COBRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918.

By-law No. 14.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1918 for water within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1918.

2. The minimum rates for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings, shall be Thirty shillings (30s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street; Queen-street, from Station-street to High-street; Main-street, from Station-street to High-street; Punt-road, from Station-street to High-street; Bank-street, from Punt-road to High-street; and High-street, from Queen-street to Vine-street, a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

5. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land not served with a water main, situated within half-a-mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be charged.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made, payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1918.

7. Where, in the opinion of the Trust, it is necessary that a meter be affixed to the water pipe supplying any allotment, house, or tenement, the same may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust, and the cost of same shall be repaid by the owner of such allotment, house, or tenement, but the Trust may submit such repayment to be made at the rate of Thirty-two shillings (32s.) yearly, payable by quarterly instalments, with interest added.

8. The Trust may require an approved meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement, in any case where it may deem necessary.

9. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

10. For water supplied by measure a charge of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

11. For water supplied to bowling greens or other public or semi-public grounds the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

THE GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-LAW No. 6.

THE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1917 which the occupiers or owners of lands tenements or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a main one quarter the beforementioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per one thousand gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1917.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

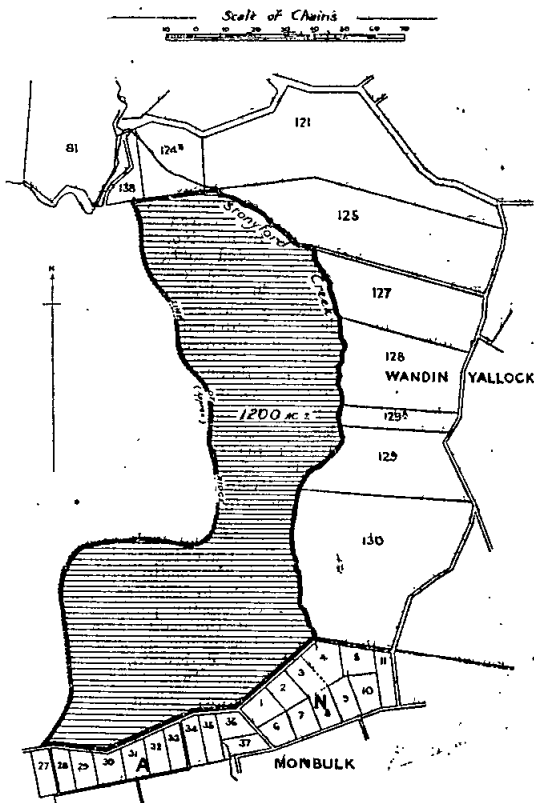

By-LAW No. 3.

RE CONCESSION FARES TO RETURNED SICK OR  
WOUNDED SOLDIERS OR SAILORS.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the *Tramway Board Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2818) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, the Tramway Board may from time to time make, rescind, revoke, amend, or vary by-laws for or with respect to the various matters mentioned in such section, including the prescribing of fares or charges which may be demanded or taken by the Board from passengers: And whereas the Board desires to amend or vary its By-law No. 1 by reducing in favour of returned sick or wounded soldiers or sailors who conform to the conditions from time to time prescribed by the Board the fares chargeable under such by-law: Now therefore the Board doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it as aforesaid, make the amendment or variation following (that is to say):—

TRAMWAY BOARD.

By-law No. 3.

On and after the 28th day of February, 1918, and until this By-law shall have been legally rescinded, revoked, amended, or varied the Board, notwithstanding the terms of the Board's By-law No. 1, may in respect of each route and section of route of cable tramway respectively set forth and defined in said By-law No. 1, accept from any and every passenger on all or any of the cable tramway routes or sections of routes so set forth and defined as aforesaid who shall be a returned sick or wounded soldier or sailor travelling in uniform, and who shall conform in all respects to the conditions and requirements from time to time prescribed by the Board, a special ticket, representing a fare of One penny per passenger for any single journey along any of the said cable tramway routes or sections of routes in lieu of the fare of Twopenny per passenger prescribed by the said By-law No. 1.

This licence, together with the receipt for the current year's fee, must be produced at all times when demanded, and must be produced to the Receiver whenever money is being tendered on account thereof.

## CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THIS LICENCE IS ISSUED.

1. The land described in this licence shall not be sublet without the consent, in writing, of the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Act 1915* (hereinafter referred to as the Minister).

2. This licence shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable or officer.

3. When the holder of the licence does any act not expressly authorized by the same, which, if it were done by a stranger, would be punishable as trespass, or if he fail to produce his licence when asked to do so by any bailiff of Crown lands or any police constable or forest officer, he shall be conclusively

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deemed to be a person not licensed or otherwise authorized to do such act within the meaning of the 153rd section of the *Land Act 1915*.

