By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinters at footh that is to say. after set forth, that is to say :-

"An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and nineteen and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament."

"An Act relating to the Constitution of a Body of Electricity Commissioners and the Powers and Duties thereof and to amend the Law relating to Electric Light and Power.'

. "An Act relating to Metropolitan Tramways and for other purposes."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Vic-toria, at Melbourne, this seventh day of January, in, the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

Health Act 1915. SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON. BY-LAW No. 45.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1915, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the shire of Shepparton in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

ing By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law including By-law No. 28 of the said shire are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shepparton Riding of the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the said riding shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and of such dimensions that the same and the contents thereof when full shall not exceed 56 lbs. in weight and so constructed that full shall not exceed 56 lbs. in weight and so constructed that it may be readily and conveniently carried and emptied by one man, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or recentacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse, rubbish, or earbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building or premises such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building or premises from the street, lane or right-of-way on which such house, buildings or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane or right-of-way.

8. If any person commit-a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

8. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the bond fide property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect in the form of the schedule attached hereto.

9. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of registered cows or mares, my run with their mothers free of charge up to the limit of that age.

10. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted without the special consent of the Council.

A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement at the close of every half-yearly period, and the owners requiring exemption for the ensuing month or quarter, as the case may be, are required to present their stock for registration at such musterings. Stock may be registered during any period between musterings on payment of the full month's or quarter's fee. r quarter's fee.

The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him, and present a return of same to the Council every six months, on day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries

are made.

13. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted

13. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land on any situation whatever.

14. No pigs, goats, or sheep whatever are to be allowed to wander or to depasture on any roads, and no stock of any kind are to be allowed to wander or depasture on any of the roads comprised within the area in the Centre Riding described in section 3 of this By-law as the prohibited area, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of 2 miles in each hour, and in the case of sheep not less than the rate of 6 miles in each day, between sunset and sunrise.

15. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above, without giving due notice of same b forehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing the same shall be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head removed one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registration period.

16. The Council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from the street or roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying, the owner shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the Inspector of Nuisances shall cause same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.
