And the said apprentice and _____ covenant with the said master that he the said apprentice shall and will during the said term (unless the master shall remove his business from _____ to some place beyond the radius of five (5) miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other master within the radius or if there be none such to be released from these presents) well and faithfully serve the said master as an apprentice in the process trade or business of _____ aforesaid and his lawful commands willingly obey and shall also willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of such of the representatives of the said master as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business or as the said master shall specify or require and shall not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said master during business hours and shall not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience and shall not at any time during such term cancel obliterate injure spoil destroy waste embezzle spend or make away with any of the books papers writings documents moneys stamps goods chattels or other property of the said master his executors administrators or assigns or of any partner or of any of his or their customers or employers which shall be deposited in his or their hands or intrusted to the care custody or possession of him or them or of the said apprentice. Provided always and it is hereby agreed that the said apprentice shall be paid for all holidays set forth in the determination of the Jewellers Board and for all working days the employer may close his factory or work-room or shop or place but shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said master's service without leave or licence and also provided that the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has actually worked for a period of 12 months at the next preceding rate. ELECTRIFICATION STAFF.

APPLICATIONS are invited from persons qualified to fill the following positions in connexion with the operation of the electrified sections of the Melbourne Suburban Railways.

The system employed is:—Generation at the power-house by means of 10,000 K.V. turbo-alternators of three phase current, transmission at 20,000 volts to the sub-stations, where it is converted by means of static transformers and rotary converters to direct current at 1,500 volts at which pressure it is supplied for the operations of the trains. The control of the supply of electrical energy to all parts of the system will be directed by the Control Engineer at the switching-room of the power-house.

Applicants must submit a statement setting out fully their general and technical education, apprenticeship, if any, experience to date, and where that experience was gained.

Applications must be accompanied by copies of testimonials covering as much of the applicants' experience as is practicable.

