## DETERMINATION OF THE CHAFF-CUTTERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 30th November, 1918, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

(a) employed in the process, trade, or business of chaff-outting, corn-orushing, or compressing fodder;

(b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the trade or business of chaff-outting, corn-orushing, or compressing fodder;

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work) shall be paid at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour. .(7) PIECEWORK.--The lowest piece-work prices payable to any person employed of
