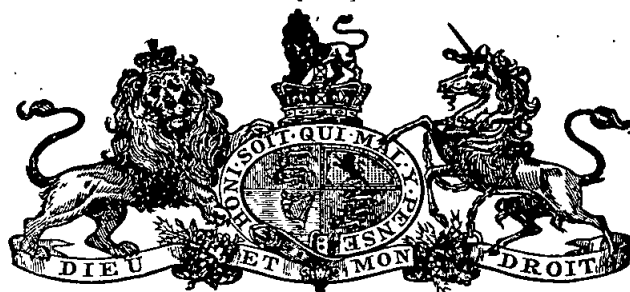

## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IT THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to make provision for a special loan of One hundred thousand pounds for certain purposes under the *Country Roads Act 1915*."
- "An Act to amend the Geelong Harbor Trust Acts and for other purposes."
- "An Act to apportion and extend the Time for the Repayments into 'The Public Account' of certain moneys advanced or to be advanced under the *Railways Advances Act 1912*, the *Railways Advances Act 1914* (No. 2), and the *Railways Advances Act 1915*."
- "An Act to amend section three of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1916*."
- "An Act relating to the Generation Use and Supply of Electricity by the Victorian Railways Commissioners."
- "An Act to sanction the issue and application of certain sums of money available under Loan Acts for Railways and for other purposes."
- "An Act to make provision for Developmental Roads and to amend the *Country Roads Acts*."
- "An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and to appropriate the supplies granted in this and the last preceding session of Parliament."

## Health Act 1915.

## SHIRE OF BENALLA.

## BY-LAW NO. 16.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Benalla, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Devenish and Baddaginnie.
4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.
8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.
9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Forrest-Apollo Bay-road in the shires of Colac and Winchelsea (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of April, 1914, on pages 1546 and 1547) should be made by the said Board. And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared maps and plans marked A, B, C, and D respectively, and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. And whereas on an inspection of the said maps and plans and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

"A." Commencing at a point on the north-eastern boundary of allotment 12, parish of Barramunga, south 64 deg. 36 min. east 987.5 links from the most northerly angle of the allotment; thence south 64 deg. 36 min. east 628.3 links; thence south 55 deg. 7 min. east 607.1 links; thence north 86 deg. 8 min. west 559 links; thence north 46 deg. 12 min. west 212 links; thence north 39 deg. 20 min. west 559.3 links to the point of commencement.

"B." Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of allotment 17, parish of Barramunga, distant about 28 chains from its south-western angle; thence easterly and south-easterly through the allotment to a point on its southern boundary, distant about 596 links from its south-western angle.

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 3, section 1, parish of Olangolah, distant south 81 deg. 56 min. east 232.8 links from an angle formed by road lines bearing south 35 deg. 29 min. east and south 81 deg. 56 min. east; thence easterly and southerly through this allotment and southerly and south-westerly through allotment 2 of section 1 to a point on the southern boundary of the last-named allotment, distant south 89 deg. 20 min. west 1,489.9 links from the south-eastern angle thereof.

"J." Commencing at a point on the western boundary of allotment 16, parish of Wongarra, south 19 deg. 47 min. west 171 links from its north-western angle; thence south-easterly through this allotment and south-easterly and southerly through allotment 16A of the same parish to a point on the western boundary of the last-named allotment, distant north 40 deg. 37 min. west 141 links from its south-western angle.

"N." Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 3, section 3A, parish of Krambruk, distant south 89 deg. 1 min. west 70 links from its north-eastern angle; thence south-westerly through allotments 3, 4, and 5 of section 3A, southerly through allotments 6, 7, 8, and 9 of section 3A, and south-easterly through allotments 10 and 11 of section 3, all in the parish of Krambruk, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 35 (1) (a) of the *Forests Act 1915* (No. 2655), doth by this Order approve of the Amendments to the Reserved Forests Saw-milling Leasing Regulations 1916 as set out hereunder:—