4. The non-observance or non-compliance with, or the non-performance of, any of the obligations or conditions specified in this licence shall render this licence null and void, and the Minister may thereupon cause the land in respect to which this licence has been granted to be re-entered upon and dealt with as unoccupied Crown land.

5. If, during the period for which this licence is issued, the Governor deem the resumption of the whole or any part of the land described in this licence necessary for public purposes, the Governor may resume possession of the land or of part thereof, without giving compensation to the licensee for so doing, at the expiration of three months after the licensee has been served with a notice under the seal of the Board of Land and Works of the intention to resume possession of the land, or of part thereof.

6. Any holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals or minerals or of a gold-mining or mineral lease shall have the right, and shall be allowed to enter upon the land and search for gold, silver, copper, tin, antimony, coal, and other metals and minerals, and mineral ores, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery within the area without making compensation to the licensee for surface or other damage, provided always that such portions of the land as shall be occupied by buildings shall be secure from such intrusion, unless with the consent of the licensee.

## SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

1. This licence is issued for the cutting and removal of eucalyptus leaves and twigs for the purpose of distillation at the registered oil-still of the licensee at

2. The work of cutting and removal shall be subject to the control of the District Forest Officer, and shall be carried out in sections, each section being properly cut over and cleaned up before another is entered on.

3. In cutting old mallee, peppermint, or other eucalyptus growth, the stems shall be cut close to the surface of the ground, and all waste stems not fit for sale as fuel, and *débris* shall be properly stacked, and burnt in safe weather only.

4. Old leaf growth may be cut and removed throughout the period covered by this licence, but new leaf or stool growth shall not be cut, clipped, or removed before the day of in each year, or while it is at a height less than inches from the surface of the ground. A second cutting of young leaf growth shall not be made in the same year.

5. Leaves and twigs removed under this licence from Crown lands shall not be mixed with leaves from private lands at any time before or during distillation.

6. Fire shall be used on the area for the burning of *débris* in safe weather only. The firing of live eucalyptus growth is forbidden.

7. The licensee and the proprietor of the still at which leaves are delivered shall keep a true and correct account of all leaves removed and delivered at the still under this licence.

8. The royalty payable to the Crown monthly on demand, under this licence, shall be One of a penny for each pound weight of oil distilled from the leaves. The licensee shall furnish to the District Forest Officer before the fifth day of each month a statement, signed by the proprietor of the still, showing the quantity of oil distilled during the preceding month from leaves obtained under this licence, and shall also furnish once in each quarter a statutory declaration setting forth the quantity of oil so distilled during the preceding quarter.

9. To insure proper work on the cutting area, the licensee shall lodge with the Forest Officer in charge a deposit of shillings ( s.) as surety.

10. The District Forest Officer may suspend the work of the licensee on the area for any breach of the special conditions of this licence till the Conservator of Forests deals with the case.

11. The Minister may at any time cancel this licence for any breach of its special conditions, and for any such breach may also forfeit the deposit made under it.

**REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION AND BETTER TRAINING OF MIDWIVES.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of February, 1918.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria  
Mr. Bowser | Mr. Oman  
Mr. Baird | Mr. Richardson.

THE Midwives Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Midwives Acts, doth make the following Regulations providing for the registration and better training of midwives, and for regulating their practices, that is to say:—

## SHORT TITLE.

These Regulations may be cited as the "Midwives Regulations 1918," and shall come into operation on the first day of March, 1918.

## REPEAL.

All Regulations heretofore made by the Midwives Board are hereby repealed.

**PART I.—REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.**

1. *Meetings.*—The Board shall from time to time appoint the day and hour when it will meet for the transaction of business, and the Chairman may at any time convene a meeting of the Board.

2. *Notice.*—Not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to each member of the Board directed to such address as he may from time to time furnish to the Registrar.

3. *Voting.*—Every question before the Board shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting, and the Chairman, in the event of an equality of votes, shall have a casting vote.

4. *Order of Business.*—The order of business shall be as follows:—

- (a) Minutes of last meeting.
- (b) Correspondence.
- (c) Consideration of applications for certificates of registration.
- (d) Consideration of reports and recommendations of Board of Examiners for certificates of registration.
- (e) Miscellaneous business.

Provided that the Board may at any meeting vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

5. *Conduct of Business.*—Business shall be transacted in the manner provided for Councils in Part XI of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

6. *Cheques.*—Cheques shall be signed by the Registrar and one member of the Board.

