Local Government Act 1915.

AUDITORS OF MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTS AND THEIR REMUNERATION.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686), section 442, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 1st day of October, 1918, appointed the gentlemen who names appear on the subjoined Schedule "A" to be Auditors to examine and report upon the Municipal Accounts of the respective cities, towns, boroughs, and shires set opposite to their names in the said Schedule, for the year ended 30th September, 1918. And further, His Excellency has by the same Order approved that the remuneration to be paid out of the respective municipal funds to the Auditors for their services in auditing the municipal accounts for the year aforementioned be at the rate set out in the Schedule attached to the said Order, and marked "B" and that, in addition to the fees therein set out, there shall be paid, in such cases where travelling expenses are incurred, the actual cost of transit, and also a commuted allowance of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) per day for personal expenses when the Auditor is necessarily prevented by the discharge of his duties from returning daily to his place of residence, or Five shillings (5s.) per day in the event of the time taken travelling to and from Melbourne suburban offices and Melbourne exceeding two hours per day.

Applications, accompanied by evidence of good moral character and industrious habits, must be lodged at the office of the State Public Service Commissioner, Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 2nd November, 1918.

The examination will be conducted by the Melbourne University, and will comprise subjects prescribed for the School Intermediate Examination as set out in the Public Service Regulations, copies of which, and forms of application, may be obtained at the office of the Commissioner.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination, and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Saturday, the 23rd November, 1918, a postal note, payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Fifteen shillings (15s.).

Fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must on the first day of the examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday, but a candidate twenty-two years of age or over cannot be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply to any Victorian returned sailor or soldier. Provided their certificate of discharge is furnished with their application, they may apply at any age, and may be paid a salary on appointment not exceeding £156 a year.

REGULATIONS.—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES,
CHAPTER IX.

AMENDMENT IN RATES OF CHARGE FOR A SUPPLY OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY UNDER THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ARARAT ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER No. 137, 1918.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 13(d) of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915*, doth hereby vary the rates to be charged for a supply of electrical energy under the Council of the Borough of Ararat Electric Lighting Order No. 137, 1918, by substituting the following section for section 1 of the Fourth Schedule to the said Order:—

Section 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the actual amount of energy supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates per quarter:—

For any amount up to twenty units, Fifteen shillings, and for each unit over twenty units, Ninepence.

And the Honourable Arthur Robinson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS.—SUPERVISION OF ELECTRIC SUPPLY UNDERTAKINGS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of October, 1918.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.
Mr. Lawson | Mr. Robertson.

UNDER the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1917 (No. 2896)*, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations providing for the qualification of persons for the supervision of the construction and maintenance of works of municipal councils authorized under any Order heretofore or hereafter granted under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915 (No. 2645)*, or any corresponding previous enactment. Such persons are hereafter referred to as Electrical Advisers.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall act as Electrical Adviser to any municipal Council in the State of Victoria duly authorized under any Order heretofore or hereinafter granted under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915* or any corresponding previous enactment to construct and maintain works, unless he shall have obtained a certificate of qualification in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

2. All applications for certificates of qualification to act as Electrical Adviser to a Council shall be made in writing in accordance with the form prescribed in the schedule to these Regulations and shall be addressed to the Minister of Public Works, who is hereby authorized to grant certificates of qualification to any person complying with the requirements of these Regulations, or to refuse any application for such certificate.

3. Any person applying for a certificate of qualification to act as an Electrical Adviser to a municipal Council shall state his name, occupation, and address in his application. Such application shall be indorsed by the municipal clerk, and shall be supported by documentary evidence of the applicant's qualification as to training and experience, for the advising of the Council upon, and affording guidance in regard to the matters hereinafter set out in so far as they pertain to the system operated, or to be operated by the Council, that is to say:—

- The question of establishing of an electrical supply undertaking.
- The recommending of an appropriate system of supply, and the preparing of estimates of capital cost, and of probable annual expenditure and revenue in connexion therewith.
- The preparing of plans and specifications upon which to invite tenders for the supply of plant and materials.
- The proper supervision of all work carried out by contract or otherwise.
- The manner of conducting and operating an undertaking, including the organising of means for carrying out the several functions of generation, distribution, and administration.
- Appraising of the material condition of the assets of an undertaking, and of its commercial and financial position, together with analyses of working costs and the proper allocation of all expenditure and revenue.
- The preparing or furnishing of the necessary materials for the preparation of a periodical financial statement of accounts showing profit and loss, depreciation, renewals, and other matters, as required by the specimen books of accounts of electric supply undertakings under section 415 of *Local Government Act 1915*.
- The obligations placed upon the undertakers under the

Electric Light and Power Act 1915.

4. In addition to the foregoing, in so far as they appertain to a Council's undertaking, applicants must, if required by the Minister, furnish evidence of qualification and practical knowledge in regard to—

- The type of plant to be operated, or in operation, and the measures necessary to maintain such plant in good working order and to carry out extensions to same.
- Switchboard apparatus, also meters used for measuring electrical supply to consumers; the determining of the accuracy of meters and of their proper adjustment.
- Overhead line construction, and laying of underground mains, services, and systems of reticulation. Calculation of losses in transmission and distribution.

