### Marine Act 1915.

### AMENDED LIMITS AND SCALES OF PILOTAGE RATES.

THE Marine Board of Victoria, under Section 79 of the Marine Act 1915, with the approval of the Governor in Council, having authority from time to time to fix or increase within the limits indicated in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act the rates of pilotage on ships in connexion with the services referred to in such section and deeming it desirable to increase the pilotage rates in respect of the several services referred to in certain Determinations heretofore made under the authority aforesaid, and at the same time also deeming it desirable that the rates dealing with all the services set out in the Schedule hereto should be contained in a single Determination, doth now under all powers it enabling in that behalf and with the approval of the Governor in Council fix as on and from the date of the coming into operation of this Determination for the respective services specified in the Schedule (whether the same be by way of increase or not), the several rates of pilotage in the Schedule below set out in supersession for the pilotage rates fixed for the like services under Determinations heretofore in force.

- 1. The Determination shall take effect on and from the first day of the next succeeding calendar month following the date of the Government Gazette wherein it is published if such day be not less than fourteen days from the date of the said Gazette, but if such day be less than fourteen days distant from the said Gazette date then on and from but not before the first day of the calendar month next but one after the month in which these presents are gazetted.
- 2. From and after the date appointed for this Determination to take effect all previous Determinations fixing the limits and rates of pilotage in connexion with the ports named or referred to in the under-written Schedule shall be superseded by this present Determination.
- 3. Notwithstanding that a rate per ton is adopted as the basis for ascertaining the pilotage payable under this Determination it is ordained that in the case of a vessel where the pilotage payable in respect thereof if computed on its registered tonnage would either exceed the amount set out in the column in the Schedule hereto headed "Maximum" or be less than the amount set out in the column headed "Minimum" the rate of pilotage in respect of that vessel shall incidental to the service in question be the sum mentioned in the column appropriate to her case, that is to say, in the case of a vessel of the greater tonnage the sum mentioned in the column headed "Maximum" and in that of a vessel of the lesser tonnage the sum mentioned in the column headed "Minimum."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK, KNOWN AS "STUDIEY PARK," IN THE TOWN

WHEREAS by section 182 of the Land Act 1915 it is enacted that in the case of any land which under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale, permanently, for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the said Act or the corresponding section of any repealed Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section one (1) of the first-mentioned section: And whereas under and by virtue of a Crown grant dated 17th May, 1876, the land known as Studley Park, in the town of Kew, became vested in the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgosses of the Borough (now Town) of Kew: And whereas under the powers conferred by section 183 of the Land Act 1915 the Governor in Council has duly appointed a Committee of Management for Studley Park: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgosses of the Town of Kew, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the said Act do hereby make the Regulations following for the regulation of Studley Park:—

2. No unauthorized person shall do any of the following acts in the said Park, that is to say:--

(1) Cut, pluck, injure, takė away, or destroy any tree,

Cut, pluck, injure, take away, or destroy any tree, bush, or flower growing therein.
 Dig, cut, or remove any sod, turf, loam, sand, gravel, or other substance thereon or therefrom.
 Light any fire without the permission of the Committee of Management, or carelessly or negligently do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.
 Wilfully or negligently deposit or leave therein on any part thereof any rubbish, bricks, manure, timber, or other substance or material whatsoever.
 Bleach or place out to dry any article or thing.
 Beat carpets.

(7) Catch or trap any bird, or lay or place any trap for the taking of birds or take any bird's egg or nest, or shoot or chase or disturb any game or other animal.

animal.

(8) Cause or suffer any horse, pony, mule, ass, bull, ox, cow, calf, heifer, steer, sheep, lamb, goat, hog, or sow belonging to him or in his charge, to enter or go therein unless thereunto authorized by the said Committee of Management.

(9) Encamp thereon or erect or place therein any booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing, chair, or seat (other than a camp stool or other portable chair or seat), or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or make any enclosure of any part thereof.

(25) Do, aid in, or abet any act or thing which may not in these Regulations be specifically mentioned, and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the Park, or to interfere with the use thereof by the public for the purposes of exercise and recreation.

3. Whereby a notice or notices which shall be conspicuously exhibited in the Park, the Committee of Management shall from time to time set apart any portion of the Park for any game or athletic sport or generally for the assemblage of persons for any purpose, no person shall on any portion of the Park so set apart as aforesaid—

(a) Drive, ride, or pass over the ground with any vehicle or upon horseback.

(b) Drive or ride among or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled for any of the purposes aforesaid.

(c) Take part in such game or assemblage as aforesaid except at such times and under such Regulations as the Committee of Management may from time to time prescribe.

time prescribe.

(d) Obstruct, interfere with, or annoy any person who is taking part, or has made preparation to take part in, or is lawfully present at any gathering for any of the purposes aforesaid.

(c) Place any chair, seat, band-stand, or other movable erection in such portion of the Park without the consent of the Committee of Management under the hand of its searchary. hand of its secretary.

(f) Deliver or take part in the delivery of any address whatsoever, or remain with any assemblage of persons after having been informed by a Magistrate and an officer of the Committee of Management that they anticipate that the continuance of such an address or assemblage should lead to scenes of disorder, and having been requested by them to desist and to leave the assemblage.

4. Every person who shall infringe any regulations for the management of the Park may be removed therefrom by any officer of the Committee of Management or by any constable in any one of the several cases hereinafter specified, that is to

(a) Where the infraction of the regulation is committed within the view of such officer or constable, and the name and residence of the person infringing the Regulations is unknown to and cannot be readily ascertained by such officer or constable.

(b) Where the infraction of the Regulations is committed within the view of such officer or constable, and from

within the view of such officer or constable, and from the nature of such infraction or from any other fact of which such officer or constable may have knowledge, or of which he may be credibly informed, there may be reasonable grounds for belief that the continuance in the Park of the person infringing the Regulations may result in another infraction of a Regulation, or that the removal of such person from the Park is otherwise necessary as a security for the proper use and management thereof.
