Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE COUNTRY SHOP ASSISTANTS BOARD.

Notes.—(a) This Determination, on the 28th October, 1918, applied to the whole of the State outside and excepting t following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the Cities of Ballara Sendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the Town of Ballarat East; and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown an chilwell, and Sebastopol.

(b) The following are Fourth Schedule Shops :-

Chemists' shops, Coffee-houses, Confectioners, Eating-houses, Fish and Oyster shops, Fruit and Vegetable shops, Restaurants, Tobacconists' shops, Booksellers' and News Agents' shops.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in or in connexion with a shop (other than a Fourth Schedule Shop) as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter has made the following Determination, viz.:—
