Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CARRIAGE BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applied on the 11th day of January, 1919, to the whole of the State.

Note:—Ans Determination appued on the 11th day of January, 1919, to the whole of the State.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—(a) Carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators) or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tires, rims, hubs, or spokes; (b) Motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions; and granted extended powers on the 30th November, 1910, by Order in Council, so that it may fix rates for any person "employed in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of tram cars, or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tires, rims, hubs, or spokes," has made the following Determination, viz.:—

(5) OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or for any work done within such hours in excess of 48 hours in any week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(6) Special Rayes.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
