**NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RESTRICT THE METHODS
OF FISHING IN INLAND AND CERTAIN OTHER
WATERS.**

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a proclamation for the following purposes:—

1. Revoking the proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of April, 1908, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the sixth day of May, 1908 (Restricting Methods of Taking Fish).

2. Prohibiting fishing or the taking of fish by any method or in any manner except by rod and line or hand line, with not more than two hooks attached, from inland waters, and also other waters in which netting is or may be hereafter prohibited; provided that (a) the hooks forming part of each spinner spoon flash or other artificial bait shall be considered as one hook; and (b) a rod and line or hand line with more than two hooks attached may be used in sea waters and other waters directly affected by tidal influence.

The Health Act 1915.
SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.
BY-LAW No. 28.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the Health Act 1915, the Council of the Shire of Lillydale, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises situated in the following streets and roads in the Shire of Lillydale shall provide a sufficient number of receptacles of rigid metal (preferably of galvanized iron), and each of a capacity not exceeding 2 cubic feet, for the reception of the garbage and refuse arising from such tenement or premises, and shall cause every such receptacle to be furnished with a cover fitting as closely as practicable, and shall keep such receptacle continuously covered save when garbage or refuse is being deposited in or discharged from the same, and shall keep every such receptacle and cover as clean as practicable and in good order and condition, and shall place such receptacle in the yard of such tenement or premises, close to the entrance thereof from the street, land, or right-of-way on such day in each week as may be specified in any notice to that effect given by the Council, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged by the person or persons authorized or appointed by the Council:—

Main-street, from Cave Hill-road to Warburton Railway Bridge. Anderson-street, from Main-street to Creek-road. Castella-street. Clarke-street, from Hardy-street to Jones-street. Hermitage-street. Deschamps-avenue. Bellevue-street. Creek-road, from Clarke-street to Jones-street. Jones-street, from Creek-road to Clarke-street. Cave Hill-road, from Slevin-street to railway crossing. John-street, from Olinda Creek to Cave Hill-road. Hardy-street, from

Anderson-street to Clarke-street. White Horse-road, from Dublin-road to New-street. Warrandyte-road, from White Horse-road to Wonga-road. Mullum-road, from Warrandyte-road to Whitechurch-road. Adelaide-street. Ringwood-street. Bedford-road, between the railway crossings. Willanna-street. Station-street. Wantirna-road, from White Horse-road to City-road. Pit-street. Greenwood-avenue. Oxford-road, from Bayswater-road to Croydon-road. Croydon-road, from Oxford-road to Smith-street. Smith-street, from Croydon-road to railway line. Lacey-street. Hewish-road, from Croydon-road to Dorset-road. Toorak-street.

4. No receptacle shall be placed in or on any street, lane, or right-of-way, but will be removed from inside the yards or premises.

5. Every person who shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

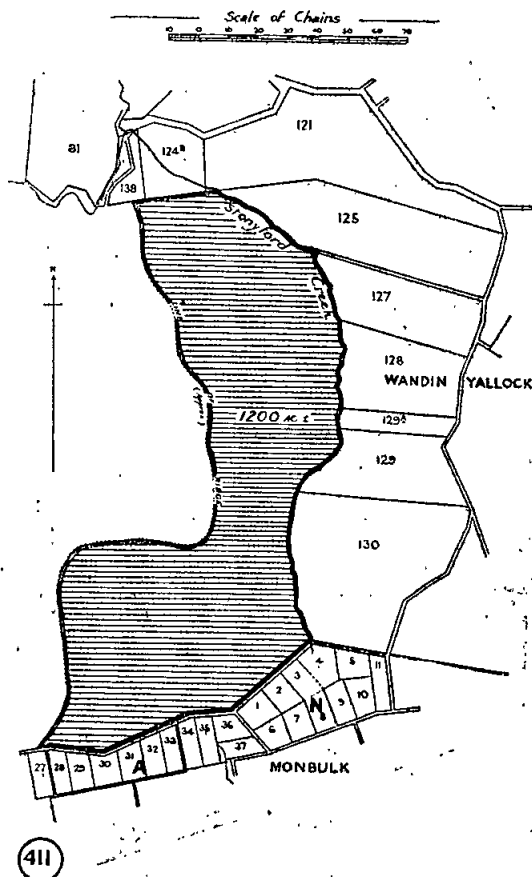

REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Poisons Act 1915*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Poisons Regulations 1918*, and shall be read and construed as one with the *Poisons Regulations 1917* (hereinafter called the *Principal Regulations*).

2. After clause 13 of the *Principal Regulations* the following new clause is inserted:—

13A. In the case of liquid disinfectants consisting of or containing poison such disinfectants may be sold or offered for sale in round tins securely sealed and having a rounded pyramid-shaped or domed top provided that above the principal label on such tins or cans the words "Not to be taken" are embossed or are painted or branded in red letters of not less than twelve points face measurement bold sans-serif capital type and that down the sides of such tins or cans the word "Poison" is painted or branded or embossed in two places in red letters of not less than thirty points face measurement bold sans-serif capital type.

3. After sub-clause (b) of clause 23 of the *Principal Regulations* the following new sub-clause is inserted, which may be cited as sub-clause (c) of that clause:—

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 23 (b) if the substance be sold in liquid form it may be delivered in round tins or cans securely sealed and having a rounded pyramid-shaped or domed top provided that above the principal label the words "Not to be taken" are embossed or are painted or branded in red letters of not less than twelve points face measurement bold sans-serif capital type and that down the sides of such tins or cans the word "Poisonous" is painted or branded or embossed in two places in red letters of not less than thirty points face measurement bold sans-serif capital type.

And the Honorable John Bowser, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2686), sections 472 and 473, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Ripon has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets within the said shire, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situated within the Shire of Ripon aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. —
