NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALIER THE PROCLAMATION DEFINING THE MOUTHS OF THE BEMM, OANN, WINGAN, AND GENOA RIVERS, AND SPECIFYING THE LIMITS WITHIN WHICH NETS AND FIXED ENGINES ARE NOT TO BE USED.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to Council to-

Council to—

1. Revoke the Proclamation, dated the fourth day of November, 1901, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the thirteenth day of November, 1901, defining the mouths of the Bemm, Cann, Wingan, and Genoa Rivers, and specifying limits within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used.

2. Define the mouths of the Bemm, Cann, and Wingan Rivers as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such rivers enter the ocean or any bay thereof, and to prohibit the use of nets or fixed engines within a radius of a quarter of a mile seaward of any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of any of the rivers aforesaid. aforesaid.

3. Define the mouth of the Genoa River as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such river join the Top Lake of Mallacoota Inlet near Smellie's Point, and prohibit the use of nets or fixed engines within a radius of a quarter of a mile seaward from any portion or point of such line.

4. Prohibit the use of nets and fixed engines within the whole of Smellie's Arm, the mouth of which arm is adjacent to the mouth of the Genoa River.