- (l) Systems of internal wiring of consumers' premises, and of the wiring rules in force in this State, and of methods of carrying out tests.
- (m) Proper operation and maintenance of electric storage batteries, including cell-switches, boosters, and other accessories.

5. If it be shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that an officer in the employment of a Council is possessed of the necessary qualifications to perform the duties of an Electrical Adviser as aforesaid, the Minister shall approve of his being appointed Electrical Adviser to such Council, if the Council so desire.

6. If it be shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that any Electrical Adviser has failed in the carrying out of his duties to a Council employing him, or that he has not acted solely in the interests of such Council, or has been in receipt of any payment, commission, or valuable consideration other than from such Council in respect of works advised upon by him, or carried out under his supervision, the Minister, after he has given such Electrical Adviser the opportunity to be heard, may revoke his approval in relation to such Council. It is nevertheless provided that a Council may pay commission to its Electrical Adviser by way of partial or complete remuneration for his services in respect of works advised upon or carried out under his supervision.

7. Applications under clause 3 for a certificate of qualification shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s., and for any subsequent application a fee of 10s. 6d.

8. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1919. Application forms referred to in clause 3 can be obtained from the Local Government Branch of the Department of Public Works, as also copies of these Regulations.

A MANUFACTURING CHEMISTS BOARD TO BE APPOINTED.

- (a) a wholesale or a manufacturing chemist;
- (b) Manufacturing toilet preparations, perfumery, essences, essential oils, food preservatives, branding fluids, deodorants, disinfectants, fungicides, insecticides, vermin destroyers, weed destroyers,

was passed by the Legislative Assembly on the twenty-second day of August, 1918, and by the Legislative Council on the seventeenth day of September, 1918: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, doth hereby order that a Special Board, consisting of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) a wholesale or a manufacturing chemist;
- (b) manufacturing toilet preparations, perfumery, essences, essential oils, food preservatives, branding fluids, deodorants, disinfectants, fungicides, insecticides, vermin destroyers, weed destroyers.

Also that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order, or instrument, or legal proceedings, be described for all purposes as the Manufacturing Chemists Board; and that the area or locality within which the Determination of such Special Board shall be operative shall be the metropolitan district as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, all cities and towns, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

And the Honorable H. S. W. Lawson, His Majesty's Minister for Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation vary the Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of August, 1914, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the second day of September, 1914, re netting at Sydenham, Tamboon, Wingan, and Mallacoota Inlets by substituting for the words "from the first day of October in each year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year" the words "from the fifteenth day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation—

1. Define the mouth of Boggy Creek as an imaginary line running between the two banks of such creek where it joins the Nowa-Nowa Arm of Lake Tyres at the old Nowa Nowa Ford, about twenty (20) chains below or seaward from the railway bridge at Nowa Nowa; and fix a distance of fifty-five (55) chains from such mouth of Boggy Creek within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used.

(NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others boundary posts will be erected at the seaward or outward boundary of such closed area at the Nowa Nowa motor-boat landing.)

2. Define the mouth of Stony Creek as an imaginary line running between the two banks of such creek at the bridge on the old south-eastern road from Cunningham to Nowa Nowa where such creek joins the Toorloo Arm of Lake Tyers; and fix a distance of twenty (20) chains from such mouth within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used.

(NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others boundary posts will be erected on either side of Toorloo Arm showing the outward or seaward boundary of such closed area.)

3. Define the mouth of Ironstone Creek as an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where such creek joins the Nowa Nowa Arm of Lake Tyers.

(NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others boundary posts will be erected at the mouth of such creek.)

ALTERATION OF THE PROCLAMATION DEFINING THE MOUTHS OF THE BEMM, CANN, WINGAN, AND GENOA RIVERS, AND SPECIFYING THE LIMITS WITHIN WHICH NETS AND FIXED ENGINES ARE NOT TO BE USED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation—

1. Revoke the Proclamation dated the fourth day of November, 1901, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the thirteenth day of November, 1901, defining the mouths of the Bemm, Cann, Wingan, and Genoa Rivers and specifying limits within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used.

2. Define the mouths of the Bemm, Cann, and Wingan Rivers as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such rivers enter the ocean or any bay thereof; and prohibit the use of nets or fixed engines within a radius of a quarter of a mile seaward of any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of any of the rivers aforesaid.

3. Define the mouth of the Genoa River as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such river join the top lake of Mallacoota Inlet, near Smellie's Point; and prohibit the use of nets or fixed engines within a radius of a quarter of a mile seaward from any portion or point of such line.

4. Prohibit the use of nets and fixed engines within the whole of Smellie's Arm, the mouth of which arm is adjacent to the mouth of the Genoa River.

SHIRE OF DIMBOOLA.

BY-LAW No. 21.

A By-law of the shire of Dimboola, made under sub-section 8 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, and numbered 21.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Dimboola order as follows:—

1. That in order to minimize the danger arising from accidental fires at moving-picture shows, variety shows, theatricals, and concerts, no person shall have liberty of using any public building for the purpose of holding any of the above-named entertainments, unless two members of the local fire brigade are present in uniform during the progress of the entertainment.
