



RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

Mr. Barnes NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlers) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the borough of Wangaratta, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the 8th day of February, 1916, directing that.

(1) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the borough of Wangaratta shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, so far as the closing hours on Saturday, Friday, and Wednesday are concerned.

(2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

(a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday.

(b) Six o'clock on the evening of Friday.

### PROCLAMATION PARTLY REVOKED
