"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million three hundred and ninety thousand six hundred and three pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and eighteen and One thousand nine hundred and nineteen."

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE AREA CLOSED AGAINST NETTING, ETC., AT THE MOUTH OF THE WERRIBEE RIVER.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation for the following purposes:—

1. Revoking the Proclamation dated the eleventh day of December, 1876, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the fifteenth day of December, 1876, page 2283 (re-defining the mouths of certain streams and other matters), so far as it relates to the mouth of the Werribee River and the distance therefrom within which nets or fixed engines shall not be used.

2. Defining what shall be deemed the mouth of the Werribee River as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward

point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such river enter Port Phillip Bay.

3. Prohibiting during the whole of each year the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters within an area bounded as follows:—

Commencing at a point on the foreshore 440 yards north-easterly from the mouth of the Werribee River; thence by lines bearing respectively south 20 degrees east 440 yards, south 60 degrees west 1,500 yards, and north 42 degrees west 440 yards to a point on the foreshore 880 yards south-westerly from the mouth of the Werribee River; thence by the foreshore, by the mouth of the Werribee River, and again by the foreshore to the point of commencement.

(N.B.—As a guide to fishermen and others, posts will be erected (a) at the point of commencement; (b) at the south-eastern extremity of the line first described herein; (c) at the point on the foreshore 880 yards south-westerly from the mouth of the Werribee River; (d) on the Werribee Jetty approximately 390 yards from its shore end in continuation of the second line described herein. As, however, posts are liable to be affected by climatic and other causes, all concerned are warned that the absence or invisibility of a post or posts will not be accepted as an excuse for any infringement of the proposed proclamation.)

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 828.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—MITIAMO URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charges made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charges such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charges, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Ten shillings for the period hereinafter set out.

CITY OF BRUNSWICK.

BY-LAW No. 59.

A By-law of the city of Brunswick made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 59, for prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Brunswick order as follows:—

1. No cattle shall be allowed to graze (whether pegged or not) or wander upon any land within the city of Brunswick not enclosed by a substantial fence.
2. The owner of any cattle which are found so grazing or wandering will be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
3. Every person under whose care, custody or control any cattle which are found so grazing or wandering are or have last been will also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
4. In the interpretation of this By-law words importing the singular number shall be deemed and taken to include the plural and the plural the singular and word "person" shall include "corporation" and the word "cattle" shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats and swine, and the word "owner" shall include any person having or being entitled to the possession, custody or use of any cattle.
5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Brunswick.
6. By-law No. 46 of the city of Brunswick is hereby repealed.