Number of Clause of Schedule.	Nature of Amendment.
Clause 12 ..	In clause 12 the word "four" shall be repealed, and there shall be substituted therefor the word "six."
Clause 14 ..	In clause 14 the word "only" where it first occurs shall be repealed, and at the end of the clause there shall be inserted the following paragraph:— "No timber shall be split or hewn on a saw-milling lease area except on the written application of the lessee occupying such area, and with the approval of and subject to a licence issued by the Conservator."
Clause 15 (6) ..	In sub-clause (6) of clause 15 the word "four" shall be repealed, and there shall be substituted therefor the word "six."
Clause 15 (7) ..	At the end of sub-clause (7) of clause 15 there shall be inserted the following paragraph:— "In the event of a dispute on this subject the lessee may appeal to the Minister, whose decision shall be final."
Clause 15 (23) ..	In sub-clause (23) of clause 15, before the word "officer" there shall be inserted the word "special."
Clause 18 ..	For clause 18 there shall be substituted the following clause:— "18. Timber necessary for the construction and maintenance of the saw-mill or other buildings on the approved mill site or for tramways, bridges, or culverts shall be cut under licence-free of royalty; but timber used in the construction and maintenance of rent-earning buildings shall be subject to the payment of royalty according to the kind, species, or classes of timber used."
Third Schedule ..	In the Third Schedule (being the form of lease prescribed by the Regulations) for the clause next following the redendum clause, commencing with the words "In the case of trees or timber cut" and ending with the words "not in the square," there shall be substituted the following clause:— "In the case of trees or timber cut during the three years commencing from the date of these presents at the rate of per hundred feet superficial measured in the square, and in the case of trees or timber cut during the four successive years completing the term of its lease at the rate of per hundred feet superficial measured in the square. Provided nevertheless that in either case if the Conservator be of opinion that the lessee in any instance is not utilizing or cutting the timber to the best advantage, or is wasting or has unduly wasted timber of any commercial value, in either such cases the royalty so payable in respect of any tree or trees so dealt with shall be based on measurement in the round or log and not in the square." In the Third Schedule in the clause following the one last referred to, the words in the first four lines and the three words following in the fifth line shall be repealed, namely, the words in the paragraph commencing with the words "In the case of trees," and ending with the words "the said Act."

## Third Schedule—continued.

The word "and" following shall be the opening word of a new paragraph.

In the Third Schedule in the paragraph numbered 4 the word "four" shall be repealed, and there shall be substituted therefor the word "six."

In the Third Schedule, in the paragraph numbered 5, at the end thereof, there shall be inserted the following proviso:—

"Provided that in the event of a dispute on this subject the lessee may appeal to the Minister, whose decision shall be final."

In the Third Schedule, in the paragraph numbered 6, the word "four" shall be repealed, and there shall be substituted therefor the word "six."

In the Third Schedule, in the paragraph numbered 21, before the word "officer" there shall be inserted the word "special."

## REGULATIONS FOR TRANSFERRING PERSONS DETAINED FOR TREATMENT FROM ONE PROCLAIMED OR PRESCRIBED PLACE OF DETENTION TO ANOTHER.

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Venereal Diseases Act 1916* to make Regulations generally in respect of matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out the provisions of the Act, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Venereal Diseases Regulations 1918, and shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of March, 1918.

2. In these Regulations:—

"Minister" means the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Venereal Diseases Act 1916*.

"Prescribed Place" means any place prescribed under Part I. of the Act, or by Regulations under such Part, as one in which persons may under the Act be detained for treatment, as well as any hospital or ward proclaimed under section 4 of the Act.

3. The Minister may by writing under his hand from time to time, on the request of a person detained in a prescribed place to be removed to another prescribed place, cause such person to be so removed. Upon such removal every such person shall be subject to be detained in the prescribed place to which he is removed until due for release, unless in the meantime he be sooner discharged or removed.

4. In the case of a person detained by virtue of an Order made under section 14 of the Act who has been removed by direction of the Minister under the last preceding clause to a prescribed place different from a prescribed place where persons under sentence are detained, the Minister may from time to time, by Order under his hand, though no request has been made by the person concerned to be so removed, remove such person from the prescribed place where he then is to any other prescribed place whatsoever in which place he shall be detained (unless again removed as provided in the last preceding clause) until he is cured or is free from venereal disease, or ceases to be liable to convey infection.

