PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is herein after set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and forty-five thousand two hundred and four pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and seventeen and One thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RESTRICT THE METHODS OF FISHING IN INLAND AND CERTAIN OTHER WATERS.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a proclamation for the following purposes:—

1. Revoking the proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of April, 1908, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the sixth day of May, 1908 (Restricting Methods of Taking Fish).
2. Prohibiting fishing or the taking of fish by any method or in any manner except by rod and line or hand line, with not more than two hooks attached, from inland waters, and also other waters in which netting is or may be hereafter prohibited; provided that (a) the hooks forming part of each spinner spoon flash or other artificial bait shall be considered as one hook; and (b) a rod and line or hand line with more than two hooks attached may be used in sea waters and other waters directly affected by tidal influence.

VIOLET TOWN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918.

THE Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Rating By-law:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, supplied otherwise than by meter, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated, for one year commencing the first day of January, 1918, and ending the thirty-first day of December, 1918.
2. The sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.) shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid for the year 1918 by every occupier or owner of any land or tenement liable to be rated by the Violet Town Waterworks Trust.
3. For every house or tenement supplied by measure the charge for the water so supplied shall be One shilling per thousand gallons up to twenty-five thousand gallons, or up to an amount equal to the sum which would have been imposed and levied as aforesaid, whichever shall be greater, and for all water supplied over and above such maximum amount, the rate per thousand gallons shall be increased by One shilling for the first thousand gallons, Two shillings for the second thousand gallons, and so on.
4. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in one sum, on the first day of January, 1918.
5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a 'clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply or of this By-law or any By-law of the Trust.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

4. No person shall lay down a pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes at Twenty pounds (£20), or under; and

(b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Nine o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or before the hour of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water trough, or private or public water service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. Every person upon whose premises a water trough stands shall keep such trough provided with a ball tap, and shall keep such water trough and ball tap at all times in a state of thorough repair. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation, wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, or at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under clause seven (7) hereof. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under the Water Acts, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply.

14. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this By-law; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

15. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

16. The By-law made by the Trust on the twenty-first day of November, 1916, relating to water supply is hereby repealed.

The foregoing By-law relating to water supply was made by the Chairman and the Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust on the evening of Tuesday, the twentieth day of November, 1917.
