SHIRE OF GLENLYON.

BY-LAW NO. 4 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1915.

A By-law of the shire of Glenlyon, made under the provisions of sections 34, 35, 38, and 314, of the *Health Act 1915*, and numbered 4, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil and closet pans and other matters named therein as follows:—

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Glenlyon order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Hepburn.

3. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

4. Instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and the pans supplied shall be and remain the property of the shire council.

5. A pan cleansed by superheated steam or some other equally efficient means approved by the shire council shall be left in the place of the pan removed.

6. Every closet within the area defined by clause 2 hereof shall consist of a suitable privy building constructed with proper openings or flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground and shall be so constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

7. The occupier of any premises in which there is a closet, or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. That the night-soil removed by the shire council shall immediately be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the shire council or shall be trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the shire council.

9. No such occupier or person as aforesaid shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

10. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the shire council over all such premises which may be inspected by the shire council or its officers from time to time, or by any person duly authorized by the shire council.

11. Every such occupier or person as aforesaid offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only not being less than Five shillings (5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

12. In the event of a contractor being employed and failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor shall be compelled to obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made or from the manager of some approved depot for night-soil for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

13. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the shire council over all such depots or places of deposit.

14. Individual householders shall not contract for the removal of night-soil except in accordance with this By-law.

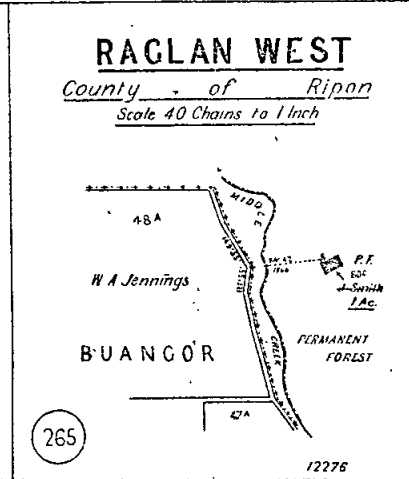
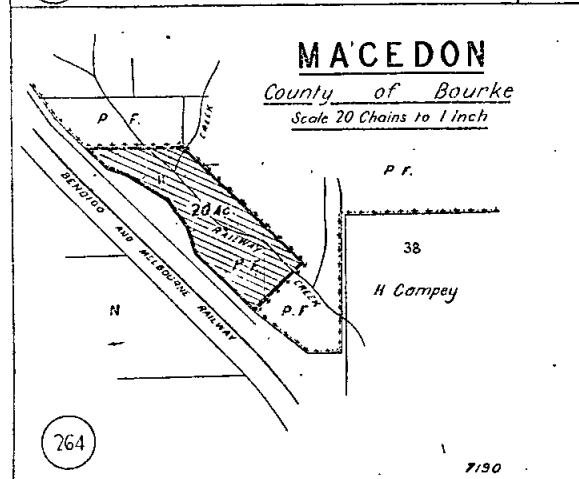
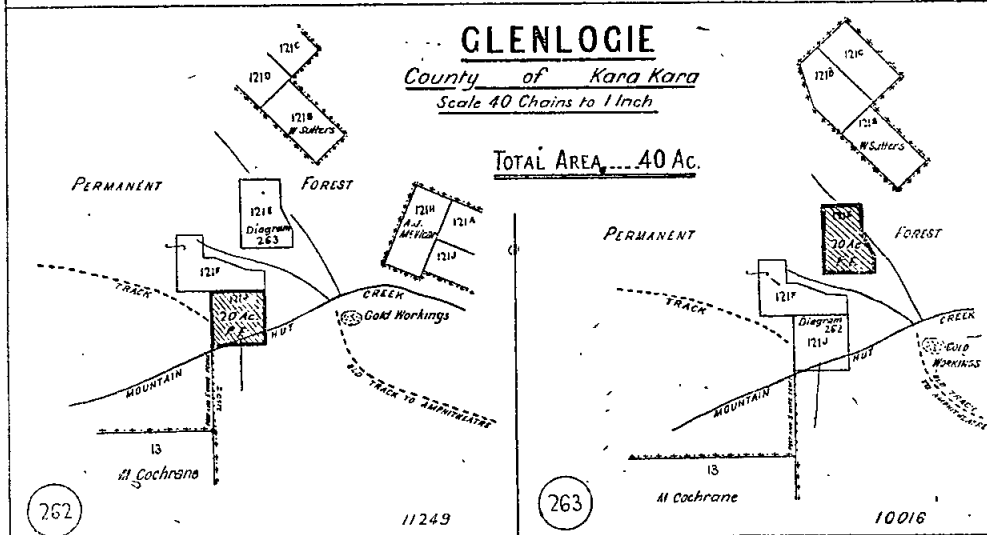
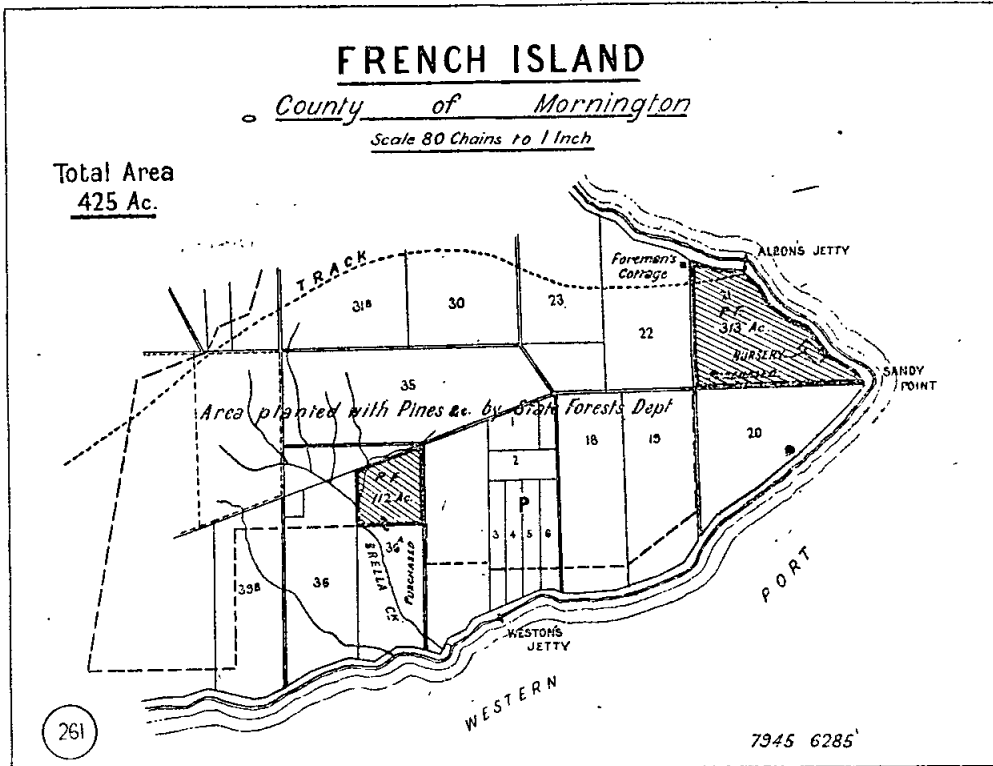

