PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George ; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands adjourned until Tuesday, the sixteenth day of April, 1918 : Now, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the fourteenth day of May, 1918.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
