VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 65.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment as Junior Clerks, Apprentices, Lad Labourers, and Lad Porters, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any of the positions referred to herein must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in the public notice.

2. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be fourteen (14) years or over, but less than eighteen (18) years.

3. The salary of every Junior Clerk on appointment shall be at the rate of £65 per annum, and thereafter shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being; provided, however, that every successful candidate for the position of Junior Clerk who was in the Supernumerary Service of the Commissioners at the date of his permanent appointment may have any such Supernumerary Service in the capacity of a Junior Clerk taken into consideration in determining whether his salary on appointment shall be in excess of the prescribed minimum.

4. The rate of pay of every Apprentice shall be as under:—

and thereafter shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

5. The rate of pay of every Lad Labourer and Lad Porter shall on appointment be in accordance with his age, based on the following scale:—

and thereafter shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

6. Every Junior Clerk who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary, be granted a monthly allowance towards his board and lodging expenses on the

basis of the difference between his annual salary and £80 per annum during such time as his salary continues to be less than £80 per annum; and every Apprentice, Lad Labourer, and Lad Porter, similarly circumstanced, shall, in addition to his ordinary rate of pay, be granted an allowance during such time as his wage continues to be not more than 4s. 6d. per day in accordance with the following scale:—

7. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment in one of the grades specified in the public notice, and, in the case of an Apprentice, to one application for employment in one of the Trades specified therein, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted, so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

8. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near elder relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted as temporary evidence of age; but every such candidate who is selected will be required to take immediate steps to obtain an official Birth Certificate from the State or country in which he was born.

9. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employee, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment, and, if he has left such service, the cause of his leaving.

10. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for cause, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

11. The Secretary shall on the day, and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such

applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

12. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 18 to 30 inclusive of this Regulation.

13. The candidates in any grade, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

14. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

15. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

16. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

17. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled and certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

18. Every such candidate, and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed, shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

19. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

20. Every such candidate for the position of Junior Clerk shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Merit Certificate.

21. Every such candidate for the position of Apprentice or Lad Porter shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Seventh Grade, and every such candidate for the position of Lad Labourer shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Sixth Grade.

22. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firms with whom he may have been

employed during the preceding two years, and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service, and a certificate of competency and good conduct from the Head of the particular Branch in which he is or may have been employed.

23. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

24. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby certify that on the * 191, we examined† for the position of _____ in the _____ Branch, and allotted him _____ marks, and accordingly certify that he is† for such employment.

} Examiners.

25. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates, in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c., shall be determined by a ballot conducted in the manner prescribed in Clause 27.

26. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the method prescribed in Clause 27 to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz.:—

27. Two ballot-boxes shall be provided, numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

28. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

29. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity, and industry of the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

30. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

31. Every Apprentice shall, immediately after appointment, attend, at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, or Bendigo School of Mines, as may be determined by the Commissioners, the classes of instruction appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which, subject to the provisions of Clause 37, shall extend over a period of three years.

32. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College or School of Mines at his own expense, but the Commissioners will pay the College or School of Mines fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College or School of Mines.

33. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed at the College or School of Mines, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

34. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the three-years' period of tuition at the Working Men's College or School of Mines may be adjudged first and second in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades as specified in Clause 35 of this regulation, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

35. The prizes shall be allotted in the following manner, viz.:—

First Year—

The two Apprentices who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively.

Second Year—

(a) The two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Blacksmith, Boilermaker, Coppersmith, Iron Machinist, Moulder, Springmaker, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively.

(b) The two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Electroplater, Lampmaker, Sailmaker, Wood Machinist, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit will be awarded prizes of £3 and £2 respectively.

Third Year—

(a) The Apprentice amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Blacksmith, Boilermaker, Coppersmith, Iron Machinist, Moulder, Springmaker, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first in order of merit shall be nominated as a Student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners), and the Apprentice adjudged second in order of merit shall be awarded a prize of £5.

(b) The two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Electroplater, Lampmaker, Sailmaker, Wood Machinist, and such other trades as may hereafter be determined, who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit will be awarded prizes of £3 and £2 respectively.

36. The apprentice who is nominated as a Student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering shall be afforded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, or Bendigo School of Mines, as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College or School of Mines, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the College or School of Mines fees will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid at the rate of £100 per annum.

37. Any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or Second Year Course, after having studied such course for one year, will be allowed a second year in which to qualify in such course, and shall attend such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners, and shall pay the fees imposed in respect of such classes, and any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or the Second Year Course after having studied such course for two years, or who is adjudged guilty of continual, frequent, or repeated misconduct at the College or School of Mines, or to have neglected to make a proper effort to qualify in the work at the College or School of Mines, will render himself liable to the immediate termination of his services, and shall not have any claim if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

38. The term of tuition at the College or School of Mines at the expense of the Department shall in every instance be limited to three years, and any apprentice who fails to complete the Course of Instruction within that period, and who desires to continue his studies, shall be required to pay the fees therefor, and will not be allowed to absent himself from duty during working hours for the purpose of attending the College or School of Mines.

39. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Work-shops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the five years exceed sixty-five working days in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the five years exceeding sixty-five working days in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the five years for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-LAW No. 838.—GENERAL RATE.—RODNEY IRRIGATION
AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any Urban Division thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands and for watering cattle or other stock:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, comprising all lands in the aforesaid district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described hereunder comprised within the Second Division, and excepting and excluding all lands set out and described hereunder comprised within the Third Division—a rate of Twelve pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, comprising allotment 9 of section 19, part of allotment 87, being the holding of Henry G. Byrne and others, part of said allotment 87, being the holding of William Sheales, part of allotment 100, being the holding of Charlotte Byham, parts of allotment 125, being the holding of Joseph Dunn and the holdings of William Sheales, of the parish of Toolamba West; allotments 7, 59, 71, 79, 80, 112, 113, 133, and 137, part of allotment 9, being the holding of executors of William S. Archer, and part of allotment 125, being the site of a public hall, of the parish of Toolamba; allotments 7, 17A, 30A, 31A, 231, and 231A, an area of about one and a half acres, being the holding of William Small, the site of an old hotel; Village Settlement allotments 1 to 7 inclusive of section 7; Village Settlement allotments 1, 2, 3, 3A, 4, 4A, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 9A, 10, 10A, 11, 12, 12A, 13, 14, 15, and 16 of section 8, Village Settlement allotment 3 of section 12, an area of about one acre, being part of section 1, the holding of Henry Small, Junior, areas between the Village Settlement and the River Goulburn, being the holdings of John Barron, James B. G. Lockwood, and Ernest Bathman; and part of old Cemetery Site, being the holding of Mary Ann Bathman, all of the parish of Murchison North; allotment 11, of the parish of Murchison; allotments 45, 62A, 63A, 75, 91A, 155, and 171; and part of allotment 79A1, being the holding of M. T. McAlpine, of the parish of Mooropna; allotment 25A, parts of allotment 68, being the holdings of the Merrigum Butter Factory Company, Anton Abrahamson, Boe C. Miller, William Manley, and James and George Robinson, parts of allotment 86, being the holdings

of John Stewart, James Duguid, Peter Costello, Matthias Rosan, Florence Pettifer, and the Bank of Victoria Limited, of the parish of Mooropna West; parts of allotment 83, being the holdings of Anton Abrahamson, John Lancaster, John Davison Wilson, Annie Pavey, Matthias Rosan, James P. Judd, and John D. Brown, part of allotment 16, being the site of the Lancaster Fruit-growers' Hall, parts of allotment 84, being the holdings of Thomas R. Brown, George Webb, and the Merrigum Bakery Company Limited; and allotment 84A, being the holding of M. F. Nugent, of the parish of Kyabram East; allotment A, parts of allotment 16 of section B, comprising about eleven acres and the site of a hall and hotel, being the holdings of Michael Malone, and the site of a store and five acres, being the holdings of Michael Malone and Nora Doolan, parts of allotment 17 of said section B, being the holding of William Beckwith, and the site of a blacksmith's shop, allotments 47, 47A, 49, 51, 52, 55, 59, and 60, of section C, and allotments 1, 2, and 3 of section D, of the parish of Undera; allotments 23, 43A, 60, 62, 83, 63A, 64, 65A, 65B, 66, 67, 68, and 69, of the parish of Coomboona—a rate of Sixpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, comprising allotment 23, subdivisions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 19, 20, 21, and 22 of allotment 103, and subdivisions 29, 30, and 31 of allotment 104, of the parish of Toolamba West; an area of about twenty-nine acres of land south of allotment 40, being the holding of Rassmus J. Larsen, allotment 89, an area of about thirty acres of Crown land east of allotment 22, subdivisions 1 to 25 inclusive of allotment 135, part of said allotment 135 being the holding of William Small and Mary E. Broadhead, and the west part of said allotment 135, being the holding of Mary Ann Taylor, allotments 8, 58, 100, 114, and 117, and part of allotment 124, being the holding of James Teese, of the parish of Toolamba; allotments 11A, 12A, 17B, 189A, 205, 205A, 207, 230, 232, 232A, 233, 235, 235A, and 236, part of allotment 234, being the holding of Mrs. Janet Gardner, and part of allotment 206A, being the holding of William Anderson, of the parish of Murchison North; parts of allotment 84, being the holding of Charles William Norton and Charles W. Norton, an area of about two acres and a half of land south of allotment 84, being the holding of Ismy Powell, allotments 75A, 75B, 75C, 82, 82A, 91, 91A, 91C, 161, 184, and 185 of the parish of Mooropna; allotments 23, 24, 26, and 29, of section A, of the parish of Girgarre East; allotments 50A, 50B, 50C, 53, 54, 55, 56, and 57 of section C; allotments 6A, 7, 8, 9, 9A, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 15A, and 16, of section D, allotments 2, 2A, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 13A, 14, 15, and 19 of section E, of the parish of Undera; allotments 1A, 57, 61, 70, 71, and 72, of the parish of Coomboona—a rate of Threepence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1918, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1919, and shall be payable on the fourth day of October, 1918, at the office of the said Commission, at Tatura.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made, in accordance with the provisions of the Water Act 1915, by J. A. Carey, valuer, returned on the fourteenth day of September, 1918, and adopted by the said Commission on the sixteenth day of September, 1918, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless altered or amended as provided by the Water Act 1915, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

The foregoing By-law was made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 23rd day of September, 1918, and the common seal of the said Commission was hereunto affixed the 30th day of September, 1918, in the presence of—

WYCHEPROOF WATERWORKS DISTRICT.—DISTRICT EXTENDED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

That the Wycheproof Waterworks District be extended by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the Schedule hereto, and as on and from the first day of July, 1918, such District shall be deemed to be so extended.

SCHEDULE.