7. *Bank.*—Account to be kept at the State Savings Bank.

**PART II.—REGISTRATION OF MIDWIVES.**

1. No woman whatsoever is entitled to be registered unless she—

- (a) is at least 23 years of age; and
- (b) produces two certificates of good character in the prescribed form (Form H); and
- (c) has paid the prescribed registration fee of Five shillings.

2. Every woman claiming to be entitled to be registered shall make application in the form prescribed (Form J).

**REGISTRATION OF WOMEN ALREADY IN PRACTICE AT THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE ACT.**

3. Any woman who—

- (a) prior to December, 1915, held a certificate in midwifery from the Women's Hospital, Melbourne, or such other certificate as is approved by the Board; or
- (b) before the 1st day of January, 1919, produces evidence satisfactory to the Board that prior to December, 1915, she had been in *bonâ fide* practice as a midwife for at least two years within Victoria or any other State in the Commonwealth of Australia or the Dominion of New Zealand

is entitled to be registered.

4. Every woman applying for registration under the provisions of sub-clause (b) of the preceding clause shall send with her application evidence of *bonâ fide* practice in any or all of the prescribed forms (Forms K, K1, K2).

**REGISTRATION AFTER TRAINING AND EXAMINATION.**

5. Any woman who—

- (a) completes the prescribed course of training and passes the prescribed examinations; or
- (b) was, prior to December, 1915, being trained as a midwife at some hospital approved by the Board and at the date of application for examination has at that or some other hospital approved by the Board completed a period of training amounting to at least one year and has passed such examinations as the Board prescribes; or
- (c) before the 1st day of January, 1919, produces evidence satisfactory to the Board that prior to December, 1915, she had been in *bonâ fide* practice as a midwife for at least one year within Victoria or any other part of His Majesty's Dominions, and has passed such examination as the Board requires,

is entitled to be registered.

**REGISTRATION OF MILITARY NURSES.**

6. Any woman who has served outside of Victoria in the present war as a nurse with His Majesty's naval or military forces, or the naval or military forces of the Commonwealth, may apply for registration under the provisions of clause 3 (b) or clause 5 (c) at any time.

**RECIPROCAL REGISTRATION.**

7. Any woman who produces evidence satisfactory to the Board that she has been trained as a midwife and registered or certified in any other part of His Majesty's Dominions in which there is for the time being in force any Act or Ordinance for the registration and certification of midwives under a public authority and which admits to its roll or register midwives registered under this Act on reciprocal terms shall be entitled to be registered:

Provided that the standard of training and examination required in such other part of His Majesty's Dominions is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to the standard prescribed in pursuance of the Midwives Acts, Victoria.

**CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.**

8. Every woman who is entitled to be registered shall receive a certificate of registration (Form I), and her name shall be entered in the register.

**PART III.—TRAINING AND TRAINING HOSPITALS.****COURSE OF TRAINING.****SYSTEMATIC LECTURES.**

1. Systematic Lectures shall include the following courses:—

- (a) Midwifery (including elementary anatomy and physiology of the generative organs)—Twenty lectures.
- (b) Care and feeding of infants—Six lectures.
- (c) Invalid cookery—Six lectures, with demonstrations.
- (d) General nursing—Twelve lectures.

NOTE.—(a) (b) and (d) must be delivered by a legally qualified medical practitioner approved by the Board, and need not necessarily be directly associated with any hospital.

**Midwifery—**

Anatomy of the pelvis and female organs of generation.  
Physiology of conception and development, signs and symptoms of pregnancy.  
Hygiene and management of pregnancy.  
Diseases and complications of pregnancy.  
Abdominal pregnancy.

**PRACTICAL INSTRUCTION.**

2. Practical instruction shall include practical training—

- (a) in the duties of a midwife,
- (b) in the preparation of infants' foods,
- (c) in invalid cookery, and
- (d) in general nursing so far as it applies to lying-in women and infants.

**PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE.**

3. Every candidate for examination shall have—  
 (a) personally conducted at least twenty cases of labour; and  
 (b) nursed at least twenty patients during the ten days following labour.

**TRAINING HOSPITALS.**

4. Any public or private hospital in Victoria having not less than 100 midwifery cases per annum which fulfills the following requirements shall be eligible for recognition as a training hospital for the purpose of the Midwives Acts—

- (a) No private hospital shall be eligible for recognition unless the proprietor, occupier, or conductor thereof is approved by the Board.

