BEECHWORTH GAOL TO BE A POLICE GAOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight, Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Gaols Act 1915* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* to revoke any proclamation theretofore made or which may thereafter be made under section 4 of the said Act or under any other authority in that behalf which shall have notified any building erection house enclosed place or premises to be a public gaol prison house of correction or penal establishment and that thereupon the building erection house enclosed place and premises referred to in such notice shall cease to be a public gaol prison house of correction or penal establishment accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council upon a certificate from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments that any lock-up is fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days may from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any police lock-up so certified to be a "police gaol": And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony bearing date the 22nd October 1877 certain buildings and premises therein described were declared proclaimed and notified to be public gaols prisons and houses of correction within the meaning of and in accordance with the provisions of the *Statute of Gaols Act 1864*: And whereas the buildings and premises situate at Beechworth which are specified in the said proclamation are no longer required for the purposes of a public gaol prison and house of correction: And whereas the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments has certified that the said buildings and premises are fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days:

It is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that so much of the aforesaid Proclamation as relates to the buildings and premises therein designated the "Beechworth Gaol" be revoked as from the 28th day of May 1918 and that the buildings and premises described in the aforesaid Proclamation as the Beechworth Gaol be proclaimed a Police Gaol from the same date.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE IN THE TOWN OF VIOLET TOWN.

WE, John McShane, John Underwood, William Lane, Alfred Charles Morris, George Forshaw, John Samuel Beard, and John Crilly, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course in the Town of Violet Town, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereon, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall in any way damage trees, shrubs, or plants in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall camp in any part of the Reserve, nor erect thereon any dwelling or booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such consent shall be produced if required.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any kind of stock without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall damage fences or buildings, gates, seats, or water drains in the Reserve.
7. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve and Stand enclosure and Course on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for races, fêtes, sports, or other holiday amusements shall be as follows :—

For the admission of every adult (male) to Stand enclosure and Course, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding (including Government tax) 4s. 6d.

For the admission of every adult (female) to Stand enclosure and Course, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding (including Government tax) 2s. 6d.

For the admission of every adult (male) to the Course only, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding (including Government tax) 2s. 6d.

For the admission of every adult (female) to the Course only, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding (including Government tax) 1s. 6d.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more

than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Conditions of Lease.

The general conditions of the lease under the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1915* and Regulations, as approved by the Governor in Council, shall apply.
