WEARING OF BADGES.

THE subjoined despatch, dated the 17th October, 1917, and its enclosures, relating to the manner in which various badges shall be worn in future, and how the cost of certain necessary alterations may be defrayed, have been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and are published by direction of His Excellency the Governor, for general information.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you copies of a notification, dated 1st June last, issued from the Central Chancery of the Orders of Knighthood, prescribing the manner in which the badge of the Third Class or Companions of the Orders of the Bath, the Star of India, Saint Michael and Saint George, and the Indian Empire shall in the future be worn, and of a further notification, dated 10th August, with regard to the manner in which the cost of the necessary alterations in the Badges of Companions may be defrayed.

2. I have to explain that, as indicated in the first of these notices, the change is due to His Majesty's decision that henceforward the grade of Companion in these four Orders should rank as senior to that of Commander in other Orders which are later in date. The effect is to place the rank of Commander of the Royal Victorian Order lower than that of the Companionships in question. His Majesty's commands, so far as they affect Companions of the Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, which may be of more particular interest in the majority of the oversea Dominions, have been embodied in a new statute of the Order, dated 1st June, 1917.

3. I think it may be useful to explain certain points arising out of His Majesty's recent decision for the guidance of those who hold the dignities affected by it—

- (a) The new rule will apply to all Companions of the Orders and a period of grace will enable Companions residing in distant parts of the Empire to have the necessary alterations of their badges made. The length of the period will not be prescribed.
- (b) The new riband to be worn will be of the breadth prescribed by the existing statutes of the Order (one inch and a half).
- (c) (i) The Knight Commander of an Order who is also a Companion of a Senior Order, will, of course, treat the badge of the Order of which he is a Knight Commander as senior for all purposes.
- (ii) A Companion or Commander of more than one of the Orders affected will wear the badge of the senior Order just below the collar of the tunic or uniform coat, the other badges being worn one below the other, suspended on riband which emerges from between the buttons of the coat.

(iii) With evening dress the badge of the senior Order will be worn under the white tie, the others, in miniature, on the lapel of the coat.

(d) When a Companion is in service dress the riband of the Order will be worn on the left breast, as heretofore.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Rating By-law:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Thirty-five shillings.
2. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound.
3. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.
4. For every water trough, a charge of Seventeen shillings and sixpence.
5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Seventeen shillings and sixpence for every horse-power of such boiler.
6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of One shilling and ninepence, to be paid on delivery.
7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling and ninepence for every thousand gallons.
8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be:—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling and ninepence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1918.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate and charges.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply or of this By-law or any By-law of the Trust.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

4. No person shall lay down a pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes at Twenty pounds (£20), or under; and

(b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Nine o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or before the hour of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public water service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. Every person upon whose premises a water-trough stands shall keep such trough provided with a ball tap, and shall keep such water-trough and ball tap at all times in a state of thorough repair. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation, wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, or at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under clause seven (7) hereof. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or non-feasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the

Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under the Water Acts, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply.

14. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this By-law; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supply by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

15. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

16. The By-law made by the Trust on the twenty-first day of November, 1916, relating to water supply is hereby repealed.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1918.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece or land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece or land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall not be less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1918 of the property so supplied.

6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1918. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 5.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Maffra Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1918 in respect of the water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust:—

2. For every house or tenement of an annual value of £14 or over at the rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound 1s. 9d. of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of a less annual value than £14, a minimum charge of £1 5s.

4. For every vacant allotment of land of an annual value of £5 or under, a charge of 5s. For each additional allotment of land rated together with the first allotment, 1s., where the annual value of the allotment is over £5, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the annual value thereof.

5. For every water trough supplied with water, £1. On vacant lands the rate of payment shall be considered as part payment of this charge of £1.

6. For water supplied by measure 2s. for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate, except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements. Where the occupier quits without paying for excess water the owner will be held liable for same.

7. For using a hose for stable watering during the year, 10s. This payment will entitle the user to an additional 5,000 gallons of water.

8. For water supplied to new buildings being erected £1 per cent. on the contract price of all brick, stone, cement or other work where water is used. Minimum charge of Ten shillings.

9. Water supplied to manufactories, railways, livery stables, gardens or paddocks, or for other than domestic purposes, may be charged at a special rate, or by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust.

10. The Trust may by notice, in writing, require any owner or occupier using water through a hose for other than domestic purposes, to provide a meter within two weeks from the date of such notice; the expense of providing the meter is to be borne by such owner or occupier.

11. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be re-connected with the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of 9 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

12. For water supplied through any stand-pipe or hydrant, for each 200 gallons 1s. (One shilling).

13. For all lands and tenements in the said District situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and in which tenements are not supplied with water from such pipes, and being within one quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe or hydrant for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one quarter of a mile and less than half a mile from such stand-pipe or hydrant, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

14. For every plumber's licence £1 per year ending 31st December.

15. The foregoing rates and charges are payable in two moieties in advance on the 1st day of February, 1918, and 1st August, 1918. Interest at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum will be charged on all amounts six months overdue. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum in advance on the 1st of February, 1918. Such persons as the Commissioners may appoint shall be authorized to collect the said rates and charges.

A By-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Shire of Chiltern.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts Nos. 2747 and 2852, make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Chiltern, such rates to come into operation for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1918, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1918. And the said rate shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, viz., on the first day of January, 1918, and the first day of July, 1918.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of £10 and under—Ten per centum per annum on the amount of the 1915 valuation.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual value of £10, and not exceeding £20—One pound per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £30—One pound five shillings per annum.

4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £30, and not exceeding £40—One pound ten shillings per annum.

5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £40, and not exceeding £50—One pound fifteen shillings per annum.

6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £50, and not exceeding £60—Two pounds per annum.

7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £60, and not exceeding £80—Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £80, and not exceeding £100—Three pounds per annum.

9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £100, and not exceeding £150—Four pounds per annum.

10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £150, and not exceeding £250—Five pounds per annum.

11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £250—Six pounds per annum.

12. Water from the stand-pipe and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—

A licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes—One pound per annum.

A licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only—Ten shillings per annum.

A licence to carry away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray—Five shillings per annum.

13. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.

14. Water troughs—Five shillings per annum.

15. Livery stables—Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

16. Hotel with stabling (not being a livery stable)—Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

Part 1.—Written Examination.

Forest mensuration, including problems on surfaces, computation of the contents of trees, logs, beams, &c., in the round or square, dams, tanks, channels, excavations, and simple drainage.

The running of lines by prismatic compass and simple levelling.

Estimates in yield of areas of standing eucalypt forest, as well as conifers in plantations.

Bookkeeping.—By single entry, day book, or journal and cash book, including ordinary timber accounts, and the records and statements of forest revenue and expenditure.

English.—Report, precis, and business letter writing. Technical essay on selected indigenous trees, including botanical characteristics, diseases, and parasites, &c.

Geography.—The geography of Victoria, particularly in regard to forest areas, and the elementary geology of Victoria from the same standpoint.

Forest Law.—A good knowledge of the chief provisions of the forest law of Victoria and regulations thereunder.

Part 2.—Oral Examination.

The recognition of specimens of the commoner indigenous and exotic forest trees growing in Victoria, practical forest nursery and plantation work in all its branches, forest management and control, including forest working plans, the treatment and eradication of insect and fungus pests in forests and plantations, fire protection, timber utilization and preparation for market, including proper methods of seasoning. Knowledge of common defects of timber. Knowledge of soils and situations suitable for the commercial growth of indigenous hardwoods, and exotic forest trees in Victoria.

The persons eligible to present themselves for such examination shall be all officers classified as Assistant Foresters on the Permanent Staff of the Forests Department. All candidates must produce a certificate that they have rendered efficient service to the Department.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A CRICKET GROUND AT QUEENSTOWN.

WE, Otto John Müller, James Clark, Charles Hermann Steinmann, John Walter Dugdale, and Richard John, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Cricket Ground at Queenstown, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Lands Act 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort, in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money, deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
14. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending

PENALTY.

The penalty for any breach of this by-law shall not exceed Twenty pounds. The minimum shall be Five shillings.

REGULATION No. 4 FOR THE REGULATION OF BATHING FROM THE AREA KNOWN AS THE FORESHORE RESERVE, WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

A Regulation of the Borough of Portland, numbered No. 4, made under section 1 of Part IX. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the borough of Portland, by virtue of a By-law of the above-named borough, numbered 31, for the Regulation of Bathing within the said Borough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portland make the following Regulation which shall apply and have operation throughout the area known as the Foreshore Reserve, being a site for public purposes within the municipality of the borough of Portland reserved by Order of the Governor in Council made the 6th day of March, 1917, and described and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th day of March, 1917, which Reserve is on the foreshore of

Portland Bay; and also to within 300 yards seawards of the boundary of the said Reserve and of the said borough:—

1. Regulation No. 3 is hereby repealed.

2. No male person shall bathe from or undress for the purpose of bathing, except within the areas set forth in Schedules 1 and 3 of this Regulation, which areas are specially set apart (1) for the bathing of males, and (3) for the bathing of both sexes.

3. No female person shall bathe from or undress for the purpose of bathing, excepting within the areas set forth in Schedules 2 and 3 of this Regulation, which areas are specially set apart (2) for the bathing of females, and (3) for the bathing of both sexes.

4. No person shall bathe from or undress for the purpose of bathing in any portion of the Foreshore Reserve included in the areas as described in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, and 3 hereto after 10 a.m. nor before 7 p.m. on Sundays.

