WARBURTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1.

THE Warburton Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called the Trust) in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts doth hereby make the By-law following for its district:—

- 1. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement shall be permitted and not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from one tapping except by special permission of the Trust in which case the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining tenements and be controlled by a separate stop-cock on each service outside the building line. building line.
- 2. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without the consent of the Trust nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence of and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust and shall before so doing give to the Trust three clear days' notice thereof.
- 3. No private service shall be extended except with the consent of the Trust.
- 4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust or alter or repair or extend or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes cocks or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work and any unlicensed person affixing altering repairing extending or in any manner interfering with such pipes service-pipes cocks or fittings as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.
- 5. Licences to affix and lay alter extend or repair servicepipes to tap mains and sub-mains and to do and execute
 generally the work necessary for laying on and maintaining
 water services may be granted to persons who shall satisfy
 the Trust of their competency to perform such plumbing and
 other work upon payment of an annual fee of One pound (£1).
 The Trust may cancel licences at any time.
- 6. A fee of Five shillings (5s.) shall be paid in advance by the owner to the turncock of the Trust for turning off the water for purpose of tapping mains or laying service-pipes or making repairs when it is necessary to turn the water off to effect such purpose.
- 7. All service-pipes laid in the ground on private property shall be laid at a depth of not less than ten (10) inches below the surface. The portions of the service-pipe laid along or across any public street lane or right-of-way or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic shall be laid not less than twenty-four (24) inches below the surface of the ground.
- 8. The size of each service pipe shall not exceed three-quarters (3) of an inch unless special permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the Trust and the supply be taken through a meter.

- 9. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cover shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line.
- 10. The quality of the materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:--
 - (1) The whole of the pipes tees bends &c. to be sound and free from all defects and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water two feet in height and if required by the Trust shall be tested.

 - shall be tested.

 (2) All such material shall be of new galvanized iron of good quality.

 (3) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form straight longitudinally and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

 (4) All ends of pipes bends &c. to be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles tees &c.
 - (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service pipes and mains to be high pressure and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship and of approved pattern to screw into elbows bends &c.

 (6) All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as

 - (6) All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
 (7) Ordinary connexions with cast-iron mains must be made with proper brass stop-cocks and founts to which a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. The weight of lead to be used per lineal yard will be ½ inch 6 lbs., ¾ inch 9 lbs.
 (8) The maximum taxaira that will be allowed.
 - (8) The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clips will be 3 inch.
- 11. No person shall use any stop or bib cock or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.
- 12. No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks made of hard brass or gunetal and in every respect of the best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.
- 13. All connexions between lead and iron pipes shall be made with brass union couplings.
- 14. All joints connecting lead pipes shall be wiped joints and in no case will bolt or copper bit joints be allowed on water service-pipes either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement on pain of cancellation of licence of the plumber who by himself or his workmen shall break these regulations.
- 15. No person whether licensed under the Trust or not shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

16. No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve and the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner open to inspection and in a position approved by the Trust.

17. No person shall construct or use any urinal or water-closet fitting not approved by the Trust nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet cistern or service-box fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap or otherwise than with the cistern of a urinal or water-closet. Urinals shall be provided with 2-gallon and closets with 3-gallon cisterns.

18. All baths sinks lavatory and other basins closets and urinals served from the Trust's mains shall be of approved sanitary construction and mounted to the satisfaction of the Trust.

19. No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons except with the permission of the Trust.

20. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal so as to be watertight and shall have proper and efficient self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

21. In every bath the inlet must be distinct and unconnected with the outlet. The inlet pipes must be visible and accessible and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly waterlight ground inlet plug or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessels will not be permitted, except where the supply is taken by measure through a meter.

22. All paddocks to which water is laid on must be provided with water-troughs fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

23. Any person using water by means of a hose except by permission of the Trust or where the water is supplied by measure shall be guilty of an offence.

24. Where water is required for other than domestic purposes solely a meter must be provided within one month of the receipt of a notice from the Trust requiring same unless special arrangements have been made by the Trust.

special arrangements have been made by the Trust.

25. Each and every meter shall be certified to as in working order according to tests of a like character to those adopted by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works for the testing of meters. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury and with means of access thereto. The key of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter, shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

26. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

27. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any land or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land premises or tenements.

28. In the construction of this By-law the word "Officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Warburton Waterworks Trust.

29. No person other than an employee of the municipal council shall without the written permission of the Trust water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs.

30. The water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust and no person unless duly authorized shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply.

on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply.

31. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Trust and delivered at his office of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this By-law and in no case less than three days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced and such act shall not be done or work to be commenced and such act shall not be done or work to be commenced and such act shall not in writing and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hands of the chairman and secretary of the Trust who jointly shall be competent to give the Trust's consent and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giving of such consent shall be notified to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

32. Notwithstanding anything contained in any of the foregoing Regulations the Trust may from time to time alter revise or make additions to them as may be deemed expedient.