(b) The teaching, other than that given by the medical practitioner to pupil nurses, shall be given only by a registered midwife who has received training in a recognised midwifery hospital, and has been approved by the Board.

(c) The training and instruction shall include the courses prescribed in Clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Part; and—

(1) In the case of a pupil nurse the period of training shall be not less than twelve months; and

(2) In the case of a nurse registered under any Act for the registration of nurses which may come into force in Victoria, or registered or eligible to be registered by the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses' Association as a trained nurse, the period of midwifery training shall be not less than six months: provided that such nurse shall be exempt from such of the prescribed courses as shall have been included in her training as a general nurse.

(d) Every pupil nurse prior to commencement of her training shall produce a certificate of education of the standard required of candidates for examination. (See Part IV., clause 3 (b)).

(e) A pupil nurse shall serve a probationary period of one month, and shall at the completion of such period obtain a medical certificate as to her physical fitness, and a certificate from the matron as to her general fitness to undergo the prescribed course of training.

(f) Every pupil nurse shall be required to personally conduct at least twenty cases of labour, and nurse at least twenty lying-in patients during the ten days following labour.

(g) Certificates in the prescribed form shall be issued to every pupil nurse who satisfactorily completes the prescribed courses of training. Certificates will not be considered satisfactory by the Board unless they show an attendance on at least three-fourths of the total number of lectures delivered in each course.

5. The manager or superintendent of the hospital shall supply before the 31st January of each year particulars for the preceding year in the prescribed form (Form A).

6. Any hospital outside of Victoria which provides a course of training and systematic instruction in theoretical and practical midwifery nursing equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed by the Board shall be eligible for recognition as a training hospital for midwifery.

**PART IV.—EXAMINATIONS.**

1. No woman shall be eligible to enter for any examination unless she—

- (a) is 23 years of age, and
- (b) has paid the prescribed examination fee.

2. Application for permission to sit at any examination shall be made in the form prescribed (Form B).

**EXAMINATION AFTER COMPLETION OF PRESCRIBED COURSE OF TRAINING.**

3. Every woman who applies for permission to sit at an examination after completion of prescribed courses of training shall produce evidence—

- (a) that she has completed the several courses of training and such evidence shall be in the forms prescribed (Forms C, D, E, F, G); and
- (b) that she has satisfactorily completed the certificate of merit standard of a primary school within the Commonwealth of Australia, or that she possesses an educational certificate equivalent to same, or otherwise satisfies the Board of her educational attainments.

4. The scope of the examination shall include the subjects prescribed in Part III.

**EXAMINATION OF WOMEN IN TRAINING AT THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE ACT.**

5. Any woman who was being trained at the commencement of the Act and who has complied with the requirements of Part II., clause 5 (b) is entitled to present herself for examination.

6. Every applicant for examination under the foregoing clause shall submit evidence that she has completed courses substantially equivalent to those prescribed in Part III.

7. Candidates for examination under this division shall be examined in the same manner as is prescribed for women who have completed the prescribed course of training.

## EXAMINATION AFTER TWELVE MONTHS' PRACTICE.

8. Any woman who has been in *bonâ fide* practice for twelve months under the conditions set out in Part II, clause 5 (c), is entitled to present herself for examination.

9. Applicants for examination under this division shall submit evidence of *bonâ fide* practice in any or all of the forms prescribed (Forms K, K1, K2).

10. The examination shall include such written and practical tests as will enable the examiners to determine whether the candidate is competent to carry out the duties of a midwife.

## PART V.—REGULATING THE PRACTICE OF MIDWIVES.

1. Every midwife who has been in attendance, whether as a midwife or as a nurse, upon a patient, or in contact with a person, suffering from any septic condition following childbirth or miscarriage or from any other condition supposed to be infectious, or is herself liable to be a source of infection, shall disinfect herself and her clothing and shall have all instruments and appliances sterilized.

2. No midwife in attendance on a septic case or having an inflamed or septic wound on her hand shall at the same time attend any other case of confinement until she has received permission from the Board to resume practice.

3. No midwife in charge of a case of labour shall leave the patient without giving an address by which she can be found without delay; and, after the commencement of the second stage, she shall stay with the patient until at least one hour after the expulsion of the placenta, and as long after that as may be necessary, in cases where a doctor has been sent for on account of the labour being abnormal or of there being threatened danger, she shall await his arrival and faithfully carry out his instructions.

4. Every midwife shall take and record the pulse and temperature of the patient twice daily, and oftener if necessary, and enter same on chart.

5. No midwife who has contracted any infectious disease shall attend any midwifery case until she has ceased to be liable to convey infection as certified to by a medical practitioner.

