GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India; To Our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Doctor of Laws, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and Saint George, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, Greeting.

Our said State, or of his departure from Our said State, or of his assuming the administration of the Government of Our Commonwealth of Australia, We do hereby authorize and require you to administer the Government of Our said State of Victoria, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, of 20th October, 1900, eonstituting the and 30th April, 1913. bearing date at Westminster, the Twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the office of Governor in and over Our said State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in Our Commonwealth of Australia, and in Our Letters Patent under the said Great Seal bearing date at Westminster the Thirtieth day of April, 1913, amending the same, or in any other Our Letters Patent, adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, and according to such Instructions as Our said Governor for the time being may have received, or may hereafter receive from Us, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in Our said State.

III. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and Officers, &c., to take loving subjects in Our said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hercof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.
