REGULATIONS.—APPOINTMENT OR TRANSFER TO THE CLERICAL DIVISION.—CHAPTER III.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter III. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

STANDARD OF EXAMINATION.

For—
Clauses 1 and 2,

Read—

1. Candidates for appointment or transfer to the Clerical Division will be examined in the following subjects, as prescribed from time to time for the School Intermediate Examination:—

Subject.	Marks.
Compulsory Subjects—	
(1) English—	
(a) As prescribed for the School Intermediate Examination (300 marks) ...	400
(b) Précis Writing (100 marks)
(2) Arithmetic and Algebra ...	400
(3), (4), (5) Any three other subjects of the School Intermediate Examination, not including Music ...	300 each

Optional Subjects—

Any one or two, but not more than two, of the subjects of the School Intermediate Examination, not including Music, which are not taken as compulsory subjects ... 200 each

Marks will be deducted for errors in Spelling and for unsatisfactory Handwriting in each subject, except mathematical subjects.

2. To pass the examination a candidate must obtain at least forty per centum (40 per cent.) of the marks available in each of subjects (1) and (2) above, at least twenty-five per centum (25 per cent.) of the marks available in each of the other three compulsory subjects, and at least sixty per centum (60 per cent.) of the aggregate of marks for the five compulsory subjects.

The marks awarded for an optional subject to a candidate who is successful at the examination will be included in his total of marks, provided at least twenty-five per centum (25 per cent.) of the marks available for an optional subject is secured by the candidate.

REGISTRATION OF QUALIFIED CANDIDATES.

Clause 16.

For the words—

If two or more candidates obtain the same total number of marks, the order of their merit shall be determined by the number of marks obtained for Mathematics, and, if these numbers be also the same, then by lot.

Substitute the following words:—

If two or more successful candidates secure the same total number of marks, their order of merit shall be determined by the number of marks awarded to them in (1) English, (2) Arithmetic and Algebra, and, if these numbers be the same, then by ballot.

- For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if in the absence of a contract, on the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges, are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1919, and shall be due and payable on the first day of July, 1919.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND IN FLAGSTAFF GARDENS, IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City Melbourne and their successors in respect of Flagstaff Gardens, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted (hereinafter called the said Gardens) and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be at all times thereafter maintained and used as and for a Public Garden and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Council thereof and in the meantime under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne and for no other purpose whatsoever. And whereas the Governor in Council did on the ninth day of October One thousand nine hundred and seventeen in pursuance of section 183 of the *Land Act* 1915 appoint the Council of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Trustees) to be a Committee of Management of (inter alia) the said Gardens. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Trustees do hereby make the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of such portion of the said Gardens as is set apart for and hereinafter designated Children's Playground and for the preservation of good order and decency therein in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said Gardens.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Children's Playground shall be opened daily from 10 o'clock a.m. till sunset, except on Sundays and such other days as may from time to time be specially indicated by the Trustees.

2. Any person found within the Children's Playground except during the hours it is open to the public shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

3. Although the Children's Playground is provided for the use of children only, mothers and female attendants shall be at liberty to be present to watch over them.

4. No male person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be admitted to the Playground.

5. No person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be allowed to use any of the swings or other appliances erected in the Children's Playground. Such swings or other appliances shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five (5) minutes at any one time if any other children are waiting to use them.

6. No children shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except in the ordinary way.

7. No cricket or football shall be played in the Children's Playground.

8. All paper, fruit, peel or other litter, shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Trustees for the purpose.

9. All persons in the Children's Playground shall obey the directions of the Caretaker thereof.

10. The Trustees shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.

11. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Trustees shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty under these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of the Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or any property in the Children's Playground.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act 1915* on conviction before any Justice, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who so offends, or who after he has been warned by any Bailiff or Crown Lands officer, or servant of the Trustees or by any constable does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant or constable and taken before some Justice and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Printing Paper," or as the case may be, and must be deposited in the Tender-box, at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or if sent by post, must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. As regards supplies of articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, no sub-letting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; and every person engaged in the manufacture, delivery, &c., of the articles contracted for shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by Wages Boards under the Factories and Shops Act, and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which supplies are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

3. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

4. The Government will order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

5. The first delivery under this contract—three months' supply based on the requirements for one year—shall be made not later than 1st October, 1919. The contractor shall, in addition, hold and keep in Melbourne a reserve stock or stocks equal to one-fourth of the requirements for one year as set out in the schedule. The Government Printer may at any time require, and shall be entitled to receive, delivery of the whole or any portion of such reserve stock or stocks to meet his requirements. In the event of the Government Printer requiring and receiving delivery of such reserve stock or stocks, or any portion thereof, the contractor shall within a reasonable time, but not exceeding four months, replace and make good such reserve stock, or stocks, or the portion thereof delivered to the Government Printer as aforesaid. The Government Printer shall at any time be entitled to call upon the contractor to satisfy, and the contractor being so called upon shall satisfy, the Government Printer that he holds all reserve stock or stocks that he is required or bound to hold in terms of conditions of tender.

6. The supplies are to be the same as sample and in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture.

7. The value of all packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, and all wharfage fees and duty of Customs must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, wrappings, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

8. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same, setting out the order number and particulars of the supply, together with an invoice in duplicate, to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores tendered by him. The contractor shall also furnish a statement at the end of each month setting forth deliveries during the month, and the total money value of same. Arrangements as to time and place of delivery and of inspection of goods will be made by the Government Printer or such other officer as he may appoint.

9. Orders must receive prompt execution in terms of contract; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the Government Printer, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

10. The articles supplied under every item or group of items shall in respect of quality, shape, and (when only one size is specified) size, be in accordance with the sample or samples exhibited by the Tender Board to the contractor when tendering. Any samples furnished by the contractor shall become the property of the Government.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. 12.
