ORDER IN COUNCIL UNITING SHIRE OF WALHALLA
WITH THE SHIRE OF NARRACAN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the
twenty-first day of May, 1918.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by notice in writing dated the 10th day of January, 1918, to and duly served upon the Councils of the Shire of Walhalla and the Shire of Narracan respectively, on or about the 12th day of January, 1918, the Honorable John McWhae, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works in and for the State of Victoria and the Minister of the Crown of the said State at that time administering the Local Government Acts of the same (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister"), notified such councils of his intention to proceed to obtain an Order uniting the said shire of Walhalla to the shire of Narracan, the municipal district of which, together with that of the said shire of Walhalla, form one continuous area by reason (as the case in fact is) that the general and extra rates made and levied by the said shire of Walhalla, during the twelve months ended the 30th day of September, 1917, did not yield a sum of One thousand and five hundred pounds, particulars of which notice were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th day of January aforesaid, and respectively in three consecutive issues of the *Age*, a newspaper generally circulating in Melbourne, and the *Narracan Shire Advocate*, a newspaper generally circulating in the several municipalities of Walhalla shire and Narracan shire (that is to say), in the *Age* of the 14th, 15th, and 16th January, 1918, and in the *Narracan Shire Advocate* on the 16th, 23rd, and 30th of the same month. And whereas the said Minister has given to the Councils of the Municipalities of Walhalla Shire and Narracan Shire (no creditor of either of them within the period of three months from the 30th day of January now last past, or at all, having notified the Minister of his or its desire so to do) full opportunity of showing cause why an Order in Council uniting the shire of Walhalla to the shire of Narracan should not be passed. And whereas the Honorable Arthur Robinson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works in and for the State of Victoria and the Minister of the Crown of the said State for the time being administering the Local Government Acts of the same, having entertained inquiries into and decided upon all the representations made by or on behalf of such councils respectively, has recommended that the shire of Walhalla should, as on and from the first day of October now next, be united to the shire of Narracan and become part of the same, and that the territory of the said shire of Walhalla should thenceforth form portion of the Narracan shire by being constituted a separate riding thereof. And whereas such recommendation has been duly considered and approved. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, being satisfied that all conditions precedent to the making hereof have been fulfilled and observed, and acting under the authority conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby order and direct as follows (that is to say):—

- That on and from the 1st day of October now next the shire of Walhalla, incorporated under the style or title of the "President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Walhalla" shall, by virtue of these presents, be and become united with the shire of Narracan, incorporated under the style or title of the "President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Narracan," and that thereupon and thenceforward the territory constituting the said shire of Walhalla with the territory constituting the said shire of Narracan shall, together, form one shire, the boundaries of which are set out and defined in the First Schedule hereto, with the assigned name of the "Narracan Shire," and that the inhabitants thereof shall be and become incorporated under the style or title of "The President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Narracan."
- That from and after union the new shire of Narracan shall consist of four separate ridings, namely, the North Riding, the East Riding, the West Riding, and the Walhalla Riding, which several ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Second Schedule hereto, under their respective names.
- For the purposes of the annual election to be held next after the 1st day of October, 1918, and of the government of the municipality constituted by the union, but without prejudice to the operation of the provisions of section 24 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, it is hereby declared that the council of the new shire of Narracan shall, in accordance with the terms of sec-

tion 11 of the said Act, consist of twelve members, being produced by three Councillors being returned by each of the four ridings, into which the new shire is by this Order divided.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Shire of Narracan.

Commencing on the Moc River where it is intersected by the north side of the Eastern Railway; thence south-westerly by the said river to the road forming the boundary between allotments 20 and 28A, parish of Warragul; thence south, east, and south by that road to the road known as McDonald's Track; thence north-westerly by the latter road to the road forming the boundary between allotments 24 and 21, parish of Allambee; thence south by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 26; thence westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 28; thence south by the west boundary of allotments 27 and 29 to the south-west angle of allotment last named; thence east by the south boundary of allotment 29 to the Tarwin River; thence southerly by that river to the south-east angle of allotment 35; thence west by the south boundary of that allotment to a road on the west boundary of said allotment; thence southerly by that road to the south-west corner of allotment 36; thence easterly by the south boundary of that allotment to the Tarwin River; thence southerly by that river to a point due south of the most western corner of allotment 10C; parish of Allambee East; thence by a direct line north to the most western corner of allotment 10C aforesaid; thence north-easterly by the northern boundary of that allotment and allotment 10D to the main road from Yarragon to Leongatha; thence southerly by that road and a road along the south-western boundary of allotment 10A and the western and southern boundaries of allotment 11C to a road on the eastern boundary of the last-named allotment; thence southerly by that road to the south-west corner of allotment 15; thence by a road north-easterly and north-westerly to the west angle of allotment 30B; thence north-easterly by the north-west boundary of that allotment and allotment 30A to the north angle of allotment last named; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of the said allotment to a road at its east angle; thence northerly by the said road to the north angle of allotment 33B; thence south-easterly by a road to the south angle of allotment 53; HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the provisions of section 17 of the *Police Regulation Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2709), doth hereby Order that the undermentioned amendments and additions to the Regulations of the Victorian Police Code be made as from the 1st January, 1918, that is to say:—

Allowances to Police.

The following regulation is added:—

151A. An allowance of Sixpence (6d.) per diem for uniforms is granted to sub-officers and constables not attached to the Criminal Investigation Branch, nor engaged in plain clothes duty.

Pay of Police.

Regulation 1587, as amended by Orders in Council of the 20th January, 1913, and of the 7th July, 1914, is further amended by substituting the following rates of pay to sub-officers and constables in lieu of those contained in the amended Orders aforesaid:—

The rate of pay to Senior Constables and Sergeants varies according to the length of service in the Police Force, being Sixpence per diem over the minimum if over six years' service, a further Sixpence per diem if over ten years' service, and the maximum if over fifteen years' service.

Travelling Allowances.

12. In addition to any sum received under the foregoing provisions, sub-officers and constables attached to the Criminal Investigation Branch, or engaged in plain clothes duty shall receive an allowance of Sixpence per diem.
