WONTHAGGI DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

THE following Rules for the control and management of the Wonthaggi District Hospital are hereby approved:—

Name.

The Institution shall be known as the Wonthaggi District Hospital.

Constitution.

The Constitution of the Hospital shall be an unlimited number of contributors, as defined hereunder in Rule 1, and a Committee of Management appointed by the Governor in Council, part of which may be nominated by the contributors, as provided by Rule 5 hereunder.

Objects.

The objects of the Institution are:—To afford medical and surgical aid, nursing, and medicines to—

- (a) Contributors.
- (b) Sick persons in destitute circumstances.
- (c) Sick persons who are unable to pay the ordinary fees for medical or surgical attendance, nursing, &c., but who are willing to contribute towards the cost of their treatment according to their means, on such terms as may be determined by the Committee of Management.
- (d) Casualties and urgent cases.

Means.

The Government having erected a suitable building for the purpose, the contributors shall undertake to find the necessary funds for carrying out the "objects" of the Institution.

RULES.

1. *Contributor.*—A contributor shall be—

- (a) A person who has contributed One pound during the financial year ending on the 30th June next following the said payment.
- (b) Any person contributing Fourpence-halfpenny per week, and signing an undertaking to continue the said payment throughout the year ending 30th June.
- (c) Life governors.
- (d) Annual governors.
- (e) Government representatives.

2. *Life Governor.*—A life governor shall be—

- (a) Any person contributing £20 in one sum to the Hospital.
- (b) Any person or persons raising £50 or more for the benefit of the Hospital may nominate one person for appointment for each £50 so raised.
- (c) Any trustee or executor contributing £20 or more may nominate one person.
- (d) Any person who has rendered signal service to the Hospital may, on the recommendation of the committee, be appointed by the contributors at the annual meeting.

3. *Annual Governor.*—Where £20, or more, in one sum shall have been paid to the Hospital during the financial year by any public body, church congregation, firm or partnership, society or committee, or any person raising £20 or more, may nominate one person for every £20 contributed to be an annual governor for the current financial year.

4. *Forfeiture of Right to be a Contributor.*—Any contributor who shall have fallen one month in arrear shall be so notified by the secretary, and until such arrears are paid shall have no right to vote at any meeting or election.

5. *Committee.*—The Hospital shall be managed by a committee of fifteen (15) contributors, to be appointed by the Governor in Council, and constituted as follows:—

- (a) Nine (9) members may be nominated by election by the contributing miners residing within the district of Wonthaggi. After the first year the election (if any) to fill the vacancies caused by the three retiring members shall be held in the month of July in each year.
- (b) Three (3) members may be nominated by election by the contributors other than miners residing within the district of Wonthaggi. After the first year the election (if any) to fill the vacancies caused by the retiring member shall be held in the month of July in each year.
- (c) Three (3) Government representatives appointed by the Governor in Council.

In this clause, "miner" shall mean any person employed in or about a mine.

The district of Wonthaggi shall mean the area defined by a radius of twenty (20) miles from the Hospital.

6. *Retirement of Committee.*—Members of committee may be appointed for three years, but shall retire at the pleasure of the Governor in Council, but where this is not exercised, then they shall retire in the following order, that is to say:—

As to—

- "(a)" Three (3) members shall retire on the 30th June every year. The first and second years the retiring members shall be selected from the six lowest on the

poll at the first election in July, 1918, the three lowest on the poll to retire first; afterwards the three longest in office shall retire each year.

As to—

- "(b)" One shall retire on the 30th June each year; the members retiring the first and second year shall be determined by ballot; afterwards the member longest in office shall retire each year.

All members retiring as herein provided shall be eligible for re-nomination for appointment.

As to—

- "(c)" The Government representatives shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor in Council, or until they resign.

7. *Nominators.*—All candidates for election for appointment to the Committee of Management must be financial contributors for three months prior to election, life governors, or annual governors, and must be nominated on the proper form, supplied by the committee, which must be signed by the candidate and at least two (2) contributors. The nomination paper must be in the hands of the returning officer or his deputy seven clear days before the date of polling for the election of the contributor to be nominated for appointment.

The returning officer and two (2) scrutineers shall be appointed by the committee, who shall fix the day of polling at least fourteen days previously.

The hours of polling shall be from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., at polling places appointed by the committee.

The ordinary rules of election by ballot shall be adhered to, and postal votes arranged for as may be required.

