No person shall camp in any part of the Reserve, nor irect thereon any dwelling or booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall damage fences or buildings, gates, seats, or water drains in the Reserve.

7. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve and Stand enclosure and Course on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for races, fêtes, sports, or other holiday amusements shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every adult (male) to Stand enclosure

For the admission of every adult (male) to the Course only, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding (including Government tax) 2s. 6d.

For the admission of every adult (female) to the Course only, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding (including Government tax) 1s. 6d.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more

than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff of member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

### Conditions of Lease.

Conditions of Lease.

The general conditions of the lease under the Agricultural Colleges Act 1915 and Regulations, as approved by the Governor in Council, shall apply.

1. The term of lease is thirty years.

2. The rental at which the lease is granted will apply for the first ten years of the lease, when a reappraisement of the rent shall be made, and further reappraisements shall be made at the end of every successive five years after the first ten years.

3. ### DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

### (PLANNING CARPETS, ETC.)

Note.—This Determination on the 27th June, 1918, applied to the Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the town of Ballarat East; the boroughs of Englehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to "female workers employed as upholstrosses, whether as carpet hands, table hands, or drapery hands, also to male persons employed in planning and laying carpets or linoleums or floor cloths or fixing draperies," has made the following Determination,

(1) That on the 27th day of June, 1918, the last previous Determination of this Board for planning carpets, &c., shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (6) CASUAL LABOUR. ... Any person casually employed during any week for not more than 24 hours shall be paid at the rate of time
- (0) CASUAL MADULE. THIS POWER AND ACTION OF THE STATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
