WAR SERVICE CHEVRONS.

THE subjoined copy of a notice published in the *Board of Trade Journal* of the 17th April last, relating to the issue of War Service Chevrons to members of the Mercantile Marine, as received through His Excellency the Governor from the Colonial Office, is published for general information.

WAR SERVICE CHEVRONS. Mercantile Marine, &c.

The Board of Trade have authorized chevrons to be worn by masters, officers, and members of the crews of merchant vessels, and vessels of pilotage and lighthouse authorities, and by licensed pilots and fishermen, who have served at sea or have been captured or interned during the war, in accordance with the following provisions:—

1. One chevron may be worn in respect of sea-going service, or captivity or internment in an enemy country, during the period from 4th August, 1914, to 31st December, 1914.
2. One chevron may be worn in respect of each or any of the three calendar years 1915, 1916, and 1917, provided that at least three months of the year have been spent afloat in sea-going service, or in captivity in an enemy country, or both.
3. One chevron may be worn in respect of the remainder of the war, when twelve months have been spent since the 1st January, 1918, in sea-going service (with or without a period of captivity in an enemy country), provided that the period of twelve months has commenced before 11th November, 1918, when the armistice was signed.
4. For certificated masters and officers, skippers of fishing vessels, licensed pilots, uncertificated junior officers qualifying for their first certificate, surgeons, pursers, wireless operators, cadets and apprentices, in the Mercantile Marine, and masters, officers, and apprentices of vessels of pilotage and lighthouse authorities, the chevron for 1914 shall be silver, the others gold. For all other officers, second hands, petty officers, and ranks and ratings in the Mercantile Marine, in the fishing service, and in vessels of pilotage and lighthouse authorities, the chevron for 1914 shall be of red worsted, the others of blue worsted.

5. The chevrons shall be similar to those worn in the Royal Navy, and shall be worn on the forearm of the right sleeve of uniform, sea rig or shore rig; the silver and red worsted chevrons respectively shall be worn below the others. Chevrons earned for naval or military service in accordance with Admiralty or War Office regulations may be worn in addition to the Mercantile Marine chevrons; and, even when earned in respect of military service, they must be worn as prescribed in paragraph 4 of this authorization.

6. No permission to wear the chevrons, other than this general authorization, will be required. Chevrons will not be provided by the Board of Trade, but they should be purchased by those authorized to wear them.

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7. Under the Defence of the Realm Regulations it is an offence for any unauthorized person to wear a chevron.

NOTE.—Chevrons earned for service in the Mercantile Marine in accordance with this authorization may be worn on naval and military uniform; when worn on military uniform, the chevrons should be of the Army pattern.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria and Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two millions six hundred and eleven thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and nineteen and One thousand nine hundred and twenty.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the tenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the State Income Tax Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for the twelve months 1st July, 1918, to the 30th June, 1919, consisted of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance, stipend, rents, interest, or annuity, and whose income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts earned in or derived from Victoria amounted to Two hundred and one pounds or upwards, and every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Acts or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of August, 1919.

Every such return shall be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the State Income Tax Office, Railway Buildings, Flinders-street, Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Act liable to be prosecuted and to pay a penalty of not less than £2 or more than £100, and will be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.
