### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2713), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint Wednesday,

the 9th day of July, 1919, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Yackandandah Riding of the shire of Yackandandah.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the tenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