Every ballot-paper shall be initialed by the returning officer before being handed to, or posted to, the contributor.

The ballot-paper shall contain the names of all candidates in alphabetical order, and shall state the number to be elected for nomination for appointment.

Any ballot-paper, after being used by a contributor, shall be placed in the ballot-box, or sent by post to the returning officer, and shall contain the names of no more, or no less, than the number of candidates to be elected. Where a greater or less number of names appears on the ballot-paper, after being placed in the ballot-box, the vote shall be invalid.

If a sufficient number of candidates be not nominated to fill the vacancies, the committee may nominate the required number of contributors for appointment, as provided in Rule 6. For the purpose of electing contributors or a contributor for nomination for appointment under Rule 6, any person who was a contributor on the 30th June previous to the said election in July shall be entitled to vote at such election, notwithstanding the definition of "contributor" as defined in Rule 1.

8. *Polling Places, &c.*—The places of polling booths shall be determined by the committee, at least six days before the election, such places to be published in the local press. Only contributors as defined in Rules 1 and 7 shall be eligible to vote. Ballot-boxes shall be locked, and shall only be opened by the returning officer (who shall retain the keys) in the presence of the two scrutineers, after the time fixed for polling has expired.

9. *Filling of Vacancies.*—If any member of the Committee of Management shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the Governor in Council or the Board of Land and Works, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent from four consecutive meetings of the committee without leave of absence being granted, or cease to be a contributor, his office may be declared vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor, to the Hospital from the class in which the vacancy occurs, until the next annual election, when such person shall retire, as directed in Rule 7.

This Rule shall not apply to Government representatives.

10. *Meetings of Committee.*—The Committee of Management shall meet at least once a month, on a day, hour, and place to be fixed. The secretary shall send printed notices, notifying the members of committee.

Five (5) to form a quorum.

11. *Election of Officers of Committee.*—The committee shall annually elect from among themselves, at their first meeting, a president, two vice-presidents, and a treasurer.

12. *Special Meetings.*—It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management (by resolution), or for any twenty or more contributors, by writing under their hand, to requisition the president, or, in his absence, one of the vice-presidents or the secretary, to summon a special meeting of contributors. The object of such meeting must be stated in the requisition, and no other business shall be discussed or transacted at the meeting except that for which it was summoned.

Seven clear days' notice shall be given of such meeting, and the objects for which it is called, by advertisement in the local papers.

Twenty contributors to form a quorum.

13. *Quorum.*—Should a quorum not be present within half-an-hour of the advertised time of meeting, the meeting shall lapse.

14. *Sub-committee.*—The Committee of Management shall conduct the general business of the Hospital, and shall appoint special and ordinary committees from their own number for general and particular purposes.

All sub-committees shall consist of five members—three from class "(a)," one from class "(b)," and one Government representative, to give effect to all rules and orders, and, as far as practicable, regulate the proceedings of sub-committees. All sub-committees shall cease to hold office on the day of the annual election in July of each year.

15. *Finance Committee.*—The Committee of Management shall appoint a finance committee of five, who may hold office for such term as may be decided, but who shall be eligible for re-appointment if still members of committee.

Their duties shall be to examine and report to the Committee of Management on accounts presented for payment, to open, investigate, and report to the Committee of Management on all tenders, to supervise the secretary and collector, to see that the town and country are thoroughly and systematically canvassed for subscriptions, to supervise all entertainments, &c., in aid of the Hospital, to supervise collection of moneys due to the Hospital, and to watch over the financial interests of the Hospital generally.

The finance committee shall meet at least once a month, and shall present a financial statement showing the position of the Hospital at each monthly meeting of the general committee. They shall have power to incur expenditure, not exceeding £10, in any emergency, which expenditure they shall report to the committee at its next meeting.

Three (3) to form a quorum.

16. *House Committee.*—The Committee of Management shall also appoint a house committee of five, three to form a quorum, who shall hold office for such term as may be decided, but who shall be eligible for re-appointment. They shall meet at the Hospital at least once a fortnight or oftener, shall inquire into the internal management generally, and shall report to the Committee of Management monthly on the state of the Hospital, the number of patients admitted, the number of patients discharged, the number of patients in the institution and the length of time therein, also their progress or otherwise. They shall have power to incur expenditure not exceeding £5, but shall submit such expenditure for indorsement at the next meeting of the Committee of Management. Two of their number, by arrangement, shall visit the Hospital at least once a week, see that the patients are properly cared for, and investigate any complaints preferred by them. The house committee shall also mutually arrange with paying patients the amount of their payments for treatment received.