6. No midwife who has been in attendance on any person suffering from any septic condition following childbirth or from an infectious disease or who has been in contact with any person so suffering shall attend any midwifery cases until she has disinfected herself, clothing, instruments, and appliances in the manner prescribed in the "Rules and Instructions for the Guidance of Midwives"; nor until she has received the permission of the Board to resume practice.

7. Every midwife shall notify the Board in the prescribed form of her intention to practise as a midwife (Form L).

8. Every midwife shall, in the month of December of each year, notify the Board in the prescribed form of her intention to continue in practice (Form M), and shall at the same time pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence for renewal of registration.

9. Every midwife shall without delay notify the Board in the prescribed form of any change of her address (Form N).

10. Every midwife shall notify the Board in the prescribed form every case of death which occurs in her practice when no medical practitioner is in attendance (Form O).

11. Every midwife shall notify the Board in the prescribed form every case of still-birth which occurs in her practice when no medical practitioner is in attendance (Form P).

12. Every midwife shall allow any person authorized by the Board for the purpose to inspect her instruments and appliances.

13. Every midwife shall immediately report to the Board if she contract any infectious disease.

14. Every midwife shall immediately report to the Board if she has been in attendance on any case of infectious disease.

15. Every midwife shall keep a record of cases in the prescribed form (Form R), and such record shall be submitted for inspection to any person authorized by the Board to inspect same.

16. Every midwife shall carry out and obey the rules and instructions drawn up by the Midwives Board for regulating the practice of midwives and contained in the booklet issued by the Board entitled "Rules and Instructions for the Guidance of Midwives."

17. Any midwife who disobeys these Regulations or the rules or instructions specified in the above-mentioned booklet, or who is guilty of misconduct or malpractice, may be suspended from practice for such period as the Board orders, or her name may be removed from the Register by the order of the Board; but before the enforcement of any suspension or removal such midwife shall have the opportunity of giving an explanation either personally or in writing.

## PART VI.—EMERGENCIES.

1. In the case of an emergency as defined hereunder the midwife shall (where no medical practitioner engaged by or on behalf of the patient is in attendance) call in to her assistance a medical practitioner.

2. The midwife shall report forthwith to the Board each case of emergency in which she has called in a medical practitioner, and such report shall be in the form prescribed (Form S).

## EMERGENCIES.

I. *Pregnancy.*

In the case of a pregnant woman—

- (a) When abortion or miscarriage threatens or occurs;
- (b) if the patient is a dwarf or deformed;
- (c) when there is excessive loss of blood;
- (d) when there is any abnormality or complications such as—
  - excessive sickness,
  - puffiness of hands or face,
  - fits or convulsions,
  - dangerous varicose veins,
  - purulent discharge,
  - sores of the genitals.

II. *Labour.*

In the case of a woman in labour at or near term, when there is any abnormality or complication, such as—

- fits or convulsions;
- a purulent discharge;
- sores of the genitals;
- a malpresentation;
- presentation other than the uncomplicated head;
- when no presentation can be made out;
- where there is excessive bleeding;
- where, two hours after the birth of the child, the placenta and membranes have not been completely expelled;
- in cases of rupture of the perinæum, or of other injuries of the soft parts;
- in cases where labour has been prolonged more than 24 hours;
- where general condition of the patient is unsatisfactory.

III. *Lying-in.*

In the case of a lying-in woman, when there is any abnormality or complication, such as—

- fits or convulsions;
- abdominal swellings and tenderness;
- offensive lochia;
- rigor, with raised temperature;
- rise of temperature above 100.4° F. or quickening of pulse above 100 for more than 24 hours;
- unusual swelling of the breasts with local tenderness or pain;
- secondary post-partum hæmorrhage;
- white leg.

IV. *General.*

In all cases in which a woman during pregnancy, labour, or lying-in appears to be dying or dead.

V. *The Child.*

In the case of the child, when there is any abnormality or complication, including—

- injuries received during birth;
- any malformation or deformity in a child that seems likely to live;
- dangerous feebleness;
- inflammation of, or discharge from, the eyes, however slight;
- serious skin eruptions;
- inflammation about, or hæmorrhage from, the navel.

**PART VII.—FEES.****FEES RELATING TO EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION.**

1. The fee to be paid by each candidate for examination shall be One guinea for the first examination and Five shillings for every subsequent examination.
2. The fee to be paid by each applicant for registration shall be Five shillings.
3. The fee to be paid for annual renewal of registration shall be Two shillings and sixpence.

