PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1919.

By-law of the Rochester Waterworks Trust for determining, making, and levying rates and charges payable in respect of the supply of water within the Urban District of the said Trust, and for preventing the undue waste of water.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust, pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts and of every other power enabling the said Trust in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which all householders, or occupiers, or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of the supply of water for the said Trust for the year 1919:—
 - (a) For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound seven shillings and sixpence sterling per annum.
 - (b) For every house or tenement of more than Eleven pounds, and not exceeding Thirty pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling per annum.
 - (c) For every house or tenement of the annual municipal valuation of Thirty pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.
 - (d) For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.
 - (e) A minimum rate of One pound five shillings sterling, and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for gardening or stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.
 - (f) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum, provided that the trough or other receptacle is situated within the Trust District, a rate of Fifteen shillings per annum will be charged.
 - (g) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes, the quantity used in excess, shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
 - (h) For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for brick and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract, ...

upon the value, or on the amount charged or paid for brickwork or plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention to do so.

- (i) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

- (j) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.

2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1919, and the 1st day of July, 1919.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1919, No. 25.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law, viz.:—

A By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Eighteen pounds (£18) sterling.

2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Eighteen pounds (£18).

3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged at a rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1919, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets on which the pipes of the water supply are laid and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter (¼) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water; half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such lands or tenements are over a quarter (¼) of a mile and within half-a-mile (½) thereof, a quarter of the before-mentioned rates.

Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the shire of Donald for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1919, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1919, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1919, and shall be due and payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1919.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

1. (a) For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation and under the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence.

(b) For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.

2. For each vacant allotment or piece of land facing a street wherein a main pipe has been laid, rated for the ordinary municipal rate separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of same.

3. Such rates shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, due and payable respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1919.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trentham Waterworks Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

3. For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling each space of (5) five feet shall be charged as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1919.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The following rates are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District, that is to say:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, payable in two equal instalments, on the 1st of January and 1st July, 1919, shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Trust District, according to the municipal valuation on such properties.

The minimum rate to be paid shall in all cases be Twenty shillings, whether the lands or tenements be occupied or unoccupied, and shall include land on which there is no dwelling.

All water supplied by the Trust for other than domestic purposes shall be by meter, and charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Surplus water, Threepence per 1,000 gallons to Railway Department for engine purposes.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE Commissioners of the Yarram Waterworks Trust do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1919 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Yarram Waterworks Trust; also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Alberton; but no such rate in any case shall be less than One pound ten shillings.

2. A rate of Fifteen shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

3. For the water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

5. The foregoing rate is made payable on the 1st day of April, 1919.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

Mines Act 1915.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of December, 1918.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.
Mr. McWhae | Mr. Kendall.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Mines Act 1915*, doth hereby cancel the Order in Council of the 19th November, 1918, making Regulations for granting certificates to mining engine-drivers, and doth substitute therefor the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES TO MINING ENGINE-DRIVERS.

PRELIMINARY REQUIREMENTS.

1. Each applicant for a certificate of competency must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Mining Department, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, or postal notes to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate. In the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of three classes, namely—First, second, and third.

A first class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 5 (b).

A second class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes, except a winding engine, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 4 (b).

A third class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine, the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter, unless the certificate be qualified as provided for in clause 3 (b).

3. An applicant for a third class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has, for not less than twelve months been assisting to drive engines used for mining purposes for not less than twelve hours per week; or
- (c) that he has had not less than three months' instruction in engine-driving at any educational institution whose curriculum equipment and training are approved by the Board.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (d) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen years, nor over the age of fifty years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;

- (e) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

4. An applicant for a second class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has been the holder of a third class certificate under these Regulations, or a second class certificate under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* for a period

of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in driving a third class mining engine or engines, such driving experience to have been for not less than twelve hours per week; or that he has assisted to drive a steam-engine the cylinder of which is more than twelve inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder steam-engine the cylinders of which have a combined area equal to that of a single-cylinder of more than twelve inches in diameter for a period of twelve months, and for at least twelve hours per week; the examination to be equivalent to that undergone by a candidate for a first class factory certificate; or

- (c) that he has had not less than six months' instruction in engine-driving at any educational institution whose curriculum equipment and training are approved by the Board.

Where the applicant has had experience only on one engine or class of engine, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that engine or class of engine only—

- (d) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen years, nor over the age of fifty years; this latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;

- (e) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

5. An applicant for a first class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

- (a) of his respectability of character;
- (b) that he has been the holder of a second class certificate under these Regulations, a first class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, an ordinary mining engine-driver's certificate issued in New South Wales, or a second class mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in assisting to drive both loose eccentric and link-motion winding engines, such experience to be for not less than twelve hours per week.

Where only one class of engine or any other class of winding gear has been driven, the Board may grant a conditional certificate for that class of engine only—

- (c) that he is at the date of examination not under the age of twenty-one years, nor over the age of fifty years. This latter age does not apply to persons who had experience in driving winding engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years;

- (d) that neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any mental or other bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company or mine-owner, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence of his having had the necessary experience at a mine; provided the document signed by the engine-driver be declared by such engine-driver before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits to be true and correct in every particular.

Examinations.

6. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette*, and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1. Each candidate will be duly notified of the time and place of examination.

7. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam and other engines, boilers, furnaces, winding and pumping gear, or any other machinery used for mining purposes.

8. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than three months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

9. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine or any engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

10. The holder of a first class certificate of competency or of service under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine except a winding engine.

11. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

12. The holder of a second class certificate of competency or of service under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any engine used for mining purposes not being a winding engine, and the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or a double-cylinder engine the cylinders of which have a combined area not exceeding that of a single cylinder of not more than 12 inches in diameter.

13. The holder of a third class certificate under the *Mines Act 1915* shall be entitled to drive any second class engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.

