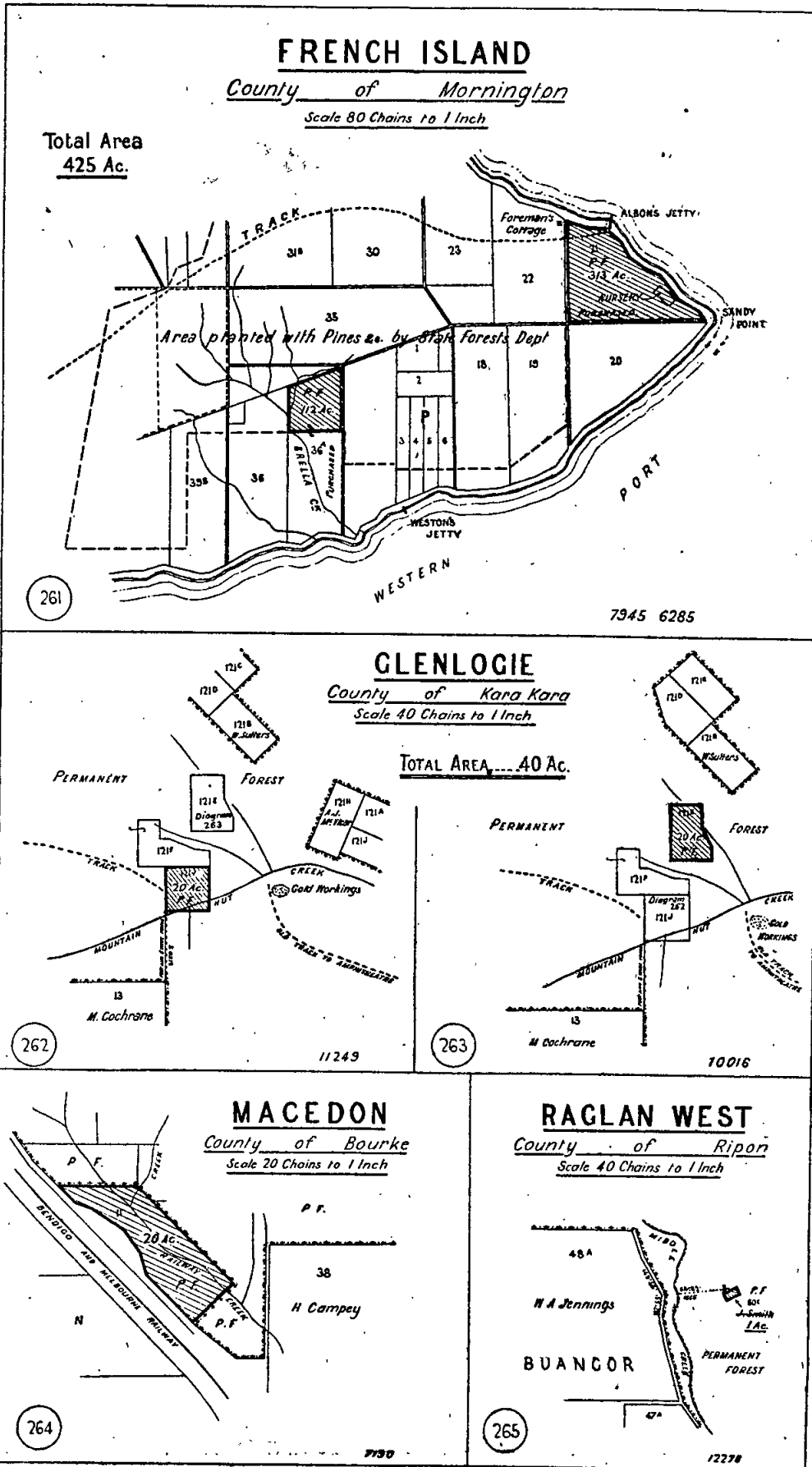

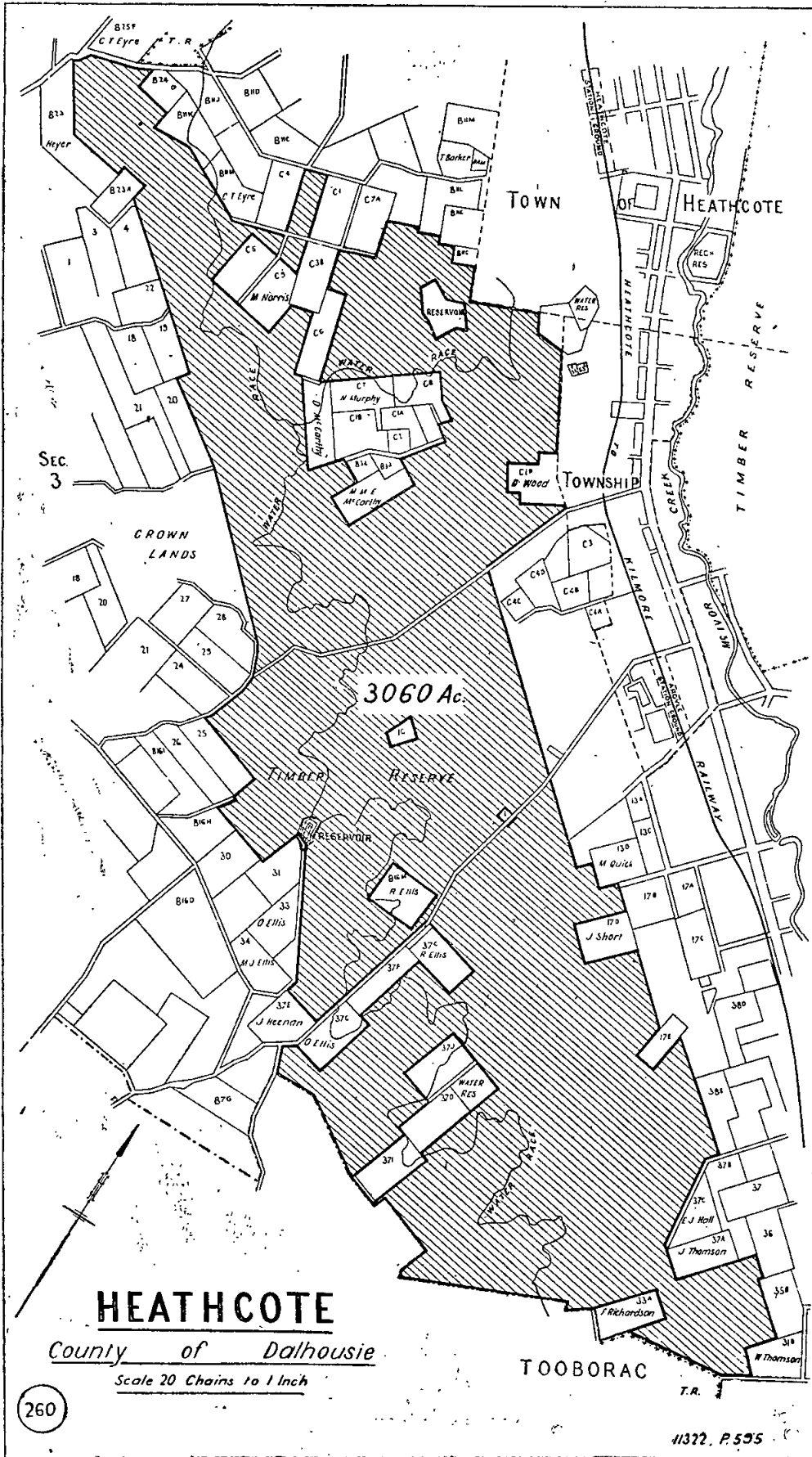

WHEREAS by section 6 of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917 (8 Geo. V. No. 2916), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, set apart any area of Crown land for the purpose of being disposed of under the said Act to discharged soldiers in the manner set out in the said Act, and may amend or revoke any such Order: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Order revoke the Order dated the twenty-fifth day of March, 1919, and published in the Gazette of the 2nd April, 1919, page 920, setting apart for discharged soldiers certain lands in the parishes of Geelong, Ettrick, &c., so far as regards allotment 80 and part of allotment 79, containing 34 acres, in the parish of Girgarr.

No. 2916) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, set apart any area of Crown land for the purpose of being disposed of under the said Act to discharged soldiers in the manner set out in the said Act, and may amend or revoke any such Order: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Order set apart for discharged soldiers the lands comprised in the Schedule hereunder:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR THE SUPPLY OF GRAVEL IN THE PARISH OF TAMINICK KNOWN AS THE "WARBY RANGES GRAVEL RESERVE."

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, and the Councils of the Shires of Benalla and Wangaratta, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of the twelfth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, in the parish of Taminick, as sites for the supply of gravel known as the "Warby Ranges Gravel Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:-

3. No person shall take or remove any gravel quartz stone metal mineral or earth from the Reserve or any part thereof without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall dig or search for any gravel quartz stone metal mineral or earth and no person shall enter any pit quarry or other works on the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall take or drive any carriage cart or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained and no person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any article or thing without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management or by a Police Constable or Crown Lands Bailiff.

8. Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall under the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915 for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or any member of the police force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
