gross sum or annual or other periodical payment and every such sum or payment so agreed upon shall be paid as the Commissioners may determine but always in advance.

Regulation Nos. 293 and 294. The Commissioners

Venereal Diseases Act 1916. REGULATIONS RELATING TO VENEREAL DISEASES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of May, 1917.

NDER the powers conferred by the Venercal Diseases Act 1916, No. 2858, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following: (that is to say)*:—

SHORT TITLE

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Venereal Diseases Regulations, 1917," and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1917.

SPECIFIED DRUGS WHICH MAY BE SOLD BY A PHARMACEU-TICAL CHEMIST ONLY WHEN PRESCRIBED BY A MEDICAL PRACTITIONER.

- 2. No pharmaceutical chemist shall sell or supply any of the drugs or medicines described in the list following except on the prescription of a medical practitioner nor unless such prescription is dated and bears the address and usual signature (including the surname) of such practitioner :-
 - (a) Any patent or proprietary medicine which is specifically recommended for the cure, alleviation or treatment of any venereal disease or diseases.
 - (b) Kharsivan or any similar synthetic organie arsenic compound.

(c) Argyrol or any similar synthetic organic silver compound.

- (d) Grey oil or any similar mercurial emulsion specifically prepared for the cure, alleviation or treatment of any venereal disease or
- (c) Hydragyrum cum creta (or its admixtures), biniodide of mercury, tannate of mercury and cyanide of mercury in pill or tablet form.

 (f) Sandal-wood oil or its derivatives, copaiba or its derivatives, in the form of emulsions or capsules.
- (g) Methylene Blue in the form of pills, tablets or capsules.

 (h) Any medicated bougie.
 (i) Gonococcus vaccines a rhœal phylacogen. and serums and gonor-

PRESCRIBED PERIODS OF ATTENDANCE.

- 3. (1) Every person suffering from venereal disease or suspecting that he is so suffering shall (until he has received a certificate of cure or of being free from venereal disease) personally attend or cause himself to be attended by a medical practitioner or personally attend at a hospital or other prescribed place for the purposes of treatment and advice at such periods as are hereunder prescribed and shall follow the advice given by such medical practitioner or by a medical practitioner at such hospital or place. such hospital or place.
 - (2) (a) In the case of Syphilis the patient shall attend at least once in every two weeks during the continuance of primary or secondary symptoms and thereafter at least once every month.
 - (b) In the case of Gonorrhosa the patient shall attend at least once in every seven days during the continuance of acute symptoms and thereafter at least once every fourteen days.
 (c) In the case of Soft Chancre the patient shall
 - attend at least once in every seven days.

PRESCRIBING NOTICES, DIRECTIONS AND INFORMATION TO BE GIVEN TO PERSONS SUFFERING FROM VENEREAL DISEASE.

- 4. (1) Every medical practitioner who attends treats or advises any person suffering from any venereal disease shall—
 - (a) Deliver to such person a warning notice as here-under set forth:—

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT. VENEREAL DISEASES ACT 1916.

Warning Notice. You are suffering from a venereal disease. Venereal diseases are infectious. If you infect any person or do or permit or suffer any act likely to lead to the infection of any other person you are liable to a fine of £100 and to imprisonment for 12 months.

You are warned not to marry until certified

as cured.

(b) Give such person the booklet issued by the Public Health Department entitled—

VENEREAL DISEASES.

Information relating to Venereal Diseases, Duties of Patients and directions to Parents and Guardians.

(2) Every medical practitioner who attends, treats (2) Every medical practitioner who attends, treats or gives advice with respect to a child suffering from any venereal disease shall give to the parent or guardian or other person in charge of such child the booklet mentioned in clause (1)(b) above, and shall direct the attention of such parent or guardian or other person to that part of the booklet headed—Directions to Parents and Guardians.

CERTIFICATE OF CURE OF VENEREAL DISEASE OR OF HAVING CEASED TO BE LIABLE TO CONVEY INFECTION.

- 5. (1) In the case of Syphilis no certificate of cure shall be given unless-

 - (a) Three years shall have clapsed from the first appearance of the primary manifestation and
 (b) The patient shall have undergone treatment for a period of at least twelve months to the satisfaction of the medical practitioner in attendance and
 - here shall have been no manifestation of Syphilis since the completion of the last course of treatment provided that a period of at least three months has elapsed since same and
 - sample of the patient's blood taken at least 48 hours after an injection of Salvarsan or an 48 hours after an injection of Salvarsan or an efficient substitute therefor shall have given a negative Wassermann's reaction when examined by a person approved by the Minister for the purpose. Provided that in the case where it is elinically inexpedient to use Salvarsan or its substitutes Wassermann's test shall be negative on two occasions separated by at least one month.

