NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM PORTION OF THE BOLINDA OR EMU CREEK UNTIL 31ST AUGUST, 1920.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the portion of Bolinda or Emu Creek between the bridge on the Lancefield railway line, about one mile northwards of Lancefield Junction Railway Station, and the road-bridge at the eastern boundary of the Monegeetta pre-emptive right, parishes of Monegeetta and Kerrie, about two miles westerly from the Monegeetta North Railway Station, until 31st August, 1920.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DEFINE THE MOUTHS OF BOGGY, STONY, AND IRONSTONE CREEKS, LAKE TYERS, AND TO PROHIBIT NETTING ABOUT THE MOUTHS OF BOGGY AND STONY CREEKS.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation as follows:—

1. Defining the mouth of Boggy Creek as an imaginary line running between the two banks of such creek where it joins the Nowa Nowa arm of Lake Tyers at the old Nowa Nowa ford, about twenty (20) chains below or seaward from the railway bridge at Nowa Nowa, and fixing a distance of fifty-five (55) chains from such mouth of Boggy Creek within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used. (NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others boundary posts will be erected at the seaward or outward boundary of such closed area at the Nowa Nowa motor-boat landing.)

2. Defining the mouth of Stony Creek as an imaginary line running between the two banks of such creek at the bridge on the old South-Eastern road from Cunningham to Nowa Nowa where such creek joins the Toorloo arm of Lake Tyers and fixing a distance of twenty (20) chains from such mouth within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used. (NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others boundary posts will be erected on either side of Toorloo arm showing the outward or seaward boundary of such closed area.)

3. Defining the mouth of Ironstone Creek as an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where such creek joins the Nowa Nowa arm of Lake Tyers. (NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others boundary posts will be erected at the mouth of such creek.)

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO REVOKE THE PROCLAMATION WHICH INCREASED THE FEES FOR FISHING LICENCES AND BOAT REGISTRATIONS.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-fifth day of June, 1918, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the third day of July, 1918, which, by increasing the fees for Fishing Licences and Registrations of Boats, varied two Proclamations made previously under the Fisheries Acts.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 233.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

- (1) The mileage rates per ton for the carriage of wool, as prescribed in the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 230) on pages 118 and 119, and the rates per ton for the carriage of wool from Euston and the Darling River District shown on page 120, are hereby reduced by 5 per cent.
- (2) (a) The rates for the carriage of live stock by goods or mixed trains, as prescribed on pages 124 to 130 inclusive of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 230), are hereby reduced by 5 per cent.
- (b) The rates for the carriage of live stock by passenger trains, as prescribed on pages 101 and 102 of the Passenger Fares and Coaching Rates Book (By-law No. 228) are hereby reduced by 5 per cent.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the 12th day of August, 1918.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH.

BY-LAW No. 36.

A By-law of the shire of Tungamah made under section 38 of the Health Act 1915 and numbered 36 for the purpose of providing for the registration of cow-keepers dairymen or purveyors of milk and under the powers conferred by the Local Government Act for repealing the By-laws of the said shire numbered 24 and 26.

Registration of Cow-keepers, Etc.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915 and the Health Act 1915 the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Tungamah order as follows:—

1. That the By-laws of the said shire numbered 24 and 26 and the By-law passed 11th March, 1887 (wrongly numbered 13) be and the same are hereby repealed.
2. That every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper dairymen or purveyor of milk shall on or before the first day of March in every year register himself with the council and every such person shall with every application for registration pay a fee of the following amount that is to say—
If the person to be registered keeps cows—
For every cow a fee of Threepence with a minimum fee in each case of One shilling.
If the person to be registered does not keep cows or is the occupier of a creamery the fee shall be Ten shillings.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the council the sixth day of May, 1918, and confirmed the fourth day of June, 1918.

SHIRE OF TUNGAMAH.

BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the shire of Tungamah made under section 314 of the *Health Act* 1915 and of every other power in the said Act contained enabling the said shire in that behalf and numbered thirty-one (and for the purpose of repealing the previous By-laws of the said shire numbered 12 and 22 pursuant to the powers in that behalf contained in the *Local Government Act* 1915) for keeping free from noxious matter yards stables cow-sheds and other places of a like nature for regulating the management of earth closets and privies and the removal and final deposit of night-soil and offensive matter.

Sanitary Regulations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915 and the *Health Act* 1915 the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Tungamah order as follows:—

I. That the By-laws numbered 12 and 22 of the said shire be and the same are hereby repealed.

1. The occupier of every house and premises within the townships of Tungamah Cobram St. James Katamatite Lake Rowan and Yarroweyah shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health and shall cause all filth rubbish and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground and if at any time the occupier of any such house or premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth rubbish or refuse matter removed as aforesaid the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

2. The occupier of any land and premises situate in the said townships on which there shall be erected any stable cow-house cow-yard cattle shed or pigsty shall cause such land and premises to be kept in a state of cleanliness so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health and shall cause all soil dung or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such land and premises as often as the quantity of the same shall amount to one cubic yard and if at any time the occupier of such land and premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung soil or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same may be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier.