**W**HEREAS petitions have been forwarded to the Minister praying for the proclamation of Mallee Victuallers' Licence Areas and for the granting of Mallee Victuallers' Licences therein and setting out the boundaries of such areas as set out hereunder, and whereas the Minister has referred

the said petitions to the Licensing Court, and the said Court has reported to the Minister that it has held inquiries as to the requirements of the public with regard to licensed victuallers' premises in the localities within and adjacent to such areas, and has satisfied itself that in each of the areas set out hereunder there reside not less than five hundred persons enrolled as electors for the Legislative Assembly, and that the majority of the persons aforesaid have signed the respective petitions, and the said Court has recommended that the prayer of the said petitions be granted, and whereas pursuant to the provisions of section 50 of Act No. 2855 the Governor in Council may proclaim the aforesaid areas for the purposes of said section. Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do proclaim the Mallee Victuallers' Licence Areas as set out hereunder for the purposes of the aforesaid section:—

**MERBEIN AREA.**

*Boundaries of Area.*

All that land which, with the boundaries thereof, is delineated in the published plan of homestead allotments, White Cliffs Irrigation Settlement, parish of Merbein, county of Karkaroc, signed by Alex. D. Thomson, authorized surveyor, and dated 7.3.10, together with the adjoining land lying between the northern boundary of the first-mentioned land delineated in the said plan and the River Murray. And also so much of the land in the State of Victoria within a radius of 60 chains of the centre of the site of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission's pumping station at Merbein as is not included in the land hereinbefore described.

**MILDURA AREA.**

*Boundaries of Area.*

All that land within the boundaries of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust on the north-west side of a line drawn along the centre of Deakin-avenue, Mildura, which boundaries are set out in the First Schedule to the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895*, being Act number 1409 of the State (then the Colony) of Victoria.

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by the *Land Act 1915* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor, in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1915*; but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1915* aforesaid, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1915* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

Each tender must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 2½ per cent. of total of tender submitted.

The prices must be expressed without alterations or erasures, and the total amount of the tender must be stated.

*Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule and the rates charged are considered reasonable.*

The tenderers must state where the supplies have been, or are to be, manufactured.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown and designated in the conditions of tendering.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Printing Paper," or as the case may be, and must be deposited in the Tender-box, at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or if sent by post, must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. As regards supplies of articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, no sub-letting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; and every person engaged in the manufacture, delivery, &c., of the articles contracted for shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by Wages Boards under the Factories and Shops Act, and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which supplies are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

3. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

4. The Government will order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

5. The first delivery under this contract—three months' supply based on the requirements for one year—shall be made not later than 2nd September, 1918. The contractor shall, in addition, hold and keep in Melbourne a reserve stock or stocks equal to one-fourth of the requirements for one year as set out in the schedule. The Government Printer may at any time require, and shall be entitled to receive, delivery of the whole or any portion of such reserve stock or stocks to meet his requirements. In the event of the Government Printer requiring and receiving delivery of such reserve stock or stocks, or any portion thereof, the contractor shall within a reasonable time, but not exceeding four months, replace and make good such reserve stock, or stocks, or the portion thereof delivered to the Government Printer as aforesaid. The Government Printer shall at any time be entitled to call upon the contractor to satisfy, and the contractor being so called upon shall satisfy, the Government Printer that he holds all reserve stock or stocks that he is required or bound to hold in terms of conditions of tender.

6. The supplies are to be the same as sample and in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders.

7. The value of all packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or net, all wharfage fees and duty of Customs must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender: all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, wrappings, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

8. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same, setting out the order number and particulars of the supply, together with an invoice in duplicate, to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores tendered by him. The contractor shall also furnish a statement at the end of each month setting forth deliveries during the month, and the total money value of same. Arrangements as to time and place of delivery and of inspection of goods will be made by the Government Printer or such other officer as he may appoint.

9. Orders must receive prompt execution in terms of contract; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the Government Printer, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

10. The articles supplied under every item or group of items shall in respect of quality, shape, and (when only one size is specified) size, be in accordance with the sample or samples exhibited by the Tender Board to the contractor when tendering. Any samples furnished by the contractor shall become the property of the Government.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 9.

12. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, for each and every default as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clause 9. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

14.