**REMUNERATION OF EXAMINERS.**

4. The remuneration which shall be paid to the examining body conducting the examinations shall be Ten shillings for each candidate examined.

**BATHING HORSES AT ST. KILDA.—ALTERATION TO PORT RULE.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the powers in that behalf contained in Part II. of the *Marine Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2688), hereby repeal Regulation 57 for Ports in Victoria having reference to Bathing of Horses at St. Kilda, which Regulation was made by Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of March, 1916, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th April, 1916, page 1498, and do substitute the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

57. Bathing of horses from any part of the foreshore extending from St. Kilda Pier to Point Ormond is prohibited, except in that portion of the sea to the north of the Dinghy Pier where bathing of horses will be permitted on days other than Sundays and public holidays before the hour of Nine (9) o'clock a.m. On Sundays and public holidays bathing of horses under any circumstances is prohibited. Horses must be taken into and from the water between a line being a continuation of the north side of Brook's boat-house and a line parallel to and 50 feet north thereof.

After the horses have been taken into the sea for a distance of 200 feet from high-water mark they may be bathed in that portion of the sea to the north of the Dinghy Pier, but must not be allowed to approach within 200 feet of high-water mark on any part of the foreshore.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN RESERVES IN OR NEAR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WARRNAMBOOL.

THE Council of the Town of Warrnambool, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve specified hereunder (hereinafter called the "Reserves" having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 20th October, 1879, as a site for Public purposes in the parish of Yangery.

The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 28th April, 1873, for the purpose of being sown and planted to prevent the irruption of sand in the parish of Yangery, near Warrnambool (excepting the portion thereof under the control as a Committee of Management of the Warrnambool Shire Council).

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 2nd August, 1875, as diminished by Orders in Council of 3rd September, 1888, and 12th April, 1900, as a site for Public purposes in the town of Warrnambool.

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 5th March, 1889, in the town of Warrnambool, as a site for a Nursery for Trees and Shrubs.

The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 7th October, 1889, as a site for Public Recreation in the town of Warrnambool.

The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 17th October, 1881, as a site for Public Recreation in the municipal district of Warrnambool.

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 27th October, 1890, as a site for an Ornamental Plantation in the town of Warrnambool.

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 8th May, 1882, as a site for Public purposes in the municipal district of Warrnambool.

The land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 27th September, 1897, as a site for Botanical Gardens in the town of Warrnambool.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, seats, gates, or erections in any of the Reserves, or put offensive matter in the water troughs or reservoirs therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in any of the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the consent of the Council in writing.

5. No person shall put in any of the Reserves any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority of the Council in writing.

6. No person shall engage in any game or sports in any of the Reserves on Sunday.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in any of the Reserves or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein, which may be enclosed for plantations of trees and shrubs.

9. No person or persons shall conduct, hold or cause to be held or conducted any political, religious, or other gathering or meeting of persons in any of the Reserves, without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

10. No person shall speak, lecture, address, or harangue upon any political, religious, or other subject, nor shall any person play upon any instrument or make any unseemly noise in any of the Reserves, without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

## SHIRE OF RIPON.

## By-Law No. 21.

A By-law of the Shire of Ripon, made under Part XXVII of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 21, for the regulating and management and use of the Public Baths, Beaufort, within the said shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon order as follows:—

1. The Council shall have power from time to time to regulate the fees to be paid for the use of the baths.
2. No person shall spit in the swimming baths, or on the floor or any wall of the dressing sheds.
3. No person shall deface any wall of the dressing sheds or bath by writing or drawing thereon, or in any way damage or injure any wall, partition, or other structure forming part of the baths.
4. No person shall use obscene, indecent, or offensive language in the baths.
5. No person shall use soap in the swimming basin.
6. No person who, in the opinion of any member of the Committee or officer of the Council, is under the influence of intoxicating liquors shall use the baths, or remain on the baths premises when directed to withdraw.
7. No person shall throw any live or dead animal into the baths, or deposit any dirt, filth, or rubbish in or near the baths.
8. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the baths by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the baths when required to do so.
9. No person shall use the baths unless dressed in a two-piece costume, known as the Canadian costume.
10. No person in charge of any dog shall allow such dog to enter the water.
11. No person shall resort to or use the baths while suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
12. Every person using the baths shall obey the reasonable directions of any member of the Committee, or any officer of the Council.

13. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break, or injure, or improperly interfere with the efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, or pipe in connexion with the baths.

14. The council shall have power from time to time to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper management of the baths.

15. No person shall wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water in the baths.

16. The hours for bathing shall be as follows:—

Females—

Monday and Friday, till 10 a.m., and from 6.30 p.m.