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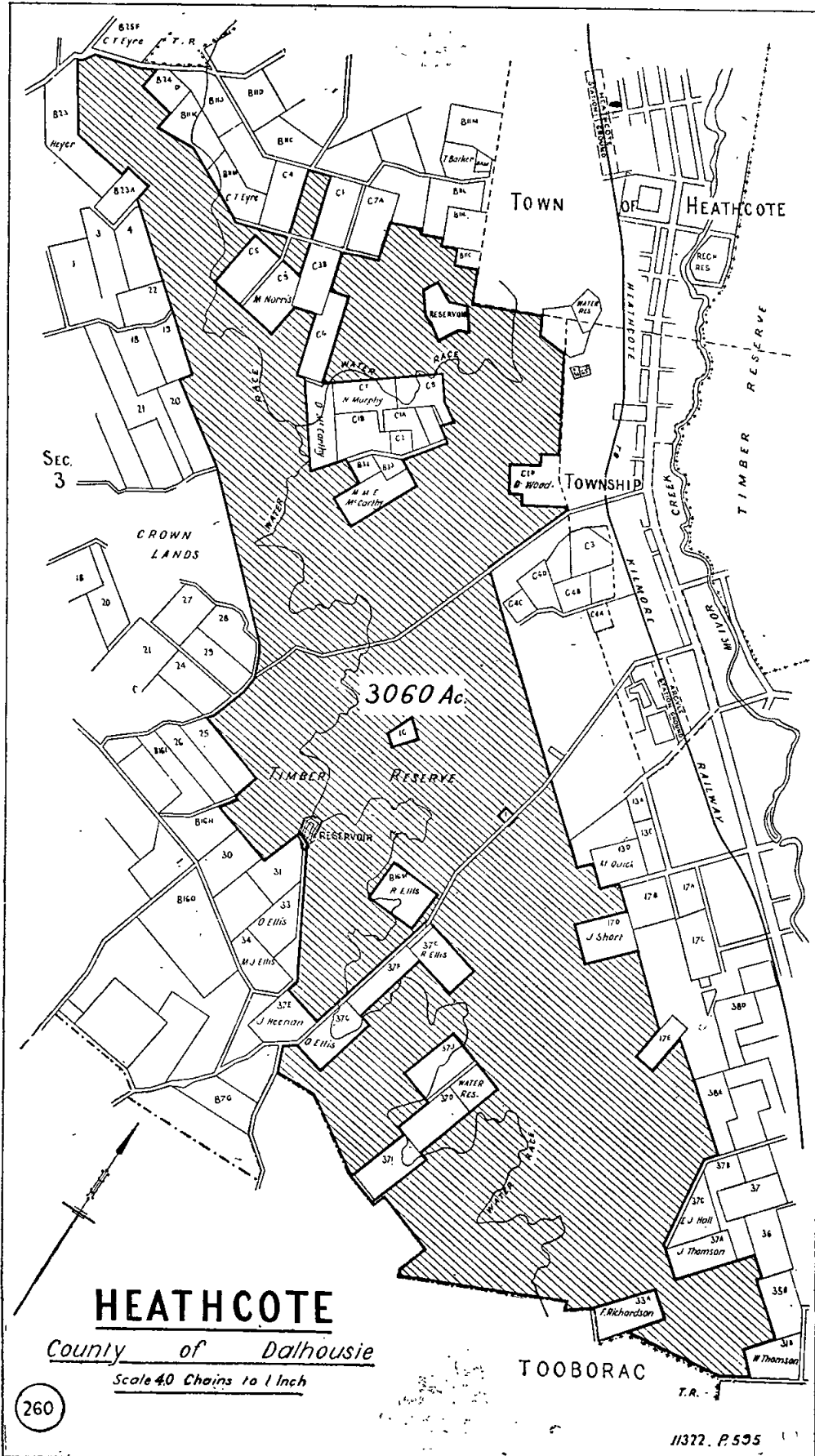

*Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring a Road on a Site taken for a Deviation of a Main Road fit for use.*

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the city of Bendigo, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.*

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1

opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole city the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.*

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

*Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the city of Bendigo of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

FORM A.

Directions.

You must not strike out the name of any candidate.  
You must place the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate whom you wish to be elected.

You must then place opposite the name of each of the remaining candidates the figure 2, or 3, or 4 (and so on as the case requires) to indicate the order of your preference for each such candidate.

The ballot-paper so marked by or for the voter must be dropped by you into the ballot-box.

You must not take this ballot-paper out of the polling booth.

RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MILDURA, KNOWN  
AS THE "LAKE RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, Walter Oxley Mitting, Samuel Rankin, John Allan Jacobs Whitney, William Bennett, and Homer William Hollis, the duly-appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 12th October, 1914, as a site for Public Recreation, in the parish of Mildura, known as the "Lake Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, or shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such

occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act 1915* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except under the 121st section of the *Land Act 1915*, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act 1915*, or for mining purposes.

2. 6. 7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act 1915* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licence shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of poles at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at \_\_\_\_\_," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Fuel and Fodder Board, or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. **SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.****BY-LAW No. 12.**

A By-law of the shire of Cranbourne numbered 12, and made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of stock within certain boundaries of the shire of Cranbourne for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Cranbourne order as follows:—

1. That the provisions regarding the impounding of stock, contained in section 498 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, be enforced, and that all stock found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road, in the shire of Cranbourne, be impounded.
2. That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—That all resident ratepayers of the said shire, and occupiers of land fronting the said roads, shall be exempt from such impounding of six head of cattle or six head of horses, and that in the case of public carriers the number so exempted be the team of horses or bullocks in actual use.
3. That a condition precedent to such exemptions be a payment to the Council of the shire of Cranbourne, half-yearly in advance, at the rate of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum for every head of such cattle, and Fifty shillings (50s.) for

every head of horses so exempted, such payment to be a remuneration for the officers appointed by the Council as persons in charge of such horses and cattle, and hereinafter called the herdsman.

4. When the above fee is paid to the herdsman, he shall register such head of horses or cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, as exempt from the operation of this By-law and in the case of such cattle shall fasten a chain and tag on the neck of each beast, in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose, and for the information and use of the Council.

5. Any exemption from impounding granted in accordance with the provisions of this By-law shall not extend to any stock found wandering within the portions of the shire, viz.:— At Cranbourne, from railway crossing, on Main Coast road, and along it to the post-office, including one (1) chain on each side.

At Tooradin, from 15 chains west of the bridge over the Tooradin Inlet, on the Main Coast road, to 5 chains on the east side of the said bridge on the same road, including 5 chains width on each side.

At Koo-wee-rup, from west side of railway station ground, along Station-street to Rossiter's-road, and from 15 chains south-west of the railway crossing on the Koo-wee-rup-Pakenham road, then along Rossiter's-road to Denham's-road.

At Lang Lang, along Westernport-road, from 20 chains north-easterly from the railway crossing, along Westernport-road to the junction of the Main Coast and Westernport roads.

No stock to be allowed on the roads within any township area within the shire, from sunset to sunrise, unless they are *bonâ fide* travelling stock, as mentioned under clause 13. Horses to be excluded from township areas altogether.

6. The Council will not be responsible or liable for loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of any cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained under these conditions.

7. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bonâ fide* property of applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration, to that effect, in the form of the schedule attached hereto.

8. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers, free of charge, up to that limit of age.

9. No entire horse or bull shall be exempted, without the special consent of the Council.

10. A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day, of which due notice shall be given by an advertisement at the close of every half-yearly period, and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock for registration at such musters, and after three months shall have run of any half-yearly period the exemption shall be Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) in the case of cows, and Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) in the case of horses.

11. The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him and present a return of the same to the Council every six months, on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made.

12. The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting on such roads, or owning land on any situation whatever.

13. No pigs, goats or sheep are to be allowed to wander or depasture on such roads, and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of 2 miles an hour for cattle, and in the case of sheep at the rate of not less than 6 miles in each day, between sunrise and sunset.

14. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above, without giving due notice of the same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing same will be entitled, without further charge, to substitute for each head so removed, one other head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registered period.

15. The Council shall have exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious diseases to be removed from such streets or roads, and in the event of any registered cattle or horses dying, the owner thereof shall cause same to be destroyed on receiving notice, failing which the herdsman or inspector of nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

Violations of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