Copies of Certificates.

14. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the *Mines Act 1915*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the Schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

15. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

16. Every holder of a second or third class certificate under these Regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a higher class, and, in the event of the latter certificate being granted, the former shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

17. Any person holding a mining engine-driver's certificate issued in any other State of the Commonwealth, or in New Zealand, and who takes up his residence in Victoria, may be granted a certificate of registration of equal grade to his certificate, upon payment of the fee prescribed by the following Schedule, and without undergoing any examination. This registration certificate shall entitle the holder to drive the same class or classes of engine that he had been qualified to take charge of under his certificate in the issuing State, or in New Zealand, and these particulars will be shown on the face of the registration certificate. BY-LAW No. 26.

A By-law of the shire of Chiltern, made under part 28, section 635 (f) of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 26.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and of every other power hereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Chiltern order as follows:—

1. That the following scale of fees are those fixed for the use of the Barnawartha weighbridge. Sixpence for the first ton or fraction thereof and Twopence additional for every half-ton or fraction thereof additional up to six tons; and Sixpence per ton for every ton or fraction thereof over six tons, the load only to be charged for except as mentioned in the following clause (2).

2. All freight vehicles when first weighed are to be charged for and on every subsequent occasion until the weights are legibly painted on them, thenceforward they are not to be charged for unless altered in weight.

3. Fraction engines or loads above 15 tons will not be allowed over the bridge.

4. This By-law shall apply to the Council's weighbridge at Barnawartha.

BY-LAW No. 27.

TOWN OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BATHING REGULATION.

A Regulation of the town of Williamstown numbered Eleven and made under section 1 of Part IX. of the thirteenth schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915* in force by virtue of a By-law of the town of Williamstown numbered 58 for regulating bathing at a public bathing place.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the town of Williamstown make the following Regulation which shall apply to that portion of the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay situate between the east side of Garden-street and the east side of Victoria street within the municipality of the town of Williamstown.

1. Regulation No. 10 is hereby repealed.

2. No person shall bathe in the open sea at any part of the foreshore unless effectively and decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume with kilt and similar to that known as the Canadian costume and any constable or officer of police or any officer or employee of the council may require any person who, in his opinion, is not sufficiently or decently dressed to at once resume his ordinary dress.

3. No person over the age of ten years shall bathe within fifty feet of the baths of the Williamstown Bathing Company.

4. No person over the age of ten years clothed in a bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter or play games on or run along the foreshore aforesaid but shall on leaving the dressing sheds to enter the water proceed in a direct line and on leaving the water shall return in a direct line to the dressing sheds.

5. No person over the age of ten years shall bathe on the foreshore aforesaid between the hours of Ten a.m. and Seven p.m. on Sundays.

6. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner to the annoyance of the public or shall use profane or obscene language or behave in an indecent manner in or upon any part of the foreshore aforesaid or beach used by the public for bathing purposes.

7. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume on any portion of the foreshore aforesaid except within the sheds provided by the Council of the town of Williamstown for that purpose.

8. No male over the age of ten years shall enter any dressing shed provided and preserved for the use of females and no female over the age of ten years shall enter any dressing shed provided and reserved for males.

9. No person shall play games, loiter, deposit any rubbish filth or other offensive matter in or damage, disfigure or write upon any of the dressing sheds aforesaid.

10. No person shall bathe any horse or other animal at any portion of the seashore or beach other than that set apart for the purpose and indicated on such seashore or beach by posts painted red with white lettering thereon to this effect—"Horses and other animals to be bathed between these posts only" and no such horse or other animal shall enter or leave the seashore or beach between Garden and Victoria streets by any other entrance or exit than that provided at Victoria-street and no horse or other animal shall be taken across or along the asphalt footpath on the south side of the Esplanade roadway.

11. No person shall bathe any horse or other animal on the beach or foreshore on any day after the hour of Ten o'clock a.m. and no person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal upon or along the beach or foreshore aforesaid except at a walking pace and no person shall bathe any horse or other animal upon the seashore or beach unless such horse or other animal is properly reined and in charge of an attendant who shall be effectively and decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume kilted or similar to that known as the Canadian costume and every such horse or other animal shall immediately upon leaving the water be taken off the seashore or beach.

Resolution for passing this Regulation agreed to by the Council the 5th day of March, 1918, and confirmed the 9th day of April, 1918.

A non-effective member elected under this By-law shall be entitled to a non-transferable lady's ticket for herself, one additional lady's ticket, and a non-transferable pass for admission of herself to the members' carriage paddock with her motor or carriage and horses, but she shall not be entitled to be present or vote at any meeting of the Club.

(c) The election of a candidate shall be void if the prescribed entrance fee be not paid within one month thereafter, unless the delay is justified to the satisfaction of the Committee.

(d) No more lady members shall be elected except as non-effective members under the provisions of clause (b) of this By-law.

By-law 8, with the exception of the proviso, is hereby repealed, and the following substituted:—

8. If any member neglect to pay the annual subscription when due, notice by prepaid letter shall be sent by post to him or his agent (if known), and if the subscription be not paid on or before the thirty-first day of October next following the due date, his name shall be erased from the list of members, and he shall cease to be a member of the Club.

"Member" shall be deemed to include a non-effective member (*mutatis mutandis*) in the preceding paragraph of this By-law, and also in By-laws 6, 13, 24A, 40, and 46.

The first proviso to By-law 47 is hereby repealed, and the following substituted:—

Provided that all male members of the Victoria Racing Club shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted to any part of the said land (with the exception of the second division), and to the Members' Carriage Paddock, with their carriages and horses, and motors, without payment of any of the above tolls and charges for admission. Lady members shall be entitled to the same privileges, except admission to the enclosures between "The Ring" and the Course proper.