33. Any person who does or causes to be done anything in contravention of this By-law or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done shall be guilty of an offence and for every such offence the offender shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

The foregoing Ey-law was made by the Warburton Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Acts, on the evening of Thursday, the 28th day of February, 1918.

No. 1456), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make By-laws for fixing the rents which may be charged for the use of sites of magazines for the storage of explosives (within the meaning of the Explosives Act 1915 and any Act amending the same), and for determining the terms and conditions on which such sites will be let or leased for such purpose, and also for all or any of the subjects or matters mentioned in section 128 of the Railmays Act 1915 for which purpose the word "railway" in such section shall be read as "tramway": Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following By-laws for fixing the rents to be charged for sites at the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina, and for determining the terms and conditions on which such sites will be let or leased, and for regulating the use of the jetty and tramway on the Truganina Explosives Reserve and fixing the amount of tolls to be paid on goods received or delivered upon or from the jetty aforesaid, viz.:—

BY-LAWS.

1. In the following By-laws the term "lessee" shall include person, corporation, firm, or company, and the successors, executors, administrators, or assigns of the same.

2. Sites for private magazines may be lot or leased from time to time by the Board of Land and Works, hereinafter called the Board, for such term as the Board may think fit.

3. The rent to be charged for each site shall be calculated at the rate of One shilling and threepence for every 25 lbs. or fractional part of 25 lbs. weight of explosives (other than detonators) received into any private magazine on such site. Detonators to be charged for at the following rates:

Detonators. ordinar—3s. for every case containing not

Detonators to be charged for at the following rates:—

Detonators, ordinary—3s. for every case containing not more than 5,000 in number; 5s. for every case containing more than 5,000 in number.

Detonators, electric—2s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof, with wire leads not exceeding 96 inches in length; 3s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof, with wire leads exceeding 96 inches in length.

Such rent shall be payable on the first day of each month

with wire leads exceeding 96 inches in length.

Such rent shall be payable on the first day of each month in respect of all explosives received during the preceding month, except in the case of the last rent payable upon the expiration or other sooner determination of the lease, which rent shall be payable on the date when the lease expires or is determined, and shall be in respect of all explosives received during the preceding portion of the same month up to the date of such expiry or determination.

The rent under any lease shall be payable to the Collector of Imposts at the office of the Chief Inspector of Explosives, Melbourne, or to such other officer as the Board may from time to time appoint in that behalf.

Conditional on the due payment of his rent the lessee shall be exonerated from the payment of any charges (duties of Customs or wharfage rates levied under the authority of any Act of Parliament excepted) otherwise payable to His Majesty or the Board in relation to the necessary handling and transport of the explosive between the Powder Anchorages and Laverton Railway Station. Provided that nothing in this Bylaw contained shall relieve the lessee from his obligation to bear the cost of any unusual or special service in handling, transporting, marking, or otherwise dealing with such explosives, or to pay the amount of the tolls as specified in Bylaw 12 hereunder, in cases where the explosives are not received into any private magazine on the Reserve.

4. The right of any person to become the lessee of a site of a magazine for the storage of explosives shall be conditional on his satisfying the Board that he is a fit and proper person to become such lessee, and that the annual rent will average not less than Twelve pounds per annum.

5. It shall be a further condition on which sites hereunder are to be let that the intending lessee shall execute a lease containing, in addition to any other conditions and covenants not inconsistent with these By-laws that the Board may in any particular case direct, co

- (a) To pay the rent reserved in the manner and at the times appointed.
- (b) Not to assign or sub-let the whole or any part of the site without the previous consent of the Board first

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(c) The lease to become void at the option of the Board upon an assignment, whether by operation of law or

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upon an assignment, whether by operation of law of otherwise.

(d) To repair and keep in repair to the satisfaction of a Government Inspector of Explosives any buildings or erections now or at any time during the currency of the lease on the demised land.

(c) Not to place on the demised land any buildings or erections except such as have been first approved of by the Board in writing, and for that purpose to submit all necessary plans, elevations, and particulars.

(f) Not to receive or store, or continue to store, any explosives on the demised land until and unless the lessee be at the time the holder of a licence issued under the provisions of the law for the time being in

under the provisions of the law for the time being in force regulating the receipt and storage of explosives applicable to the lessee's case.

(g) Not to remove, or permit to be removed, from off the demised land any explosives, the subject-matter of any calculation for assessing the amount of any rent accruing, due, or due and unpaid unless and until all rent, duty, and wharfage rates in respect thereof have either been paid or the payment thereof secured to the satisfaction of the Collector of Imposts at the office of the Chief Inspector of Explosives, Melbourne. bourne.

(h) To obey and observe in connexion with the handling, carriage, receipt, and storage of all explosives brought or intended to be brought upon the demised land, or taken or intended to be taken therefrom, or stored or being thereon, the requirements and provisions of all Acts, requisitions, directions, laws, rules, by-laws, regulations, and licences for the time being required, given, issued, or in force with regard to the handling, carriage, receipt, and storage of explosives, and applicable to the lessee's case.