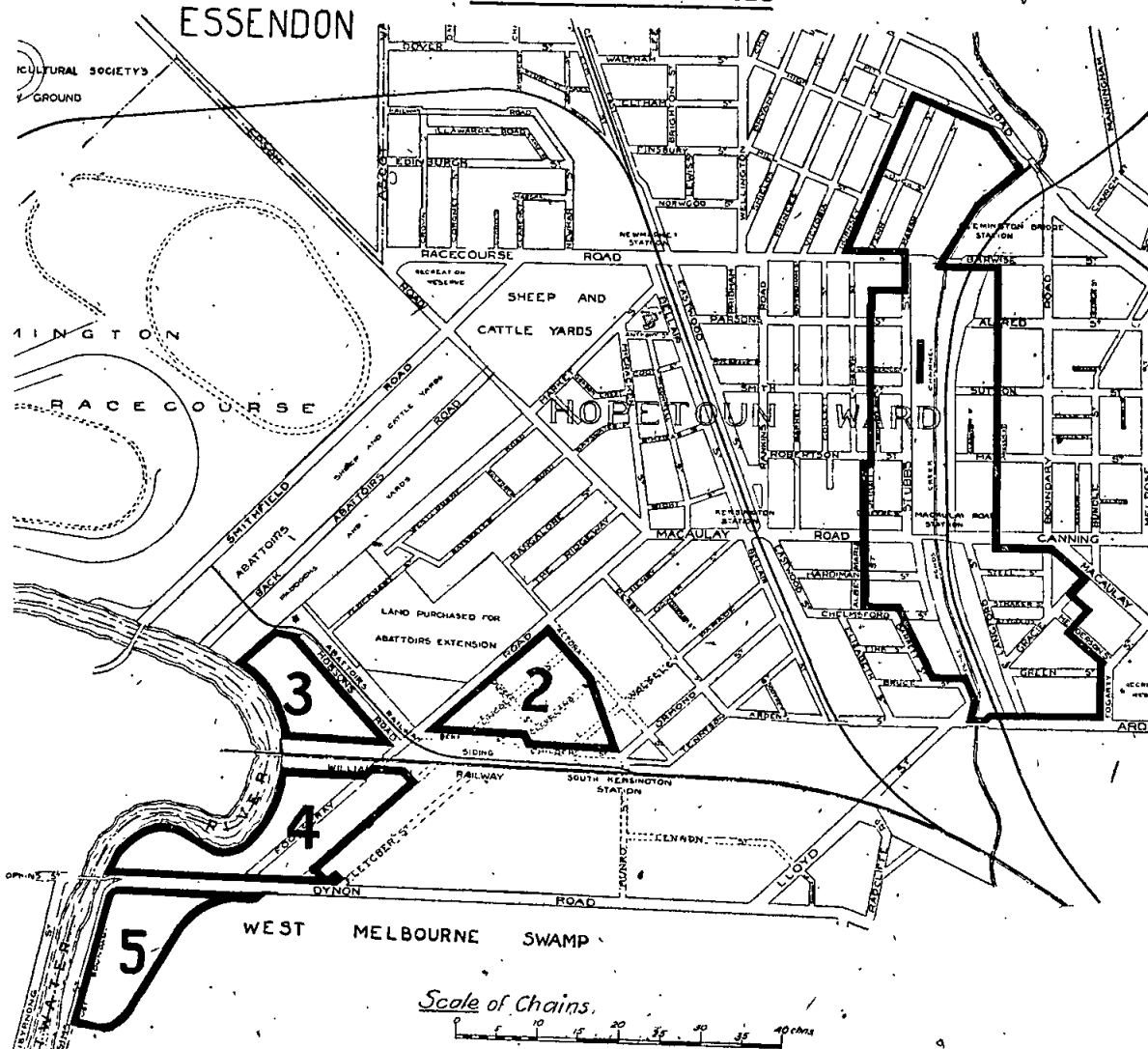

REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE KEEPING OF POULTRY FOR SALE OR OTHERWISE AT PLACES USED FOR SELLING OR STORING MEAT.

WHEREAS poultry is kept at places used for selling or storing meat within the city, and whereas it is necessary, in order to maintain the cleanliness of such places and premises appurtenant thereto and appliances used thereat, that certain conditions with regard to the keeping of such poultry should be observed. Now therefore the said Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the *Meat Supervision Act 1915*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following regulation, which shall apply

to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Melbourne, that is to say—

—1. The owner of any place within the said city used for selling or storing meat shall observe the following conditions, that is to say he shall—

Floors.

- cause every floor in such place on which poultry is kept to be properly covered with a layer of concrete or other approved impervious material;
- cause every such floor to have a proper slope towards a channel or gully and to be effectually drained by adequate drains, which shall be properly trapped and protected in compliance with the regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works;

- (c) cause every floor and drain to be maintained at all times in a clean state and in good order;

Walls.

- (d) cause each wall of every room or place where poultry is kept to be constructed of durable non-absorbent material closely jointed and, as far as practicable, finished internally with a smooth surface and with angles and corners rounded off and out sufficiently to prevent lodgment of filth;
- (e) cause the internal surface of every wall at all times to be kept clean and to be thoroughly washed with limewash as often as necessary for the keeping of such surface clean and wholesome as far as practicable;

Coops.

- (f) provide coops of iron in which all poultry shall be kept, and shall cause all coops to be maintained in good order and condition and properly cleansed by scraping and washing down as often as may be necessary;

Water Supply.

- (g) provide an adequate supply of hot and of cold water on such place for cleansing down of coops, walls, and floors;

Receptacle for Waste.

- (h) cause all waste or offensive matter to be placed in an impervious metal receptacle provided with a close-fitting cover, and shall cause the same to be removed from such place as often as required.

2. The occupier of every such place shall be liable as well as the owner for the observance of the above conditions.
3. Any person guilty of an offence against these regulations shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

THE BAIRNSDALE AND ORBOST RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST.**RESOLUTION FOR THE MAKING OF A RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION RATE FOR THE YEAR 1ST MARCH, 1917, TO 28TH FEBRUARY, 1918.**
