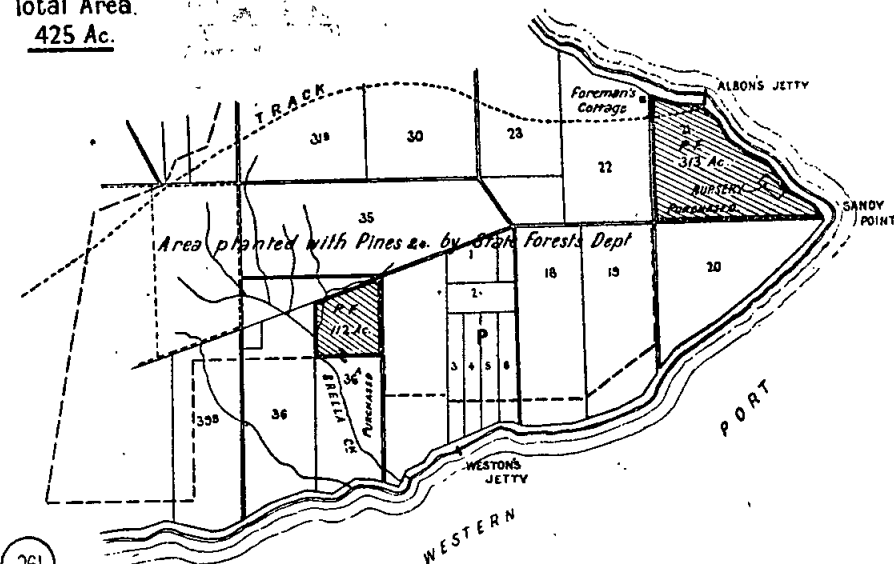

MILDURA VINEYARDS PROTECTION BOARD.

BY-LAWS FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE BOARD AND GENERALLY FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE BOARD.

WHEREAS by section 16 of the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918* (No. 2959) it is enacted that subject to this Act a Board may make by-laws "for the due carrying out the provisions and objects of this Act (including the regulations of its own proceedings)" the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board duly appointed and created under the *Mildura Vineyards Act* makes the by-laws following, viz.:—

1. First Meeting.—The first meeting of the Board shall be convened by the Chairman at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and Place of Meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Board shall be held at such time and place as the members may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of Meetings.—There shall be present at least seven members at such meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of six members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
5. Special Meetings.—The Board may hold special meetings which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman—but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
6. General Conduct of Business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages as laid down in the *Local Government Act*, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Board.
7. Meetings, Notices of.—A notice of every meeting of the Board shall be by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.
8. Minutes of Meeting to be Read at Subsequent Meetings.—At every meeting of the Board the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings of the preceding meeting; and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee proceeding meeting and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.
9. Order of Business of Meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be

practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Board.
- (2) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Presentation of reports of committee.
- (5) Payments.
- (6) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10) Notices of motion.

And the order of business meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

10. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor in Council shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Board, unless otherwise ordered by the Board.

11. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least seven clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, four clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each member, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting may be dealt with at the next meeting.

12. Notice of Motion to be Given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the preceding clause.

13. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petitions, memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Board after that at which it has been presented.

14. Motions to be Moved in Order.—Except by leave of a majority of the members present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

15. Motion to be Moved by Member Giving Notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice on same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

16. Mover of Motion Appointing Committee to be a Member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

17. Draft of Address or Petition to be Submitted at Previous Meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of same.

18. Order, &c., of Debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the question of order is disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with his subject.

19. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Board thereon.

20. No Motion to be Withdrawn Without Leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the members present.

21. Motion to be Seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Board unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Board by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

22. Mover of Motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

23. Motions, &c., How Decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

24. Resolutions, How Revoked or Altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

25. Priority of Members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member who is entitled to priority.

26. Members to Stand while Addressing the Board.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Board.

27. Points of Order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

28. Members not to Digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous

debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

29. Members to Apologize for Disorderly or Offensive Expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Board.

30. Member Called to Order to Sit Down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Board to explain.

31. Members Twice Offending to be Liable to a Penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, or to apologize for such conduct, refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this By-law.

32. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Board who shall having been admitted to any meeting of the Board be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this By-law.

33. Members may Demand Documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Board applying to the question under discussion.

34. No Second Amendment until Previous One Disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

35. Mover of Motion to have Right of Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No Discussion on Motion for Adjournment of Board.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Board at the point at which it was so interrupted.

37. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Board and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Board by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such member and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Board to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Board.

38. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

39. Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Board.

41. Meeting of Committees.—The secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time by order of the Board or on the written order of the chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

42. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Board shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Board shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board, and that its contents do not violate any by-law herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

43. Common Seal.—The secretary of the Board shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impression shall only be made by order of the Board verified by the signatures of the chairman, a member, and the secretary.

44. Suspension of By-laws.—With the exception of by-laws 22 and 23 any one or more of these by-laws may be suspended *pro tem* in cases of emergency and with the consent of a majority of the whole Board.

45. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of these by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

WHEREAS by section 29 of the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918* (No. 2959) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations with respect to various matters in connexion with the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the now recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid so far as they may relate to the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board duly appointed and created under the Mildura Vineyards Protection Act and known as the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board, make the Regulations following, viz. :—

1.—SECRETARY.

The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Board or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts books and documents conduct all correspondence and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Board and shall attend all meetings of the Board or Committees when required and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Board incumbent on the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Board as it may direct. All moneys received by him shall as soon as possible thereafter be paid into the account of the Board to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking same. That all payments of the Board shall be made by cheque signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

2.—TREASURER.

The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Board as it may direct.

3.—COLLECTOR.

The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Board for such amount as it may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same and every receipt shall have a duplicate or butt filled in by him containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Board than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall at the close of each month at least submit his books duplicates and butts with a statement of all amounts collected to the Secretary and render to him a full account then or whenever demanded by him of all moneys received by him on account of the said Board.

4.—APPOINTMENT, ETC., OF OFFICERS.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635)* has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Main Creek road in the shire of Flinders (declared to be a developmental road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th November, 1918, on page 3330) should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the city of St. Kilda doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686)* as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918 (No. 2981)*, direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of

any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- seal up, in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole city the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the city of St. Kilda of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1915 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1915, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1915 aforesaid, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1915 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

Schedules referred to.

18. In the event of the area being damaged by fire, the licence may be forfeited unless the licensee satisfy the Minister that neither he, directly or indirectly, nor his workmen or servants, were in any way responsible therefor.
