DIRECTIONS FOR THE NAVIGATION OF OUTWARD BOUND DEEP DRAUGHT VESSELS THROUGH THE FAIRWAY AT PORT PHILLIP HEADS.

IN Notice to Mariners (151), dated 2nd August, 1913, it was intimated that the fairway at the entrance to Port Phillip had been deepened to 37 feet for a width of 2,000 feet eastward and 700 feet westward of the line of leading lights; but that except under the most favorable conditions it was considered dangerous to navigate any ship through the entrance to Port Phillip having a greater draught than 29 feet.

Subsequently by Notice to Mariners (15) of 1916 it was notified that the fairway had been deepened to 40 feet at low water for a width of 1,000 feet eastward of the line of leading lights. The Marine Board has intimated that the Port Phillip Sea Pilots, if given absolute right of way through the fairway, would be prepared, during daylight only, and under favorable conditions of tide and weather, to take pilotage charge of steam-ships bound outwards drawing over 29 feet and not exceeding 30 feet 6 inches, the conditions attaching to the pilotage of vessels drawing up to 29 feet remaining as at present.

In order, therefore, that the necessary arrangements may be made for facilitating the departure of vessels drawing more than 29 feet it will be necessary that the following directions be adhered to, namely:—

(1) The owner, agent, or master of any steam-ship which it is intended to be sent to sea drawing over 29 feet shall, in writing, give notice of such intention and at the time of her anticipated arrival at Port Phillip Heads, such notice to be lodged at the office of the Marine Board, Melbourne, not less than three (3) hours before the time of departure from her berth.

(2) On the receipt of such notice the Marine Board officials will immediately, by telegraph, convey the information contained therein to the lighthouse-keeper at Point Lonsdale, who, in turn, will signal to the examination steam-ship that a deep draught steam-ship is expected.

(3) On the arrival of a deep draught steam-ship off Portsea there shall be exhibited from such steam-ship, in a position whence it can be best seen, a black ball or shape two (2) feet in diameter as a signal to the Point Lonsdale station that the Entrance fairway is required to be kept clear of inward traffic.

(4) Upon such signal being observed by the officer on duty at Point Lonsdale he shall immediately cause a similar signal to be hoisted at that station, whereupon a like signal shall be exhibited from the examination steam-ship outside the Heads as an indication that the entrance to Port Phillip is temporarily closed to inward traffic, and the naval examination officer in charge shall be responsible for preventing any ship from entering the port until the outward bound deep draught vessel has cleared the channel, which shall be indicated by the signal ball or shape exhibited thereon being hauled down; the closed channel signal on the examination steam-ship and at Point Lonsdale shall then be hauled down, whereupon the channel will be opened to inward traffic.

(5) The pilot or "exempt master" of any steam-ship drawing more than 29 feet shall not proceed past Portsea except during daylight and under favorable weather and tidal conditions, and not until he has definitely ascertained that the prescribed signal is exhibited from the Point Lonsdale signal station.

These arrangements will take effect from 1st February, 1918.

BOROUGH OF SANDRINGHAM.
BY-LAW No. 46.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915, the Council of the Borough of Sandringham, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the said Borough, hereby make this By-law and orders and directs as follows:—

1. The occupier of any house, building, tenement or premises within the Borough of Sandringham shall cause to be provided and cause to be kept within the fences or walls enclosing such house, building, tenement or premises a covered receptacle, not exceeding four cubic feet in contents, constructed of galvanized iron, properly soldered and riveted so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, so that the same may with the contents thereof, when there are any, be readily and conveniently removable by the public scavenger or other person or persons, as the said Council may appoint for the purpose; and such occupier shall cause all dust, ashes or other house refuse produced, collected or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, and such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be kept covered and in a dry and cleanly condition and between the hours of six a.m. and six p.m. on the day or days appointed by the said Council for the removal thereof, such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be placed in the yard of such house, tenement, building or premises at a distance not exceeding ten feet from the entrance to such yard from a street, lane or right-of-way (and not in the said street, lane or right-of-way) so that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavenger or other such person or persons as the said Council may appoint for the purpose, and no such occupier shall place any such receptacle or permit same to be placed in or on any street, lane or right-of-way.

