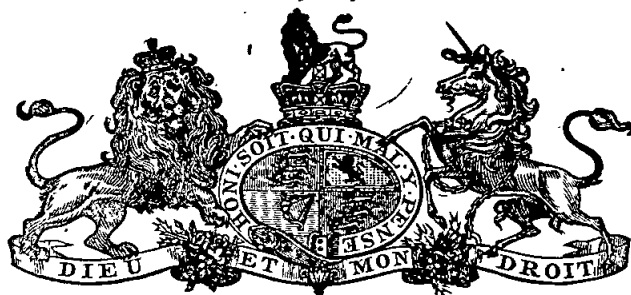

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in a Despatch bearing date the 26th April, 1918, has intimated to the Governor of the State of Victoria that His Majesty will not be advised to exercise his power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 8th year of His Majesty's reign, the numbers and titles of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:—

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE CLOSE SEASON FOR NETTING AT SYDENHAM, WINGAN, TAMBOON, AND MALLACOOTA INLETS; ALSO THE PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF MESH NETS IN MALLACOOTA INLET DURING THE WHOLE YEAR.

IT is hereby notified, for general information; that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation varying the Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of August, 1914, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the second day of September, 1914, re netting at Sydenham, Tamboon, Wingan, and Mallacoota Inlets, as follows:—

1. By substituting for the words "from the first day of October in each year to the thirty-first day of March in the following year" the words "from the fifteenth day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year."

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE PROCLAMATION DEFINING THE MOUTHS OF THE BEMM, CANN, WINGAN, AND GENOA RIVERS, AND SPECIFYING THE LIMITS WITHIN WHICH NETS AND FIXED ENGINES ARE NOT TO BE USED.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to—

1. Revoke the Proclamation, dated the fourth day of November, 1901, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the thirteenth day of November, 1901, defining the mouths of the Bemm, Cann, Wingan, and Genoa Rivers, and specifying limits within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used.

2. Define the mouths of the Bemm, Cann, and Wingan Rivers as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such rivers enter the ocean or any bay thereof, and to prohibit the use of nets or fixed engines within a radius of a quarter of a mile seaward of any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of any of the rivers aforesaid.

3. Define the mouth of the Genoa River as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such river join the Top Lake of Mallacoota Inlet near Smellie's Point, and prohibit the use of nets or fixed engines within a radius of a quarter of a mile seaward from any portion or point of such line.

4. Prohibit the use of nets and fixed engines within the whole of Smellie's Arm, the mouth of which arm is adjacent to the mouth of the Genoa River.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MORRADOO.

W E. Oliver Guinness Reynolds, Robert White, James Francis Nelthorpe, James Aspden, Ashton Woolley, Elijah James Stranger, being the majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the township of Morradoo, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by the Regulations and by an order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