17. *Annual Report.*—The Committee of Management shall present a yearly report of the affairs of the Hospital at the general meeting of contributors (twenty to form a quorum), to be held in the month of July in each year. Such report shall be left at the Hospital for one week prior to the annual meeting, for inspection by the contributors. A copy of this report shall be forwarded to the Treasurer of Victoria and the Minister for Lands as soon as possible after being adopted. The financial year of the Hospital to close on 30th June.

18. *Auditor.*—The books and accounts of the Hospital shall be audited at least once a year by a duly qualified auditor, and the auditor's report, together with balance-sheet and statement of the position of the Hospital, shall be presented at the annual meeting.

19. *Where Member of Committee Interested.*—No member of the committee shall be present at the discussion of any matter in which he is peculiarly interested, nor record his vote thereon, and no member of the committee shall directly or indirectly be a contractor for the supply of any goods to the Hospital, nor shall he be a salaried officer in any way, nor shall any goods be purchased from any member of the committee, unless the goods required cannot be as satisfactorily obtained elsewhere.

20. *Dealing with Complaints.*—Any grievance which may arise from any of the nursing or domestic staff which cannot be settled by the matron, who may confer with the medical officer, shall be reported at once by her to the secretary of the Hospital, who shall place the matter before the next meeting of the house committee to deal with such complaint.

All such complaints to be investigated by the house committee must be made in writing, properly signed by the person or persons making the same, and addressed to the matron.

The house committee may, if it thinks it advisable, refer the question to the general committee, whose decision shall be final.

21. *Power to Amend Rules and By-laws.*—The Committee of Management shall have the power to alter, add to, or rescind any of the foregoing rules and any by-laws, provided that one month's notice of such alteration be given by advertisement in the local press, but no alteration, rescission, new rule, or by-law, shall be of any force or effect until one month after the same shall have been confirmed by a meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, approved by the Treasurer of Victoria, and advertised in the *Government Gazette*.

22. *Power to Make By-laws.*—The Committee of Management shall frame By-laws, to be approved by the Treasurer of Victoria, for the internal management of the institution (provided the same be not repugnant to any Act of Parliament and these Rules), and may make new by-laws, enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the institution, direct payments to be made, appoint and dismiss officers, fill up vacancies (all persons, whether male or female, receiving payment shall be deemed an officer); shall appoint some place to be the secretary's office, and shall notify in the public press the place so appointed, or any change thereof; appoint auditors, medical officers, and all persons acting in any honorary capacity, and define their duties; draw up forms regulating the admission of and payment by patients.

For regulating the number of votes according to the amount contributed.

For fixing the term for which sub-committees shall be appointed.

For regulating the admission of visitors and out-door patients.

For deciding what particulars the annual report shall contain.

For defining the duties of every member of the paid staff.

For fixing the hours of duty and the payment therefor.

For fixing the term for which appointments are made.

For determining the validity of disputed elections, and generally for all matters whatsoever affecting the management of the institution.

In case any doubt exists or dispute arises as to the meaning of these Rules, or any of them, the Treasurer of Victoria shall be the sole interpreter.

These Rules shall come into force on the 1st July, 1918.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND GARDEN IN THE PARISH OF ASHENS, AT MURTOA, KNOWN AS THE "LAKE MARMA RESERVE."

3. No person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever in Lake Marma for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot, or for any other purpose whatsoever.

4. No person shall angle for, or by any other means endeavour to take fish from Lake Marma on any Sunday.

5. No person shall deposit any weight, stone, tin, or other obstacle in Lake Marma.

6. No person shall angle for, or otherwise endeavour to catch fish in Lake Marma without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Conditions of Lease.

The general conditions of the lease under the Agricultural Colleges Act 1915 and Regulations, as approved by the Governor in Council, shall apply.

1. The term of lease is thirty years.
2. The rental at which the lease is granted will apply for the first ten years of the lease, when a reappraisal of the rent shall be made, and further reappraisals shall be made at the end of every successive five years after the first ten years.
3. At any reappraisal should the rent be increased and the lessee desire to surrender his lease, the trustees of Agricultural College Reserves may accept such surrender, and all improvements (excepting buildings erected by lessee with consent of trustees, and which lessee may sell or remove within one month from date of surrender) become the property of the trustees, as at expiry of the lease.

1. 2. 3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act* 1915 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act* 1890 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.