 (2) No certificate of having ceased to be liable to convey syphilitic infection shall be given unless the conditions of clause (1) above have been satisfied; provided that a certificate may be given if two years shall have elapsed from the first appearance of the primary manifestation and the other conditions specified in such clause have been satisfact or if three years have elapsed with two years of satisfactory intermittent treatment even though the Wassermann reaction remain positive.

 (3) In the case of Gonorrhæa no certificate of cure shall be given unless—

 (a) All signs of inflammation shall have been absent

(a) All signs of inflammation shall have been absent

- (a) All signs of inflammation shall have been absent for at least one month and
 (b) Microscopic examination by a person approved by the Minister for the purpose shall have failed to detect the presence of Gram negative diplococci resembling those of Gonorrhoes, such examination to include at least two specimens taken at intervals of at least one
- (4) No certificate of having ceased to be liable to convey gonorrhoal infection shall be given unless the conditions concerning a certificate of cure have been satisfied.

(5) In the case of Soft Chancre no certificate of cure or

(5) In the case of Soft Chancre no certificate of cure or of having ceased to be liable to convey infection shall be given until the lesions have entirely healed.
(6) No certificate of cure of venereal disease or of having ceased to be liable to convey infection shall be given to any woman who is known to be a prostitute or who occupies visits or resides at any house known to be used for the purposes of or in relation to prostitution.
(7) No person shall use any certificate of cure of venereal disease or of having ceased to be liable to convey infection for the purposes of or in relation to prostitution.

(8) The certificate of cure of venereal disease or of having ceased to be liable to convey infection shall be as prescribed in Form D.

CERTIFICATE OF FREEDOM FROM VENEREAL DISEASE,

6. (1) No certificate of freedom from veneral disease shall be given to any woman who is known to be a prostitute or who occupies visits or resides at any house known to be used for the purposes of or in relation to prostitution. prostitution.

(2) No person shall use any such certificate for the purposes of or in relation to prostitution.
(3) No certificate of freedom from venereal disease

shall be given to any person who is known to have suf-fered from any such disease.

(4) The certificate shall be as prescribed in Form E.

PRESCRIBING PERSONS TO APPREHEND.

7. The persons to whom a warrant of apprehension may be directed by a police magistrate for execution in pursuance of the provisions of section thirteen are:—

(a) Any person authorized for the purpose in writing By the Minister; or
 (b) any member of the police force authorized for the purpose in writing by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

PRESCRIBING PERIODS OF DETENTION FOR EXAMINATION.

8. No person who has been apprehended under the provisions of section thirteen shall be detained for a longer period than is necessary for the purpose of ascertaining whether such person is suffering from any venereal disease and in no case shall the detention exceed four reads. ceed four weeks.

MAXIMUM FEE CHARGEABLE FOR CERTIFICATE.

9. The fee chargeable by any medical practitioner for issuing to any person any certificate of cure of or freedom from venereal disease or of having ceased to be I liable to convey infection shall not exceed the sum of Ten shillings and sixpence.

FEES PAYABLE TO MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS FOR NOTIFICATION TO THE MEDICAL INSPECTOR.

- 10. The fees payable to medical practitioners for notices sent or given to the Medical Inspector pursuant to the provisions of sections eight and nine shall be as

 - (a) For every case which occurs in his own private practice Two shillings and
 (b) for every case which occurs in his practice as medical officer of any public institution or of any prescribed, proclaimed, or established hospital or place One shilling: provided that such medical officer is not receiving any remuneration from the State.

RETURN OF CASES OF VENEREAL DISEASE.

11. Every medical practitioner shall forward to the Medical Inspector on or before the 31st January of each year a return of the number of cases of venereal disease treated by him and the number of cases cured during the preceding calendar year and such return shall be as prescribed in Form L.

PREVENTION OF INFECTION.

- 12. (1) No person suffering from venereal disease shall carry deliver manufacture prepare or otherwise handle any food intended for consumption by any other person.
- (2) Every person suffering from venereal disease shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent spread of infection by medium of towels soiled underclothing baths culinary utensils and closet seats and shall carry out the directions and instructions of the medical attendant.
- (3) Every person, in charge of a child suffering from venereal disease, shall-
 - (a) provide a separate bed for the said child and (b) provide separate towels and other toilet requi-
 - sites and (c) wash the said child in a separate bath and
 - (d) disinfect all soiled clothing by boiling or other effective means and
 - (e) prevent the said child from coming into contact with other children and
 - (f) carry out the directions and instructions of the medical attendant.