5. The provisions of Regulations 2, 3, and 4 above shall not apply to children of the age of 12 years or under.

6. No person shall bathe unless dressed in a Canadian bathing costume with kilt, which shall effectually cover the body from the neck to the knee, so as to observe proper decency, such costume to be similar to the sample on view at the Town Hall, Portland.

No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on or run along the beach or foreshore, but shall proceed in a direct line to and from the dressing place.

No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

Schedule No. 1.

The area set apart for the bathing of males shall be that part of the seashore lying eastward from a line drawn from the north-west corner of allot. 1 of section 29, town and parish of Portland, to the end of the deepwater pier and between such line and a line drawn parallel to and distant 50 feet westward from the stone retaining wall of the boat harbor lands.

Schedule No. 2.

The area set apart for the bathing of females shall be that portion of the foreshore lying between the old baths and a line of posts 75 feet distant and parallel to the south side of the railway and steamboat pier.

Schedule No. 3.

The area set apart for the mixed bathing of both sexes shall be that portion of the foreshore lying between a line of posts erected near the old baths following the pipe track across the beach at that spot and continued along the west and north sides of the old baths enclosure, and the line defining the boundary reserved for the bathing of male persons as set forth in Schedule 1 hereto.

Schedule No. 4.

The area set apart for the bathing of children under 12 years of age of both sexes in addition to those described for the bathing of female persons and for mixed bathing shall be that portion of the foreshore included between the deepwater pier and approach thereto and a line marked with posts, being distant 75 yards north of the baths gangway and parallel thereto, and excluding therefrom the area enclosed with piling and known as the "new baths."

The areas described above in Schedules 1, 2, 3, and 4 shall include in each case that portion of the open sea enclosed by a production of the lines described respectively in each schedule seaward for a distance of 300 yards.

BOROUGH OF ST ARNAUD.

BY-LAW No. 54.

A BY-LAW of the Borough of St. Arnaud made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1903* for regulating the market place and the buildings, stalls, and pens therein, and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held.

In pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the St. Arnaud Corporation Cattle Market, and shall be held at the place and in the yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market, situate at the corner of Alma and Bowen streets, St. Arnaud, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle as defined by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

2. The said cattle market shall be open for the reception and delivery and sale of cattle on every lawful day until Seven o'clock p.m.

3. The Council may, on application, in writing, by the owner or occupier of any yard or premises within the Borough, which shall in the opinion of the Council be suitable and efficient as a place for the sale of cattle, license any such yard or premises for such time and upon such terms as the Council may think fit as a place for the sale of cattle, provided the Council shall have the same powers with regard to any such yard or premises as are hereby vested in them with regard to the Market, and no cattle shall be sold within the Borough unless in such yards or premises as have been so licensed by the Council.

4. The sum of Two shillings and sixpence per annum shall be the amount to be paid for such yard or premises so licensed, and shall be paid by the person applying for such licence before the same is granted.

5. That the following tolls, dues, and sums of money be demanded, received, and had by the said Council from every auctioneer who shall at any time use the said Cattle Market or any licensed yards or premises within the Borough for all cattle sold therein, that is to say:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, ass or mule, One shilling.
For every mare with foal at foot sold as one lot, One shilling.

For every foal under twelve months, without dam, Sixpence.

For every fat cattle or working bullock, One shilling,

For every store cattle or springer, One shilling.

For every cow with calf sold as one lot, One shilling.

For every cattle under twelve months, Sixpence.

For every pig, One farthing.

For every sow with litter sold as one lot, Sixpence.

For every fat sheep or goat, Halfpenny.

For every store sheep, Halfpenny.

For every ewe with lamb at foot sold as one lot, Halfpenny.

For each and every special sale the sum of One pound for each firm of auctioneers per day.

6. Every auctioneer selling cattle within the market or any licensed yards or premises shall at the close of every month furnish to the Council a return showing the number of cattle sold by him during that month, and shall at the same time pay to the Council an amount reckoned according to the above scale of charges.

7. All cattle not removed from the said market by the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on the day next after any sale shall have been held in the said market shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in the market for sale, failing which the Council may do so at the expense of such person, or the said cattle may, if the Council think fit, be impounded at the expense and risk of the owner of such cattle.

8. No auctioneer shall sell or offer for sale any cattle within the said market without the written permission of the Council so to do first had and obtained, for which privilege each auctioneer shall pay a fee of One pound per annum, and no auctioneer shall charge more than 5 per cent. commission on any cattle sold within the market.

9. All cattle brought into the market for sale or otherwise shall be at the risk of the owner of such stock, and the Council shall not be liable for any damage sustained to such stock whilst within the said market.

10. By-law No. 53 of the Borough of St. Arnaud is hereby repealed.

11. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act, or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

12. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
