PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and nineteen and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament.”

“An Act relating to the Constitution of a Body of Electricity Commissioners and the Powers and Duties thereof and to amend the Law relating to Electric Light and Power.”

“An Act relating to Metropolitan Tramways and for other purposes.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this seventh day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

TOBACCO EXPERT (TEMPORARY), DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

Health Act 1915.

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

BY-LAW No. 45.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the shire of Shepparton in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law including By-law No. 28 of the said shire are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shepparton Riding of the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the said riding shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and of such dimensions that the same and the contents thereof when full shall not exceed 56 lbs. in weight and so constructed that it may be readily and conveniently carried and emptied by one man, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse, rubbish, or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building or premises such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building or premises from the street, lane or right-of-way on which such house, buildings or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane or right-of-way.

8. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Passed by the Council of the shire of Shepparton on the twenty-fifth day of March, 1918, and confirmed by the said Council on the twenty-second day of April, 1918.

1. Every child placed at service shall be properly fed and lodged by the person with whom such child is so placed, and also be provided with medical attendance and medicines when necessary.

2. Females placed at service, when not provided with sleeping accommodation within the main wall of the same building as the employer, shall sleep in a room with another female.

3. Children placed at service shall be allowed, where practicable, to attend regularly Divine service and Sunday-school; their moral training shall be duly cared for by the employer; and the clergyman of the denomination to which they belong, and any officer of the Department, member of visiting committee, or other person appointed by the Government to visit them, shall be allowed to do so at reasonable hours.

4. Payments shall be made for the services rendered by any child placed at service in accordance with the rate agreed upon. The portion of the wages required to be sent to the office of the secretary of the Department to be banked for the child is due at the end of each quarter, viz., on 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December; and it is to be sent on these days without application by the Department. Receipts for payments to the child must be kept for production when required.

5. Every person with whom a child has been placed at service shall, in the event of such child becoming seriously ill, dying, absconding, leaving, or meeting with any accident, send written information thereof at once to the office of the secretary. In the case of absconding, information to be given at the local police station, and in the case of serious illness, the clergyman of the denomination to which the child belongs is to be at once communicated with.

6. In the event of change of residence by an employer of a child placed at service written intimation thereof shall be at once sent to the office of the secretary. No such child shall be removed from the district within which it has been placed at service without the written consent of the secretary.

7. No child placed at service with any person shall be transferred to any other person without authority in writing for such transfer from the committee or the secretary.

8. No child placed at service with any person or under indenture of apprenticeship shall be taken out of the State of Victoria, except when any such child has been apprenticed at sea.

9. When the services of a child are no longer required by the person with whom the child has been placed at service, such child must be sent back to the school, reformatory, or foster home, from which such child was placed, unless the sanction of the secretary has been previously obtained to the child being otherwise dealt with or provided for. The expense incurred in sending back such child must be borne by the person aforesaid no longer requiring its services.

10. The Government reserve the right of removing children whenever it may be deemed necessary to do so.

7. The Council will not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass and water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained strictly under these conditions.

8. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect in the form of the schedule attached hereto.

9. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of registered cows or mares, my run with their mothers free of charge up to the limit of that age.

17. While persons retain chain and tag, they will be held responsible for registration fees and the charge for hire of tag and chain will be continued while holding same, and on returning tag and chain, the charge made for hire of same will be refunded.

18. That the herdsman will impound all unregistered stock trespassing and unattended on any road, and all stock (registered or unregistered) trespassing and unattended in the prohibited area, and a charge of 1s. per head shall be made on all such impoundings as remuneration for the herdsman in respect of such impoundings. Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds.