PENALTIES.

13. Any person contravening any provision of the Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Poisons Act 1915, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following, such of which as apply to Part I. of the aforesaid Act, having been recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria:—

PRELIMINARY.

- 1. Short Title and Commencement.—These Regulations may be cited as the "Poisons Regulations 1917" and shall come into operation on the first day of June 1917 on which date the Regulations made under the Poisons Act 1896 and any Act amending the same shall be and the same are hereby rescinded.
- 2. Division.—These Regulations are divided into Parts and Divisions as follows:—

Part I .-Regulations under Part I. of the Act made on the recommenda-tion of the Pharmacy Board.

Division (1)—
Certification of persons as dealers in poisons at places at least 4 miles distant from chemist shop.

Division (2)—

Keeping dispensing and selling poisons.

Part II.—Articles and sales exempted from operation of provisions of Division (1) of Part I. of Act. Part III.—Inspection by member of Police Force of books &c. required under provisions of Part I. of Act to be preserved.

- 3. Interpretation.—In the construction of these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subjectmatter-
 - "Act" means the Poisons Act 1915.
 "Board" means the Pharmacy Board of Victoria.

Division (1)—Certification of Persons as Dealers in Poisons at Places at least Four Miles distant from Chemist Shop.

- 4. Applications for Certificates.—Any person in a place distant at least four miles by the nearest practicable road from any place in which a registered pharmaceutical chemist has an open shop desiring to obtain a certificate as a dealer in poisons under the provisions of section of the Act shall make application to the Board in the form or to the effect of the one in the First Schedule hereto. hereto.
- 5. Issue of Certificates.—The Board upon receipt of such application with the necessary certificates in the form or to the effect of the one in the Second Schedule heroto and upon payment of the sum of Twenty shillings the first year's fee may if it thinks fit issue a certificate to the applicant as a dealer in poisons.
- 6. Currency of Certificate.—Such certificate shall continue in force until the 31st day of December next ensuing the date thereof and if the conditions remain unaltered thenceforward so long as payment is made annually to the Registrar of the Board for each and every succeeding year a fee of Twenty shillings unless the Governor in Council under the power in that behalf conterred by section 6 of the Act directs in the meantime the cancellation of the same.
- 7. On Payment of Annual Fee receipt issued to be deemed a Beneval.—The Registrar upon payment to him of the prescribed fee shall give a printed receipt for the same and also state on such receipt the date of payment and the period for which such fee is paid. Such receipt in respect of a payment other than the first shall be deemed to be a renewal of the certificate for the period set out.
- 8. Board authorized to permit another to exercise control when holder of Certificate Absent or Ill.—In the event of a holder of a certificate as a dealer in poisons becoming incapacitated by absence or illness from attending to the sale of poisons the Board may authorize some fit and proper person to act as a substitute for such substitute of a certificate under such circumstances and such substitute shall for all purposes in connexion with the

sale and custody of poisons be deemed to be the holder of a certificate and be personally responsible while he is so acting.

- ision (2).—Keeping, Dispensing, and Selling of Poisons.—Character and Control of Cupboard in which Certificated Dealers are required to keep Division
- 9. The Poison Cupboard.—The cupboard in which by the Act poisons are required to be kept by the holder of a certificate as a dealer in poisons shall be substantially made and provided with a sufficient lock and key; such cupboard shall be of not less dimensions than two feet six inches wide, one foot six inches deep, and three feet high, and shall be fitted inside with sufficient shelves and divisions to keep each description of poison therein contained in a separate division. Such cupboard shall have the word "Poison" conspicuously painted or written thereon.
- 10. Custody of Key of Poison Cupboard and Dutics of Dealer in respect of control of Poisons.—Every holder of a certificate as a dealer in poisons shall keep the key of the poison cupboard aforesaid in his own possession and he shall not permit such cupboard to remain open or unlocked or to be opened by any person except himself; nor shall he authorize or permit any person to haudle or sell for him the poisons therein contained; he shall not delegate or intrust any duty, task, or obligation imposed by the Act in connexion with the custody and sale of poisons to any other person under any pretence whatever but shall perform such duty task or obligation himself.

General Provisions.

- 11. Labelling and Marking Vessels, &c.—In the keeping of poisons each bottle vessel box or package containing a poison shall be labelled with the name of the article and also with some distinctive mark indicating that it contains poison.
- 12. System to be adopted in keeping Poisons.—In the keeping of poisons each poison shall be kept on one or other of the following systems, viz.:—
 - (a) In a bottle or vessel tied over, capped, locked, or otherwise secured in a manner different from that in which bottles or vessels contain-

irom that in which bottles or vessels containing ordinary articles are secured in the same warehouse shop or dispensary or

(b) In a bottle or vessel rendered distinguishable by touch from the bottles or vessels in which ordinary articles are kept in the same warehouse shop or dispensary or

(c) In a bottle vessel box or package kept in a room or cupboard set apart for dangerous articles.