2. Any person who shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach is committed or continued, but a Court of Petty Sessions may order the whole or part only (not less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Borough of Sandringham.

The system employed is:—Generation at the power-house by means of 10,000 K.W. turbo-alternators of three phase current, transmission at 20,000 volts to the sub-stations, where it is converted by means of static transformers and rotary converters to direct current at 1,500 volts at which pressure it is supplied for the operations of the trains. The control of the supply of electrical energy to all parts of the system will be directed by the Control Engineer at the switching-room of the power-house.

Applicants must submit a statement setting out fully their general and technical education, apprenticeship, if any, experience to date, and where that experience was gained.

Applications must be accompanied by copies of testimonials covering as much of the applicants' experience as is practicable. Applicants must state their age and say whether married or single.

They will also make all records, prepare curve sheets, and perform all other routine duties pertaining to their position.

It is preferred that applicants for this position should have had operating experience in a power-house and sub-station on an extra high tension system.

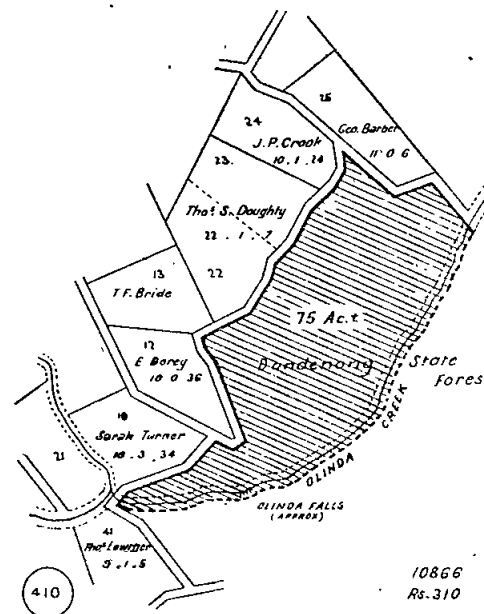

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby pursuant to and in exercise and execution, of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1918 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

- No. 1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling house is erected of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.
- No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Ten shillings.
- No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of 10 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.
- No. 4. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be made per annum.
- No. 5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1918.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 18.

By-law for the making of a rate on all rateable property comprised within the boundaries of the district of the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust such district having been proclaimed an Urban District under Division 9 of Part 2 of the Water Act 1890:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Swan Hill Waterworks Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being of all tenements for the municipal rates of the shire of Swan Hill, with a minimum payment of One pound sterling.

2. A rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound sterling of the annual value of all unoccupied land within the Trust district, in all cases where a main is laid, serves, or passes such land or within 2 chains of such land whether connected with such main or not, with a minimum charge of One pound sterling on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre and not exceeding half an acre, and for every additional similar area, One pound sterling; or having an area of less than one quarter of an acre, Ten shillings.

3. A rate of Fifteen shillings (15s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre, and not exceeding half an acre on all unoccupied land within the Trust District not previously rated under this By-law, and being situated over 2 chains, but not exceeding 5 chains from a Trust main.

4. A rate of Ten shillings (10s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre on all unoccupied land within the Trust District not previously rated under this By-law, and being situated more than 5 chains, but not exceeding 10 chains from a Trust main.

5. A rate of Six shillings (6s.) on each allotment having an area of a quarter of an acre and not exceeding half an acre on all unoccupied land within the Trust District, not previously rated under this By-law, and being situated more than 10 chains from a Trust main.

The foregoing rate is hereby made for the year 1918 commencing on the first day of January and ending the thirty-first day of December, 1918.

6. Such rate is hereby made payable in two half-yearly instalments, one half on the first day of January and the other half on the first day of July, 1918.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand receive and sue for the said rate.