Wednesday, till 10 a.m.

Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 6.30 p.m.

Males—

Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday, till 10 a.m., and from 6.30 p.m.

Monday and Friday, from 10 a.m. to 6.30 p.m.

Sunday morning, till 9 o'clock.

Family Day—

Wednesday, from 10 a.m.

17. If any person commit any offence against any provision of this By-law, or by wilful act or default contrary thereto contravenes any such provision, he shall be liable on conviction for a first offence to a maximum penalty of Ten pounds, and for any second or subsequent offence to a maximum penalty of Twenty pounds, or a minimum penalty of Two pounds.

#### YARRAM AND DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

BY-LAWS.

Object.

THE institution is established for the purpose of affording surgical and medical aid to sick persons in destitute circumstances, and to others upon such terms of payment as shall be determined upon by the Board of Management.

Governors and their Privileges.

Contributors of £1 and upward per annum shall be entitled to recommend one in-patient and one out-patient for every One pound contributed during the year.

Every contributor of £20 or upwards of his own money shall be a life governor, and every person who shall raise by one or more collections in one year the sum of £20 or upwards, from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum, shall also be a life governor, but no person shall be considered to have raised £20 unless he has obtained such sum by his own voluntary exertions. Any registered friendly society, trading or mining company, club or other association, and minister or governing body of a church donating £20 or upwards in one sum, and any committee or giver of a fête or entertainment resulting in £20 or upwards being added to the hospital funds, may nominate any member of such institution or committee an honorary life governor in return therefor.

The executor first named in a will under which £50 is bequeathed to the hospital, and any person who has, in the opinion of the Board of Management, conferred some signal benefit upon the hospital, irrespective of contribution, may be also elected a life governor. Life governors shall be entitled to recommend three in-patients and six out-patients annually.

Honorary life governors shall not be entitled to a vote at any meeting of contributors or to a seat on the Board of Management, but shall be entitled to recommend for admission to the hospital one in-patient and two out-patients every year.

Every annual subscriber of £1 shall have one vote at all meetings of contributors, every annual subscriber of £5 two votes, and of £10 three votes. Every life governor shall have for life one vote for £20, two for £40, and three for £50.

Every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within one month from date of payment.

The privileges of contributors shall be suspended until all arrears are paid.

Board of Management.

The administration of the affairs of the hospital shall be intrusted to a Board of Management, which shall consist of nine members (five to form a quorum), who shall be elected by the contributors at the annual meeting. At its first meeting the Board shall elect from amongst its members a president, vice-president, and hon. treasurer, who shall be *ex officio* members of all sub-committees.

On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year the one-third part of the elected members of the Board shall go out of office, but may be, nevertheless, re-elected, and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be decided by lot.

If any member of the Board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the secretary, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent without permission of the Board for four consecutive meetings, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the Board may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor, until the next annual meeting, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election. Except as hereinafter provided, all contributors shall be capable of being elected as officers of the hospital or as members of the Board.

The Board shall meet for general business at least once in each month, on such dates and at such time as they may fix, and for special purposes at such times as may be requisite.

No paid officer of the hospital shall enter into a business contract with the Board directly or indirectly; no member of the Board shall be present at the discussion of, or vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

The Board of Management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the hospital—the same not being repugnant to the general rules—present a report to the annual meetings, and manage the affairs of the institution generally.

Should vacancies occur in the office of auditors during the year, the Board shall fill such vacancies for the remainder of the year.

No proposition for rescinding any previous decision of the Board of Management shall be entertained unless notice thereof shall be given in writing to the secretary one week prior to the meeting at which the same is to be considered, and the secretary shall supply a copy of every such notice in the circular convening the meeting.

The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by the authority of the Board of Management and in the presence of at least two of the members of such Board and the secretary.

#### *Meetings of Contributors.*

The annual meeting of the contributors to the hospital shall be held on the last Friday of the month of July in every year, for the following purposes:—

To receive and adopt the annual report and balance-sheet.

To elect honorary consulting medical officers and two auditors.

To elect members to fill vacancies on the Board of Management.

To transact any other business of which due notice shall have been given.

At all general meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum be present, the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within one hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned until the following week at the same day and hour.

It shall be competent for the Board of Management, or any ten or more contributors by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every meeting shall be called by the secretary or three members of the Board.

All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot, and every person voting shall vote for the full number required for the election, else the voting-paper shall be invalid.