13. Bottles of certain Colours to be used on Sale

13. Bottles of certain Colours to be used on Sale by retail of Liniments, &c.—No person shall sell or offer for sale by retail any liniment embrocation lotion or liquid disinfectant consisting of or containing poison unless the same is put up and offered for sale in a glass bottle of dark blue green or amber colour complying with the following specifications, that is to say:—

Shape of Bottles.—The bottle may be of round or square shape or may have four six or eight sides provided that in each case it is rendered distinguishable by touch from the ordinary smooth bottles commonly used for the dispensing of medicines for internal use or ordinarily used as containers for any food drink or condiment and such bottle has blown on it in addition to the words "Not to be taken" or "Not to be taken internally" prominent points or ribs of sufficient number to render it distinguishable by touch from ordinary smooth medicine bottles or other vessels or bottles ordinarily used as containers for any food drink or condiment.

Disinfectants may be Sold in Tins of certain Shapes.—
In the east of liquid disinfectants consisting of or containing poison such disinfectants may be sold or offered for sale in tins or cans having four sides on one of which sides the words "Not to be taken" are embossed thereon or are painted or branded distinctly in red letters.

- 14. Certain Poisons to be Sold only in Bottles according to Regulation 15.—The following poisons namely:— Arsenic, strychnine, tartar emetic, and corrosive sublimate, shall only be sold or delivered in bottles rendered distinguishable by touch as prescribed in Regulation 13.
- ansunguisname by touch as prescribed in Regulation 13.

 15. Poisons kept by others than Pharmaceutical Chemists to be retained in Original Package.—The owner or person other than a registered pharmaceutical chemist in charge of any poison or poisonous substance or preparation within the meaning of the Act shall not leave the same in any place except in the original jar, bottle, box, can, tin, tube, or package in which the same was sold duly labelled as prescribed by the Act or Regulations.

- 16. Labels on Drugs sold in quantity containing more than one Dose to particularize Dose, &c.—When any drug consisting of or containing any poison is delivered (whether in pursuance of a sale or otherwise) in a quantity exceeding a single dose the bottle or other vessel wrapper or cover box or case immediately containing such drug shall be labelled distinctly with the name of such drug and on such label there shall be legibly written or printed the word "Caution" and the amount of the dose to be taken.
- 17. Delivery of Hypnotics, &c.-The following poisons,

Choral hydrate and solutions and preparations thereof;
Cocaine and its salts and all preparations;
Heroin and its salts;
Morphine and its salts;

Paraldehyde;

Veronal, proponal, medinal, tetronal, trional, dor-minol, sulphonal, and all other synthetic hyp-notic substances;

shall not be delivered (whether in pursuance of a sale or otherwise) except on the written prescription or order of a duly qualified medical practitioner.

order of a duly qualified medical practitioner.

The provisions of the above Regulation shall not apply to the sale or delivery of liniments, ointments, or other preparations which are prepared for external use only, or any of the enumerated poisons used as ingredients in veterinary medicines provided that such liniments ointments preparations or medicines are delivered (in pursuance of a sale or otherwise) in good faith and not in evasions or attempted evasions of these Regulations or to the sale or delivery of any of the poisons mentioned in this Regulation to registered dentists or to persons whose names have been recorded by the Dental Board of Victoria under the provisions of the Medical Act 1915 or any Act thereby repealed in the ordinary course of their business and upon the delivery of a written order to the seller signed by the person requiring such poison.

- 18. Labelling.-Medicinal preparations for internal use containing poisons within the meaning of Part II. of the Second Schedule to the Poisons Act 1915 (in addition to any other label required by the Act) shall have the following label printed in red on the bottle vessel or cover box immediately containing the same, viz.:—
 - "This preparation is labelled 'poison' in conformity with the Poisons Act but if taken in accordance with the prescribed doses it is not dangerous."
- 19. Person in Charge of Poison.—Any person being the owner or other person in charge or possession of any poison who carelessly leaves it in any place easily accessible to others shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations. "Easily accessible" means leaving it in any place where articles of food or drink are usually kept or on any mantelpiece window ledge shelf or similar place to which access may be easily obtained.

PART II.

Articles and Sales exempted from operation of Division 1 of Part I. of Act.