3. Every occupier of land or premises within the said townships shall construct or cause to be constructed a privy in the form of an earth closet which shall consist of a suitable privy building the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground and every such building shall be sufficiently and properly ventilated and shall be constructed so as to admit of a pan being placed and fitted beneath the seat in such manner as may effectually prevent the deposit elsewhere than in such pan of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat and such privy building shall be constructed and placed so as to afford proper means of access for the purpose of removing the pan. Every privy attached to any school hotel licensed public house factory work-room or common lodginghouse shall be flagged and paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination toward the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

4. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street lane or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

5. The occupier of such land and premises shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this by-law.

6. The council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed with the contents from the premises in the day time.

7. All night-soil and other offensive matter shall be removed to and deposited in such places only as may be appointed by the council for the final reception of the same and be trenced into friable earth in a layer not exceeding 6 inches thick and be covered over with at least 1 foot thickness of clean earth.

8. The occupier of every house or premises shall provide properly constructed galvanized iron closet pans properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight and with handles thereto and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet and shall keep the same in good and thorough repair.

9. Every occupier as aforesaid shall from time to time provide and keep in use in the closet or closets in use on such premises a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

10. The council shall have power in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person commit a breach of this by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

II. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following parts of the municipal district that is to say the townships of Tungamah Cobram St. James Katamatite Lake Rowan and Yarroweyah.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board, under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts, has (whether before or after the commencement of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*) by resolution declared a deviation to be a main road, the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such resolution, and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a main road or be discontinued as provided in the resolution: And whereas the said Board has by resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such resolution to be a main road, and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule of the said resolution, and that such part of the existing road shall be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby confirm the said resolution.

And the Honorable Arthur Robinson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.
Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring Road on Site taken for Deviation of a Main Road fit for Use.

Mines Act 1915.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of July, 1918.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Mines Act 1915*, doth hereby cancel the Order in Council of the 5th February, 1917, making Regulations for granting certificates to mining engine-drivers, and doth substitute therefor the following Regulations, that is to say:—

PRELIMINARY REQUIREMENTS.

1. Each applicant for a certificate of competency must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Mining Department, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, or postal notes to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of three classes, namely—First, second, and third.

A first class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 5 (b).

A second class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, except a winding engine, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 4 (b).

A third class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine, the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 3 (b).

3. An applicant for a third class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has, for not less than twelve months been assisting to drive engines used for mining purposes for not less than twelve hours per week.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen years, nor over the age of fifty years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

4. An applicant for a second class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has been the holder of a third class certificate under these Regulations, or a second class certificate under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in driving a third class mining engine or engines, such driving experience to have been for not less than twelve hours per week; or that he has assisted to drive a steam-engine the cylinder of which is more than twelve inches in diameter, or a

double-cylinder steam-engine the cylinders of which have a combined area equal to that of a single-cylinder of more than twelve inches in diameter for a period of twelve months, and for at least twelve hours per week; the examination to be equivalent to that undergone by a candidate for a first class factory certificate.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen years, nor over the age of fifty years; this latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

5. An applicant for a first class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has been the holder of a second class certificate under these Regulations, a first class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, an ordinary mining engine-driver's certificate issued in New South Wales, or a second class mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in assisting to drive both loose eccentric and link-motion winding engines, such experience to be for not less than twelve hours per week.

Where only one class of engine or any other class of winding gear has been driven, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of twenty-one years, nor over the age of fifty years. This latter age does not apply to persons who had experience in driving winding engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;
- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

Examinations.

6. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette*, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of examination.

7. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam and other engines, boilers, furnaces, winding and pumping gear, or any other machinery used for mining purposes.

8. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

9. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine or any engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

10. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine except a winding engine.

11. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

12. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* shall be

entitled to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter.

13. The holder of a third class certificate under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any second class engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

Copies of Certificates.

14. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the *Mines Act 1915*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the Schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out, and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

15. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

16. Every holder of a second or third class certificate under these Regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a higher class, and, in the event of the latter certificate being granted, the former shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

17. Any person holding a mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, or in New Zealand, and who takes up his residence in Victoria, may be granted a certificate of registration of equal grade to his certificate, upon payment of the fee prescribed by the following Schedule, and without undergoing any examination. This registration certificate shall entitle the holder to drive the same class or classes of engine that he had been qualified to take charge of under his certificate in the issuing State, or in New Zealand, and these particulars will be shown on the face of the registration certificate. He will also be subject to the provisions of section 434 of the *Mines Act 1915*, and section 35 of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915*.

18. Every candidate for a certificate of competency shall, upon presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration together with testimonials produced, to be retained by the Board.

MEAT (FRESHLY KILLED).

No subletting will be allowed; no delivery of Meat shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in the cutting up, preparation, or delivery of the Meat tendered for in this sub-schedule shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts to which such persons are subject as employees; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which Meat is prepared under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, or any breach of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act 1915* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS.

1.