#### *Honorary Treasurer.*

The duties of the honorary treasurer shall be to receive all moneys from the secretary or collector, the Government, and others, and deposit same in such bank as the Board of Management shall from time to time direct, and shall cause the different sums so deposited to be paid to the account of the Yarram and District Hospital. Except for petty cash disbursements, payments shall be made by cheque only, drawn by the treasurer and countersigned by the secretary, but in no case shall any cheque be issued until the amount in respect of which it is issued has been passed by the Board of Management.

#### *Finance Committee.*

There shall be a finance committee appointed by the Board of Management, to consist of two members and the treasurer, who shall examine all accounts prior to the monthly meeting, and certify as to their correctness—two members to form a quorum. In the event of the finance committee not having passed the accounts prior to such meeting, the committee shall have the power to appoint two of the members present to examine the accounts, and upon their reports the said accounts shall be dealt with by the committee. The visiting committee may from time to time be appointed to act as a finance committee if the Board of Management shall so think fit.

#### *Secretary.*

The secretary shall convene, by direction of the president, all special, general, and committee meetings. The secretary shall attend and take minutes of the proceedings, and transcribe them into books kept for that purpose; and he shall carry out the directions of such meetings in the particulars incident to his department. He shall receive subscriptions to the institution, and in all cases give receipts for such contributions, and pay over the same to the treasurer once in every fortnight, and render accounts of the amounts received by him since the last payment; and shall provide a guarantee of some approved society to the amount of £100 for the faithful discharge of his duties.

He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical business of his department, and he shall enter and keep the accounts of the institution under the direction of the Board; he shall compile all reports that may be ordered by the Board, fill up all cheques, and perform the clerical duties connected with the office of treasurer.

#### *Auditors.*

The annual meeting of contributors held in July shall elect two auditors, who shall not be members of the Board of Management, for the current year.

The auditors shall, at the end of the year, examine the treasurer's financial statement, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting.

#### *Visiting Committee.*

The Board of Management shall choose from amongst themselves every three months a visiting committee of three, who shall meet on such days and such hours each week as they shall appoint; and have the power to audit the house accounts, and, if necessary, suspend servants, and temporarily appoint others in their places and report thereon to the Board of Management; also to offer any suggestions as to necessary repairs, alterations, and improvements or general management of the institution.

#### *Patients.*

Every person claiming the benefit of the hospital, whether as an outdoor or indoor patient, must produce a recommendation from a contributor. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no person insane or having a contagious, infectious, or other disease which, in the opinion of the honorary medical officers, ought not to come within the operation of the charity, shall be admitted to the hospital as an in-patient, nor any person who, in their opinion, may receive equal benefit as an out-patient.

Accidents, however, and such cases of decided emergency as, in the opinion of a medical officer, admit not of delay, may be attended to and, if necessary, admitted at any time, whether recommended by a contributor or not.

Except in cases of accident or decided emergency, indoor patients shall only be admitted before twelve o'clock noon.

In the absence of satisfactory reasons to the contrary being offered to the visiting committee, no person shall be allowed to remain in the hospital who, in the opinion of the medical staff, may receive equal benefit as an out-patient.

Every person obtaining the benefits of the institution under a plea, expressed or implied, of destitution, who shall, in the estimation of the Board of Management (upon a representation being made to them of the fact), be able to pay for such benefits, shall be liable for the same after a rate to be fixed by the Board of Management, and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the hospital, and able, in the estimation of the Board of Management, to pay for them, shall also be required to pay for the same.

The Board of Management shall, if necessary, make provision for the reception and treatment of patients labouring under contagious, infectious, or other diseases excluded under previous clause on the hospital grounds, but at a suitable and safe distance from the hospital itself.

Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the medical officer, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately, in the presence of the nurse of the ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the house committee at each meeting.

Patients not paying full hospital fees, deemed able by the medical officer to assist in the work of the hospital staff, shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

The Board of Management, subject to the approval of a medical officer, may from time to time make, amend, and rescind regulations—

- (a) For the conduct of patients.
- (b) For the treatment of out-patients.
- (c) For the admission of visitors.
- (d) For the admission of clergymen and religious instructors.

Such regulations shall be posted in the wards and hung at the hospital door.

#### *Medical Officers.*

The honorary medical officers shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, and shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors.

There shall be two or more honorary medical officers, as the annual meeting may from time to time determine, and the Board may fill any vacancy during the year until the next annual meeting.

The honorary medical officers shall have access to the hospital at all times. They shall perform all surgical operations, in such order as may be agreed upon amongst themselves, but no such operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of as many of the medical officers as can be obtained, except in cases of emergency, and they shall regularly consult in cases of importance or protracted continuance of a patient in the hospital.

#### *Alteration of Rules.*