- 20. Keeping, &c., of Poisons referred to in Section 16 of Act.—In the case of poisons and poisoned material referred to in and subject to the provisions of section 16 of the Act the following conditions and requirements in addition to those prescribed by the Act shall be complied
 - (a) All such poisons and poisoned material shall be kept in a separate drawer or closed receptacle apart from other goods.
 - (b) In case the tenement at which any such poisons or poisoned material are kept be used for the storage preparation or sale of food for human consumption such poisons or poisoned material shall not be kept on the portion of the same used for any such purpose.
 - (c) Liquid preparations shall be sold only in bottles tins drums or casks of sufficient strength to bear the ordinary risk of transit without leak-
 - (d) Solid preparations shall be securely packed in such a manner as to avoid as far as possible the risk of breaking or leakage during or from transport and the package shall have indelibly printed marked or branded in easily legible characters in a conspicuous position notice that it must not be used for any other purpose than that for which it is intended.
- 21. Penalty.—A person guilty of a contravention of any of the provisions of the last preceding Regulation shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding

22. The non-application of the provisions of Part I. and Part II. of the Act to the sale under section 18 of any proprietary preparation for use as sheep dips or for agricultural or horticultural purposes shall be subject to the observance of the conditions and requirements in the last but one preceding Regulation contained and to the following further conditions or requirements:—

(a) Such preparation shall not be sold except in an enclosed vessel or receptacle as received from the manufacturer.

(b) No such preparation shall be sold upon the same premises as articles of food for human consumption unless the local police are satisfied that convenient arrangements for their sale cannot otherwise be made and in that case they must be sold at a separate counter.

(For the purposes of this Regulation a part of a counter which is shown to the satisfaction of the local police to be adequately separated from the rest of the counter shall be treated as a separate counter).

(c) All premises from or on which any person sells offers for sale or keeps open shop for the sale of such preparations shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by officers appointed by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria.

23. Requirements Additional to those Prescribed by Section 20 of Act in case of Substances Specified in Fourth Schedule to Act Sold by Retail.—In the case of any substance or preparation specified in or added to the Fourth Schedule to the Act the person selling the same by retail shall observe the requirements prescribed in sub-clauses (c) and (d) of Regulation No. 20 and in sub-clause (b) of the preceding Regulation (22) as well as the following:—

- (a) The bottle or other vessel wrapper or cover box or case immediately containing any poisonous substance or preparation shall be delivered by the seller to the purchaser securely sealed and feathand. fastened.
- fastened.

 (b) If the substance be sold in liquid form it shall be delivered only in bottles of round or diamond shape on which the words "Poisonous—not to be taken" are blown together with prominent points or ribs in such a manner as to render the bottle distinguishable to the touch from bottles or vessels ordinarily used as containers for any food drink or condiments or for medicines for internal use or in tins or cans having four sides on one of which sides the words "Poisonous—not to be taken" are painted or branded distinctly in red letters; or in earthenware jars or vessels on which the words "Poisonous—not to be taken" in red letters are distinctly branded or painted or burnt in.

PART III.

Inspection by Members of Police Force of Books, &c., required to be Kept or Preserved under the Provisions of Part I. of Act.

24. Poison Books to be Open for Inspection by Members of Police Force.—Every person who sells poison whether under colour of a certificate of the Board issued under the authority of the Act or by reason of his being otherwise lawfully qualified in respect of all books entries and letters by any section of Division (I) of the Act required to be kept or preserved by him shall at all reasonable times when so required by any member of the Police Force permit such member to inspect the same and to make copies of or take extracts from such books entries or letters or any of them. entries or letters or any of them.

26. Penalty.—A person guilty of a contravention of any provision of the last preceding Regulation shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten

RE-SUBDIVISION OF THE SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

In pursuance of the provisions contained in the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686), sections 16 and 35. His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepavers whose names are on the municipal roll of the shire of Moorabbin (notice of which was published in the Government Gazette of the fourth day of April, 1917), doth hereby order and direct that the said shire be re-subdivided into four (4) separate ridings, to be named the North Riding, the Moorabbin Riding, the Cheltenham Riding, and the South Riding, the several proposed boundaries of which are set forth and described in the Schedule hereto:—

SCHEDILE

North Riding.

Commencing on the western boundary of the shire at Commencing on the western boundary of the shire at the intersection of South-road and Point Nepean-road, in the parish of Moorabbin; thence north-westerly by Point Nepean-road to Thomas-street; thence north by Thomas-street to North or Warrein road; thence east by that road to Warrigal-road; thence south by Warrigal-road to the southern boundary of Crown portion 58, parish of Moorabbin; thence west by that boundary and South-road aforesaid to the commencing point.

Moorabbin 'Riding.