(i) To obey and observe all the provisions of the Customs Acts and of the Marine, Act 1915, and any regulations for the time being in force under such Acts, as to the landing of explosives intended to be stored on the demised land, and the payment of duty and wharfage in respect thereof, and the bending and delivering of the same.

(j) To permit the Board and all persons deputed by it, either generally or in connexion with the demised land, to enter thereon at any time and view every part thereof to ascertain if the covenants and conditions of the lease are being observed.

either generally or in connexion with the demised land, to enter thereon at any time and view every part thereof to ascertain if the covenants and conditions of the lease are being observed.

(k) A condition permitting the lessee within 28 days from the date of the expiration, or other sooner determination of the lease if he has then paid and discharged all claims for rent, duties, rates, charges, or other claims in any way payable under the terms of the lease, to remove from off the demised land all buildings and erections other than boundary fences erected or placed thereon by him.

(l) A condition giving the Board a right to determine the lease at any time in the event of the rent payable by the lessee within a period of three consecutive calendar months previous to the date of the exercise of such right giving the right to the Minister for Trade and Customs to withdraw any licence held by the lessee in respect of his premises as a bonded store under the Customs Acts.

(m) A condition giving the Board a right to determine the lease at any time upon giving the lessee six calendar months' notice, in writing, of intention so to do.

(n) A condition upon the lessee paying and discharging all claims for rent, duties, rates, charges, or other claims in any way payable under the terms of the lease, and having them removed from off the demised land and stored in a licensed magazine, or otherwise lawfully disposed of, all explosives theretofore on the demised land, conferring on him the right to at any time determine the lease by giving to the Board notice, in writing, of such his desire.

(o) A proviso in the event of the rent being in arrear for 28 days, or in case of the non-observance or non-performance of the covenants and conditions of the lease, that the Board may forthwith determine the lease and re-enter the demised land.

6. No ship or vessel of any kind or description whatsoever shall go alongside the jetty belonging to the Truganina Ex-plosives Reserve without the consent of the officer in charge of the reserve.

7. No goods of any description, other than explosives authorized by Order in Council to be manufactured or imported, shall be landed on or delivered from the aforesaid jetty, or conveyed over the tramway without the consent of a Government Inspector of Explosives or of the officer in charge of the

8. The discharge of explosives on or from the aforesaid jetty shall be carried out in accordnace with the provisions of the Explosives Act 1915 and regulations thereunder and the Ports and Harbors Regulations.

9. Any powder lighter after completing the discharge or the loading of explosive cargo shall leave the jetty without unnecessary delay.

10. Any powder lighter having explosive on board shall not, without reasonable excuse, approach within 300 yards of the aforesaid jetty, except for the purpose of the immediate discharge of the explosive.

11. No explosive shall be allowed to remain on the aforesaid jetty, but must forthwith be placed in trucks or in the Government receiving magazine on the aforesaid jetty, or loaded into powder lighters.

12. Tolls, to include the cost of the necessary handling and transport between the Powder Auchorages and Layerton Bail-

12. Tolls, to include the cost of the necessary handling and transport between the Powder Anchorages and Laverton Railway Station, but not to include the cost of any unusual or special service in handling, transporting, marking, or otherwise dealing with such explosives, shall be paid on all explosives received upon the jetty aforesaid (other than those belonging to His Majesty's Government or received into any private magazine on the Truganina Explosives Reserve) at the following rates:—

Explosives, other than detonators—1s. 3d. for every 25 lbs. weight or fractional part of 25 lbs. weight.

Detonators, ordinary—3s. for every case containing not more than 5,000 in number; 5s. for every case containing more than 5,000 in number.

Detonators, electric—2s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof, with wire leads not exceeding 96 inches in length; 3s. for every case containing 1,000 in number or fractional part thereof, with wire leads exceeding 96 inches in length.

13. Oversea consignments of explosives intended for transhipment, and which are temporarily stored in lighters in the Powder Anchorages to be re-shipped by a ship other than that in which the said explosives were brought into the port shall be deemed to be received upon the jetty aforesaid. Provided that if the explosives are re-shipped from the State of Victoria within three calendar months from the date of arrival, 1s. 3d. within three calendar months from the date of arrival, 1s. 3d. for every 50 lbs. weight of explosives (other than detonators) so re-shipped, and also the importation licence-fees, at the rate of 5s. for every 2,000 lbs. weight of explosives (other than detonators), shall be refunded.

A refund of 50 per cent of rents and tolls levied on explosives passing through the Truganina Explosives Reserves shall be allowed on all explosives for blasting purposes manufactured in the State of Victoria.

14. Under no circumstances will the Government accept responsibility for loss by accident, fire, or explosion, but will take all reasonable precautions to insure protection to life and property.

15. Any person committing a breach of By-laws numbered 6 to 12 (both inclusive) shall be liable to a penalty not exceed-

ing Twenty pounds.

16. This Order shall be deemed to be in force so far as the rents and tolls to be paid at the Explosives Magazine Reserve at Truganina are concerned, from the 1st day of July, 1918, and to be in lieu of the Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of June, 1913, which is hereby repealed.
